#### A STATEMENT REGARDING DATER Varieties

"The Flag Cancel Handbook is primarily a study of Flag Cancellation Dies and their use, and therefore where Die variations exist, when new locations of their use or discovered, or we receive new imformation regarding the period of use, - we try to be quick to recognize the new data and to list same.

"Significant differences in the daters are also listed, although these dies are completely separate and apart from the Flag Dies. Specialists often want us to include many minor dater varieties. On the other hand too much specialization and lksting of fly specks in a handbook such as mine can discourage many collectors. We therefore must admit to being somewhat abritrary in some of our decisions as to whether to include a minor dater variety or not.

"The selection of what dater varieties go into this handbook are totally ours - however, we take no pride in, and make no apolofies for that which is included."

The Flag Die used for #1-1 at Montreal, after a very short use, was transferred to Ottawa, where it became the die for Flags 1-9 and 1-10.

Beacause these were the first Flag Cancellations of Canada, and because they are found on covers bearing stamps of the Small Queen, and Diamond Jubilee issues, many specialists in these issues find these cancellations attractive additions to their collections of these issues.

Supplies have never been great, and with this extra demand over and above the normal demand of Flag Cancel collectors, prices have risen considerable over the past 4 - 5 years.

This cancellation has proven to be quite elusive for many collectors of these interesting covers. Prices have advanced considerably in the past four years.

## Type 4 - "1837 - Victoria - 1897" - JUBILEE Flag

We have had a great deal of comment regarding this listing, many collectors telling me for instance that they doubt the existance of 4-2. when, in fact this writer has in his collection a complete set of the Diamond Jubilke Issue, on 2 x 4s each with a beautiful strike of #4-2. All are dated June 22, 12-0, 1897.

Others have doubted the existance of 4-5, yet one showed up in

the H.R. Harmer Auction of June 5-6-7, 1978.

There may also be some very minor differences in the "X" and "Z" Hubs making it possible for specialists to come up with further varieties, but we do not list these.

#### Type 6 - "1837 - Crown & VR - 1897" - 1897-98

Only one single die was made of this Cancellation. It was first sent to Ottawa where it was in use for approx. 5 months, when it was transferred to Montreal and used for a very brief period. That this is the same die can be determined by three constant flaws:-

Lower loop of "8" in "1837" is broken at upper right.
 There is a Vertical Dash, just above the bottom of the

flag, and between the first and second vertical stripes.

3. In the bottom line of the flag, where it forms the upper line of the first furl, there is a break or weakening - to the right and below the "7" of "1837".

At BNAPEX '78 we were most fortunate to be able to purchase the card illustrated herewith - a Canadian RR card of the Canadian Pacific RR. - an early series, and not difficult to come by. However note the Flag



cancel - #8-11A - not listed in handbook. but reported earlier for Aug. 4, '98 by Fred Stulberg. This INVERT iis much later Dec. 2, 1899.

So we have a rare flag cancel on a very attractive illustrated advertising Railway card. It gets a special place in our flag collection.
