



## BARNARD'S BRITISH COLUMBIA EXPRESS

Indistinct Wells Fargo Portland Or and Wells Fargo Astoria transit. Turned over to Barnard at Victoria who added 3 cent small queen canceled with oval Barnard's Cariboo Express. When addressee had "gone to Cassiar", Barnard took it there via Wrangel Alaska and the Stikine River.



About 1875 Wells Fargo usage to Cariboo turned over to Barnard in Victoria who added 3 cent small queen and canceled it with oval Barnard's Cariboo Express. COLLECT in oval and 10c in manuscript – express charges had now dropped considerably.

## .HUDSON HOPE - HUDSONS HOPE - HUDSON'S HOPE

The use of the apostrophe on post office hand stamps was raised by Peter Smith in the Fall issue of the *PHSC Journal*. Initially all post office names appearing on canceling equipment were, in theory, in the singular and in a few cases differed from the local spelling of the name. Hudson Hope, a post office established in 1913 is a god example of how post office policy caused some confusion. According to Philip Akrigg, in his book *British Columbia Place Names*, there is much confusion as to the origin of the post office name "Hudson Hope". The official spelling of the municipal name is Hudson's Hope but the post office proof shows the name as "Hudson Hope" (proof dated NO 5 / 13). According to Akrigg the name may go back to 1873, when an H.B.C. post was briefly established by a William Butler and was known as "Hudson's Hope" or "The Hope of Hudson" and was administered out of the post at Fort Saint John. On the other hand another source claims the original name was "The Hope of Hudson" and was named by a prospector who panned gold there. A very old meaning of "hope" was a small inlet or valley.

Now to the various daters issued by the post office department. A type "A" hammer reading "HUDSON HOPE" was proofed "NO 5 / 13" and a type "B" hammer, also reading "HUDSON HOPE" was proofed :Jul 28 / 39". A "type C" hammer reading "HUDSON HOPE" was proofed "10 VII / 64". At the same time a variety of hand stamps reading "HUDSON HOPE" were used including MOON, POCON, and registration hand stamps. The "HUDSON HOPE" name appears to have been used until 1991 when the "HUDSON'S HOPE" spelling was introduced..




In July 1939 the existing hand stamps were replaced with a new set of hand stamps that retained the name "HUDSON HOPE".



V6J 3H9 In September 1991 a special rubber hand stamp was produced to commemorate the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the building of the Alaska Highway. The dater came into use September 11, 1991 and remained in use until August 12, 1992. Unlike previous date stamps "HUDSON'S HOPE" is spelled with an apostrophe, reflecting the change in post office policy regarding the use plural and possessive names.



A second special rubber stamp reading "RENDEZVUES" was issued April 4, 1992 to commemorate the of the highway commemorate




In 1993 the commemorative hand stamps were replaced with a steel dater hammer which read "HUDSON'S HOPE B.C. / VOC 1VO. And included the apostrophe "'S' The hammer is slightly larger than a Type "C" dater and was replaced by a similar hammer in the 1980's.
