

EARLY REPORTED DATE FOR VANCOUVER

The cover below was discovered recently in the BC Provincial Archives, among the papers of Capt. William Sterling, a Victoria businessman who died intestate. Unlike most documents in the archives, which have long since been stripped of their covers, the correspondence in early intestate files is often found complete with envelope.

Many of Sterling's papers are concerned with his trading activities in the Omineca district in the early 1870s. Later documents often deal with a cottage industry that he financed in the Queen Charlotte Islands, the Skidegate Oil Works, which made oil from dogfish livers. The envelopes in the file are grubby and torn; most were carried to Victoria by favour and do not have interesting markings. This cover, however, was dated MY 17 / 86 with the small Vancouver CDS that probably was destroyed in the June 13 fire. In a 1993 issue of the BC Postal History Newsletter (p. 49) Alex Price brought an example of this rare datestamp to readers' attentions. This date, a full week earlier than Alex's report, is supported by a VICTORIA.B.C. / CANADA / PM / MY 18 / 86 CDS backstamp and by an enclosed letter, dated May 17, 1886, in which a Vancouver realtor inquires about hiring the Skidegate, a boat Sterling had used at his Oil Works. The Vancouver post office opened on May 1, 1886. The stamp is tied by a target cancel.

Passed by Military Censor - Nanaimo, B.C.

Bill Robinson has reported the discovery of a previously unreported marking from the Nanaimo Internment Camp which operated briefly in 1915. The cover was passed by the Military Censor on March 22, 1915 and cancelled at Nanaimo the next day. There is no receiving mark from Prince Albert.

BOOKS, BOOKS, AND MORE BOOKS

As more and more philatelists are mastering the art of home publishing the number of new books on philatelic topics and postal history are increasing rapidly. The result is that it is becoming much more difficult to keep up on significant works as they are released. A few recently released books of interest to the collectors of British Columbia postal history are discussed below.

Thorne, Robert K., Machine cancellations of Canada - British Columbia, privately printed by Robert K. Thorne, 6 Milford Crescent, Brampton, Ontario, L6S 3E4

The British Columbia list of machine cancellation in Canada is the most recent book in the series that will eventually include listings for all the provinces. The listings are based on Bob Thorne's very extensive collection of Canadian slogan postmarks, together with works by Barlow, Sessions, Proylx and Coutts and of course the *Slogan Box*. The British Columbia book is produced in looseleaf format and runs over 500 pages, with each town appearing on a separate page. The use of a separate page for each town has the advantage that it is easy to insert revisions and that towns with only one or two listings are easy to locate. Bob recognizes that much more study will be required before the work comes close to being complete but as a starting point for further study, it serves as a very useful contribution to the field of philatelic research.

Coutts, Cecil C., Slogan postmarks of Canada - catalogue and guidebook, 2nd edition 2002, privately printed by Cecil C. Coutts, 34820 McLeod Avenue, Abbotsford, V3G 1G9, \$39.95

This coil back book is an update of the 1996 first edition and as the result of an improved type face and the use of more white space, is much more readable. The work has also been expanded to include a listing of the new Jet Spray markings as well as Special Service Markings. There is also a Topical Index for those who only collect slogan postmarks related to a particular subject. In the eight years since the first edition much new information has come to light and this together with the new format makes this book well worth purchasing.

Weiner, Dr. Joel H., Canada inkjet (jet spray) cancels, 2nd edition, British North American Philatelic Society and Saskatoon Stamp Centre, 2001

The introduction of inkjet cancelling equipment in Canada has created a major problem for those attempting to list the markings. Because of the number of jets on each machine and the ease of re-programming the equipment and the tendency of equipment to malfunction, the number of possible markings is well in excess of 15,000. Joel has wisely chosen to ignore most of these minor variations or "errors" and has set up criteria that produce a workable number of recognized jet spray markings. The 1,500 illustrations of the markings are reduced so that 14 markings can be shown on a page arranged in two columns. Spacing variations and other minor differences are included as notes above the illustrations. The 2nd edition is a great improvement over the earlier work in that confines itself to the significant markings and as a result is a must for those interested in the new Jet Spray equipment.

PITNEY BOWES TYPE "K" MACHINE

In the latest edition of the <u>PHSC Journal</u> Dan Hunka provides an excellent listing of the Pitney Bowes desk top Type "K" rapid cancelling equipment used in Canada. At about the same time as Dan published the list, Henry Wong of Canada Post provided a listing of all active rapid cancelling equipment presently in use in British Columbia to the News Letter editor. The listing includes the make, type of machine, serial number, and location. The information, below, updates Dan's listing.

Again thanks to John Gannon of Canada Post we are able to include a listing of the opening and closing of post offices in British Columbia. As the result of recent changes in recording methods this listing includes information on the upgrading of the status of postal outlets, introduction of the ROSS computer programme, and the upgrading or expanding of postal facilities. It should be noted that although the new Call For Centres (CFC) and the Call For Stamp Shops (CFSS) are issued with RC numbers they are rarely issued with any cancelling or dating equipment. In a few cases the Call For Outlet has obtained withdrawn daters with the RC number removed.

STAPLES BUSINESS DEPOT

In the July 2001 (page 303) issue of the News Letter reference is made to the opening of two Business Depot Postal Outlets on 2000 08 24 in Vernon and Surrey. The original plan was to have Postal Outlets opened in all 195 Staples Business Depots across Canada. The plan was to target "Small Office Home Customers" (SOHO) by providing one-stop shopping for business needs. The new SOHO Post Offices are aimed at the business customer and will offer more limited line of postal service than the standard Postal Outlet. For example the new SOHO post offices do not provide Call for Service (CFC). By January 2002, 77 Shipping Centres, as they as called, were to be in operation with plans to open 64 more during 2002.

To date, four offices have been established in Stapes Stores in British Columbia as "test" sites under jurisdiction of Canada Post in Ottawa and at present Vancouver has limited information but it appears the Business Depot outlets provide limited postal service.

Bill also arranged to have the rare Sidney Klussendorf Rapid Cancelling Machine (serial number 02509) brought to the PIPEX show. The Sidney hub was proofed on the 24 of May, 1984 and the RCM was briefly used at Sydney starting on July 13. At about the same time mail from Sidney was transferred directly to Victoria for processing and as a result the volume of mail did not justify the use of the RCM.










MORE I.P.S. 4900 MACHINES INTRODUCED



What is a normal cancellation?

The three page item in the last News Letter on Local Commemorative Postmarks and Pictorial Cancels, stimulated a flood of non standard markings used by Postal Outlets. The question now is "What is a normal cancellation?" It would appear that normal dater includes the RC number the date, the city or town, and the postal code. The Ashcroft dater could probably be classed as normal as it has the RC number at top, the date, the town name followed by B.C. The Vancouver is a minor variant in that the RC number is proceeded by "RC #". On the Surrey marking the postal code "V4N 4H9" is that of the business rather than that of the Postal Outlet since all post office postal codes end in zero.

"It has worked really well for us," said David Rand, owner of the English Sweet Shop down the street, as quoted in the Victoria Times Colonist. Rand switched his business to Canada Post, which he says offers better delivery solutions for his out-of-town shipments.

This expanded outlet was a joint venture between Canada Post and the Canadian Union of Postal Workers under Appendix T in the collective agreement, which is designed to encourage innovation and job creation. Union members also helped design the flagship office. Postal workers were happy to see the new-look office proceed, said Allyson Mayo, a clerk at the new location and second vice-president of the Canadian Union of Postal Workers Victoria local. "The clerks are totally committed to making these projects a success," Mayo was quoted as saying in the Victoria Times Colonist.

"Local businesses are very impressed with the new look and a couple of tourists commented that they haven't seen such an attractively designed post office in any of their world travels," says Retail Business manager Merv Ozarko. JL
