

CENTENNIAL DIE PROOF - Mike Painter

You may have noted that Eastern Auctions Ltd. offered this item in their October 29, 2005 sale. It was described as "#544DP, & Centennial Large Die Proof in colour of issue on glazed surface wove paper, measuring 75 x 89mm, with small guidelines and 'P-52' number at left".

I was successful bidder on this item and have since obtained Vincent Greene Foundation Certificate 13658 which states "Canada Scott No. 544, large die proof on coated paper, blue grey shade, inscribed P-52, genuine in all respects".

I asked Eastern Auctions what they knew of the provenance of this die proof. They advised they didn't know — it came from a collection of unknown origin. They think it originated with the engraver himself.



On pages 68-9 of Robin Harris' "Centennial Definitive Series 1967-73", Leopold Beaudet describes the 8¢ Library die proofs. This P52 die was eventually rejected and the P53 die was used to produce the stamps. There were two progressive and a final die proof of P52. This die proof matches Leopold's description of the second progressive proofs of P52 which were produced on September 9, 1971 (see Harris for details of the frame, shading etc which identify it).

Leopold's descriptions are based on material in the Archives. As far as I know, this P52 die proof is the only Centennial die proof of any denomination that is in collector's hands. If anyone knows of others, please report them.

Winnipeg collector Nick Fedorchuk first alerted me to the plastic flow variety that was featured in the last issue (p 718). Nick also noticed a Plate scratch on the plastic flow. It occurs in column 5 (unknown row). All of Nick's copies (those illustrated on p 718 and the one shown below) are on HB Dex paper.



Member Ray White has done an exhaustive study on the plastic flow variety on the 15 ct Bylot (as shown on p 718). After examining some 30 copies, Ray has come to the following conclusions:

- 1. The flaw is not constant: "There is no consistency in the strength or quantity of the 'flow'. Copies on the same corner block indicate different strengths, from light to heavy and some have doubled lining."
- 2. The variety occurs on the following papers:
 - a) HB Dex
 - b) LF PVA W2B
 - c) LF PVA OP2
 - d) LF(PVA?) Dated "-onester, NB 16 II 73"
 - e) HB dated "vancouver 31 VII 71"

Ray also reports that the plastic flow occurs on the UL Plate 1 inscription block, row 2, column 1 on two different papers(shown to the right) In this case, the extent of the plastic flow appears to be constant:



Winnipeg collector (and prospective BNAPS member) Peter Hellsten showed me this item of postal stationery (EN 87) with a nice double impression. As far as I can remember, examples of double printed stationery have not appeared in the newsletter. Quite striking!



As I was putting together the Table for the 5 ct coil, I realized that the 4 ct Table needs some modification to be consistent. If you look at the 4 ct coil Table on p. 724 (or the Table on p 53 of Irwin & Freedman's Centennial book), you will see the same paper description (ivory) for both the 0 and 1 fluorescence level papers. I have added a new ink/paper line to differentiate these two papers (they have different amounts of fluorescent flecks) to make them consistent.

Turning to the 5 ct Table (shown below), I have added the fluorescent fleck count to the description of the A to D papers. All my copies of the precancel are much brighter than "0"; I have therefore changed the Fluorescent Grade from a "0" to a "2", consistent with the "off-white, 30 flecked" paper that appears in the 3,4 and 5 ct Tables. If you find any 5 ct precancel coils in the "0" range, please let me know!
