

## FLAGS OF THE 1939 ROYAL TOUR Doug Lingard

The illustration below shows a Royal Train Flag Cancel dated 9.00 AM, May 19. The cover is signed by G.W. Ross, the Postmaster of the Royal Train Post Office. This is the first example of the 9.00 AM, May 19 cancel that I have seen.



I suspect that this was cancelled just before the pilot train left Caledonia Springs, where it had spent the night. This would seem to indicate that, since the English Flag Cancel was used on a cover addressed to the province of Quebec and dated 9.00 AM, the French Flag Cancel was not used on the 19th. If this is the case, the Richardson report was in error.

Can any member out there prove or disprove these suppositions?

## ELIZABETH II CORONATION FLAG UPDATE by Fred Hollenbeck and Doug Lingard

The following is a revision to the 1953 Coronation Flags based on the work that has recently been done by Fred Hollenbeck. It includes information from a survey that Fred sent to a number of members of which members Almond, Paige, Robinson, Robertson and Sessions were kind enough to complete. If any member has a missing date or an example for a "K" date, please send a photocopy to Fred so that we can have the most complete information in the new handbook. The values are based more or less on the total examples reported in the seven collections which is quite a small sample. If any member would like to propose different values please contact Doug Lingard. Some of these cancels are quite scarce as only 6 examples were reported for Fredericton and 7 for Moncton and Saint John. On the other hand, there are more than 35 examples of the Vancouver and Toronto Die 1 cancel in the 7 collections.

#### Chapter XXI

#### ELIZABETH II CORONATION FLAGS

Since the Richardson handbook was published, very little new information has been reported. The Ottawa invert seems to have been used for only a brief period of time and is still known with only the 12:30 pm and 1:00 pm time markings. Although Richardson did not indicate so, separate cancelling dies were used with each of the Toronto dater hubs. However, no additional hub/cancelling die varieties have surfaced since the Richardson handbook was published.

For covers dated June 7th add \$5 and for covers dated June 8th add \$10. First day covers with flag cancels are worth about 70% of listed values.

As Richardson indicated, these cancels were probably intended for use from June 1st to June 6th, with some offices extending their use until the 7th or 8th. Probably, an example from Fredericton dated June 6th and one from Saskatoon dated June 5th will eventually surface.
