It's time to prepare this for BNAPEX '89 in Hamilton, so I'm finishing off issue #6 - which completes our first year of the Klussendorfer. Some of the latest news (as of early September) is on this page. There's lots more news, features, and reports throughout the issue.

WHISTLER, BC - AT LAST!!

We have known for some time that there was a Klussendorf machine at WHISTLER, BC, but for all that time there were no reports of its use. It is now in regular use with 31 VII 1989. being the EKU so far. Several dates in August have also been reported.



EXETER, ON invert.

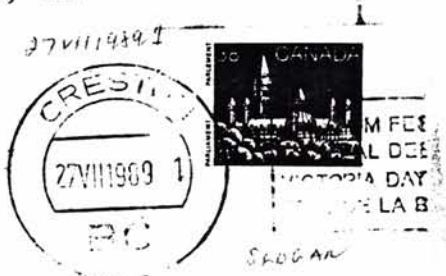
An invert appeared at EXETER, with reports of 01 VIII and 03 VIII 1989-18 so far. *See p.101 for LKU.*

DELHI, ON invert (III)

Another DELHI invert has been found, with reports on 11, 14, & 18 VII 1989-18. This is the third invert reported for DELHI I believe, and the second this year.

SLOGANS

The 1989 use of the CRESTON slogan is over. The EKU is about 21 IV 1989 1 (no dash). The LKU so far is 27 VII 1989 1; the POSTAL CODE killer is noted for 28 VII 1989. With the SUMMERSIDE, PE slogan also discontinued (see later), this leaves only three slogans in use - ALEXANDRIA, ON; AMHERST, NS; and ST. MARYS, ON.

The PICTON story.

The PICTON, ON Klussendorf has a number of interesting factors to it - two slogans, timemarks, errors, and inverts. The PICTON machine is serial # 02331, proofed 15 XII 1983 in delivery. Although the postmaster of PICTON reports the first date of use as 22 III 1984, the earliest reported date of use if correct is 21 III 1984 with timemark -17. TM-17 was used from the earliest period to this date. From Monday to Friday, the timemark -17 is in use and on Saturdays timemark -11 is in use. The earliest use I have found so far for the TM-11 is 21 VII 1984. I have treated the -11 timemark in detail in a previous note (pp. 21-22).

There are two slogans that were used at PICTON, ON. The first read "QUINTE SUMMER MUSIC / FESTIVAL DE MUSIQUE / D'ETE DE QUINTE / JULY 24 TO AUG 3 / 24 JUILLET AU 3 AOUT" has an EKU of 26 V 1986-17 and an LKU of 3 VIII 1986. The 3 VIII 1986 date is improbable as this is a Sunday and PICTON is not, generally that is, used on Sundays. The POSTAL CODE hammer is known before on 23 V 1986 and after on 6 VIII 1986-17.

The second slogan used at PICTON reads "150 YEARS / SESQUICENTENNIAL / UN SIECLE ET DEMI / 150 ANS" and is known used from 12 V 1987-17 to 11 V 1988-17 with the POSTAL CODE cancel known on 11 V 1987 and 12 V 1988. It was used exactly one year.

Both slogans are known with the timemarks -17 during the week and -11 on Saturdays.

At present two inverts are reported. The first was 6 VIII 1986-17, the EKU after the "QUINTE SUMMER FESTIVAL" slogan, using the POSTAL CODE. It appears that after replacing the slogan with the POSTAL CODE, it was inverted. By 11 VIII 1986 it was corrected.

The second invert occurred 12 I 1988-17 with the "150 YEARS" slogan (p. 79). The slogan was correct on 7 I and on 14 I.

Another error that occurred was 35 IV 1987-11 or April 35th which is an impossible date and probably an error for 25 IV 1987-11 which is a Saturday and should use TM-11. A further error reported is 20 VIII 1988-07 This is an error for 1987 and bears a 36-cent stamp. It is probably also a month error and could be 20 VII 1987, July instead of August.

A further oddity occurred 23, 24, 25 IX 1987-17 in which the top part of the cancel is blank (no PICTON). This could be because of a replacement machine in use during a breakdown or for some other reason. (It possibly could also have been from a misadjustment of pressure on the usual K machine. Note that a little at the top of the slogan also was missing; kgs.). All was fine on 21 IX and 28 IX.

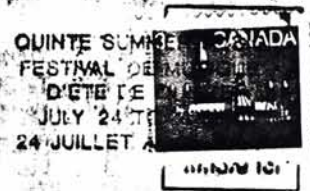
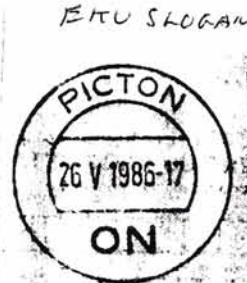
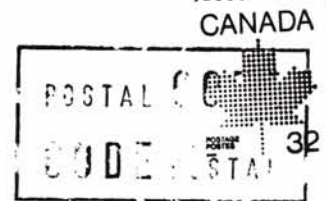
Hutton reports an invert on 12 III 1987-17 of POSTAL CODE and slogan on 06 VIII 1986-17. These should be 06 VIII 1986-17 (POSTAL CODE) and 12 I 1987-17 (slogan), respectively (reversed), as reported above. Hutton also reports the impossible date of 31 VI 1986-17.

In addition to the above, timemark -1 is reported used on 07 V 1988, a Saturday, and is an error for timemark -11.

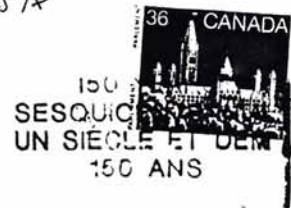
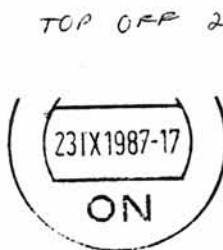
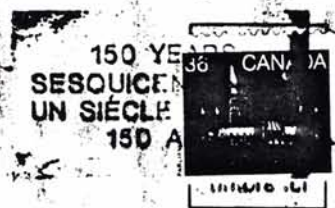
Another possible error which cannot be proved is 13-15 VII 1984-17 for VIII 1984. The covers came from a lot of several hundreds dated only in August 1984. Some examples of unusual Klussendorf postmarks from PICTON are shown on the next page.

SWIFT CURRENT, SK timemarks.

Many towns use more than one timemark for their Klussendorfs on the same day, such as -12 and -18 at ELMIRA, etc., but very few have used the different timemarks that are not actual times on the same day. SWIFT CURRENT is one of these. During 1984 to 1987 the common timemarks are \equiv and BLANK. I record during this period matched pairs of these two timemarks on the same day on 9 VIII 1984; 10 IX 1984; 11 VI, 30 VIII, and 14 VIII 1987. TM . is also found occasionally during this period, and I have recorded matched pairs of timemark . and timemark BLANK the same day on 22 IX 1986 and 2 I 1987.



YELLOWKNIFE, NT error - foreign cover.

Mrs. Zenith Mintert of Yellowknife was kind enough to send the cover shown here to us. It is from Canada to Germany with a YELLOWKNIFE, NT Klussendorf error of 12 II 1999 \equiv 1, which should be 12 I 1988 \equiv 1. A 13 I error strike also is known.

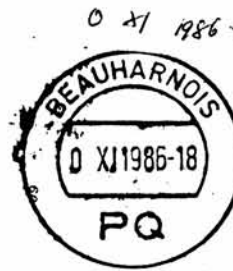
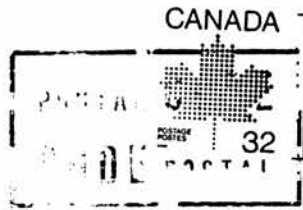


SMITHERS, BC day in timemark slot.

Another town to place the day in the timemark slot was SMITHERS, BC. As the copy at the top of p. 87 shows, the day 03 in the cancel was placed in the timemark slot to give a line date BLANK IV 1984-03. As the EKU is 01 IV 1984, it can be assumed other dates in this format exist.

BEAUHARNOIS, PQ error; impossible date.

This town had an interesting error with the date of 0 XI 1986-18. This is probably an error for a day in the period 01 to 09 XI although it could be anything! It is definitely NOT an error for 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, or 10 XI 1986.

CRANBROOK, BC - 1988

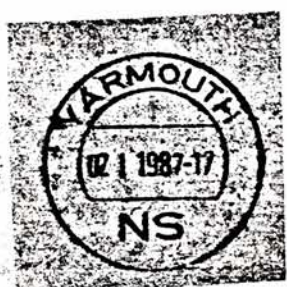
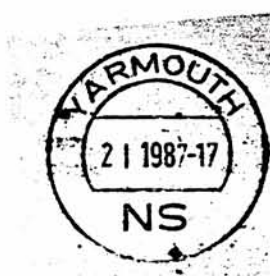
The year 1988 was an interesting year for this K cancel. The timemark . was being used at the end of 1987. On 11 I 1988, I record BLANK timemark - also on 27 I 1988 - but on 5 II 1988 TM . is back in use. Hutton notes timemark BL in use 30 I 1988. The timemark .1 is recorded in use until 26 X 1988. From here on, it gets more interesting. On 01, 02, and 03 XI 1988 I record an error of 01 to 03 XI 1987 0 (no dash) for 1988 and a new timemark. I have nothing until 17 XI 1988 when timemark BL was in use again but only until 20 XI 1988. On 25 XI 1988, a new TM 9 (no dash) appears which I record until 6 XII 1988 9 and on 7 XII 1988 timemark BL is again in use.

We can conclude from this that timemark 9 will be a tough one, being in use for no more than 21 XI to 6 XII, as will timemark 0, also in use a very short time with the error.

While on the subject of CRANBROOK, I note something unusual with the use of the slogan in 1986. I have a report of the POSTAL CODE use on 7 V 1986 and then the slogan on 8 V 1986, followed by the POSTAL CODE on 16 V and 3 VI 1986 and the slogan again on 13 VI 1986 until 10 VII 1986. What's going on? Is the 8 V 1986 an error, or did the slogan get tested and then pulled until its later use?

WINDSOR, NS timemark.

A strike of this K has come to hand dated on New Year's Day which is in itself unusual, but it also has a timemark previously unreported, 1 I 1987-11. Timemark -18 was used December 30, 1986 and on January 3, 1987. Has anyone seen a second strike of this, or any second strike with an 11 timemark?



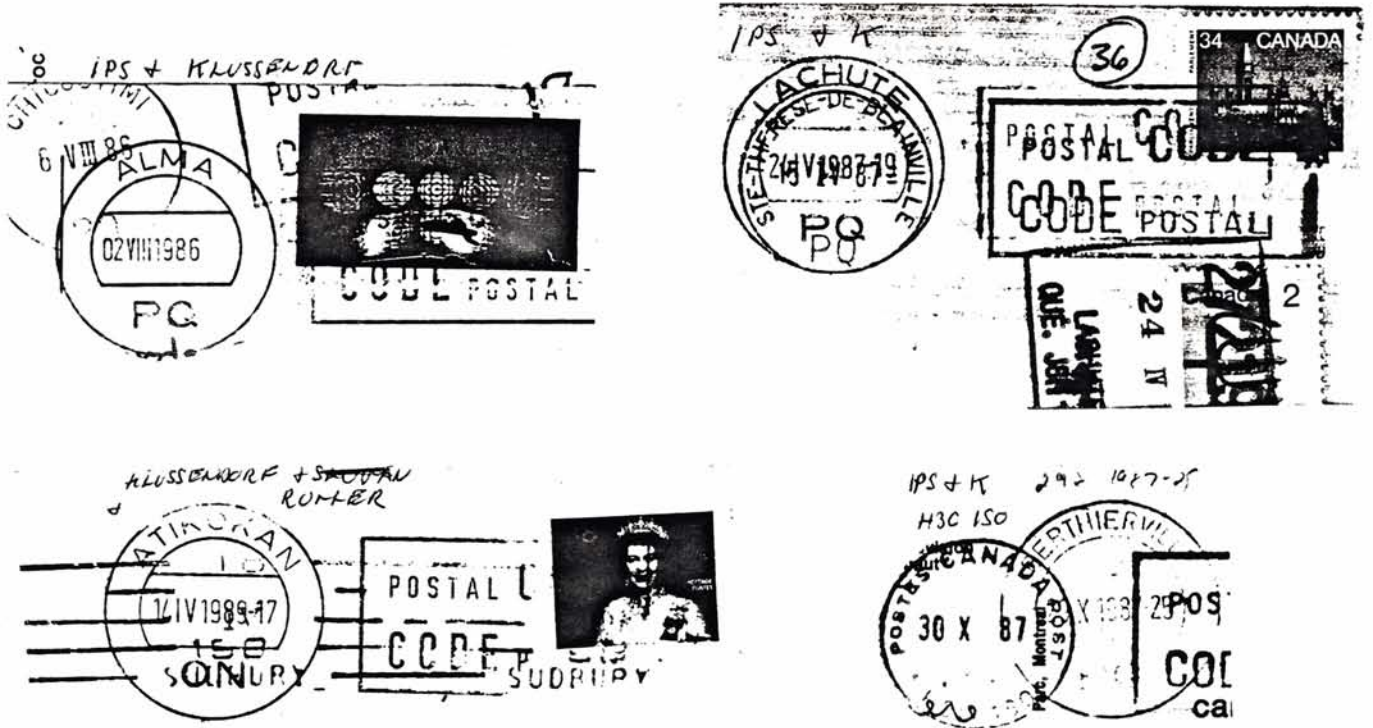
YARMOUTH, NS day numerals.

A puzzle arises in the use of this Klussendorf on January 2, 1987, its first day of use in 1987. I have two covers, one with a date of 2 I 1987-17 and the other with 02 I 1987-17. Here we have one cover with the day 2 with a '0' before it and one without. Was the date changed at midday, or is one of these strikes an error? Either way, it is unusual.

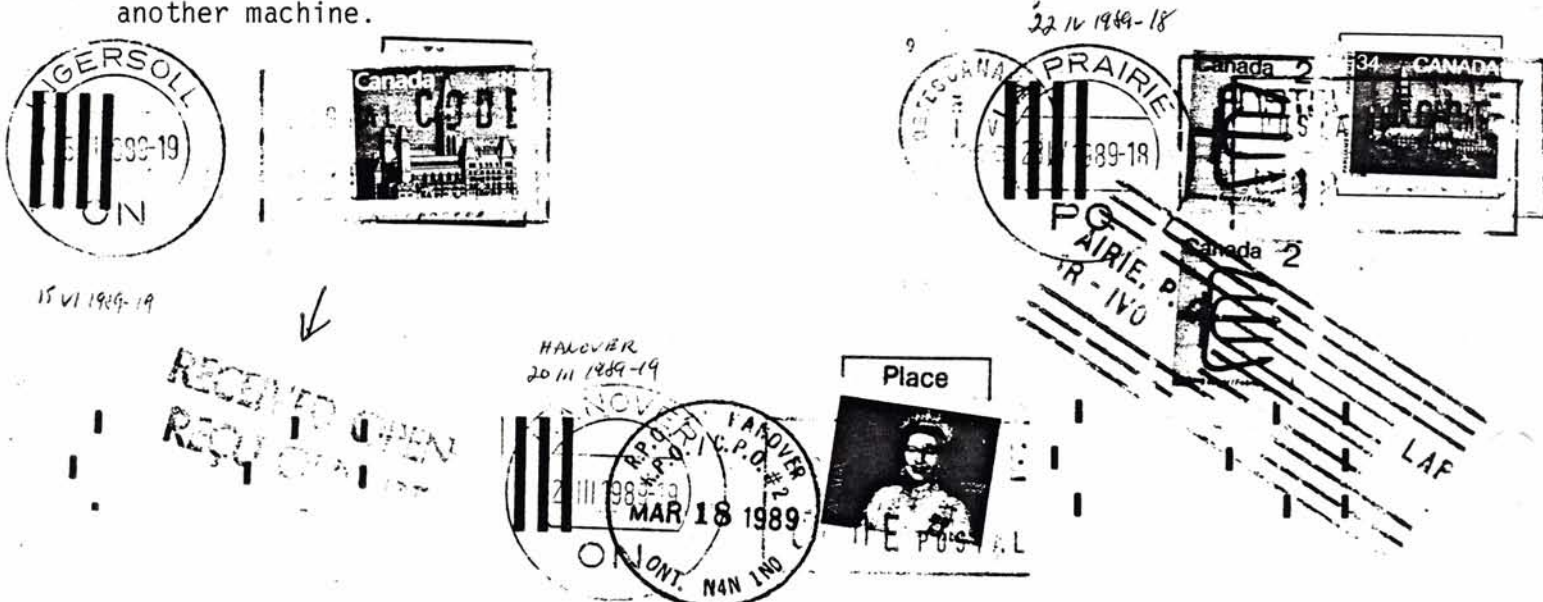

COMBINATION CANCELS.

Combination cancels are seen infrequently, and are of interest. Below are combinations of an ALMA, PQ Klussendorf and Chicoutimi IPS; LACHUTE, PQ Klussendorf and Ste. Therese de Blainville IPS; an ATIKOKAN, ON Klussendorf and Sudbury roller on a cover to Paris, Ont.; and a BERTHIERVILLE, PQ Klussendorf and the H3C 150 IPS.



Here are three more items of this type: an INGERSOLL, ON K for 15 VI 1989-19 with a Post Office informational handstamp "RECEIVED OPEN / RECU OUVERT" probably applied at Toronto; a HANOVER Klussendorf with a purple "R.P.O. - HANOVER / R.P.O./C.P.O.#2 / MAR 18 1988 / ONT. N4N 1N0" cancel; and a LA PRAIRIE, PQ 22 IV 1989-18 K with a La Prairie roller and a third cancel from another machine.

RIVIERE DU LOUP, PQ

This Klussendorfer town offers some interesting areas of study. The machine is Serial no. 02308 from delivery #3 with the postmaster reporting the first day of use as 17 I 1984. A number of lists report the EKU of 27 II 1984 which Denis Cottin reports as having and I can confirm with a date of 28 II 1984. The K is still in use. The timemarks reported are ., BL, .1, \equiv 3, -00, .8, -18, and 1. Pitney Bowes cancels are reported on 1 II 1984 and 6 II 1984 by Cottin and myself. The general timemark use is consistent generally with .1 being the oddity.

This shows the oddball use of .1 at the latter part of 1984. An error of 25 XI 1984.1 for 25 X 1984.1 occurred, which I have. Newman reports this error from 24 to 27 XI 1984.1. When the error was corrected by 2 XI 1984, the .1 timemark was retained. A corrected date of 29 X 1984.1 is also reported. Newman also reports errors in this period of 18-19 VII 1985.1 for 18-19 VI 1984, 20-26 VII 1984 BL for 20-26 VI 1984, and 30 VIII 1985.1 for 1984. Denis Cottin records an error of 26 IV 1985 which could be 1984 or ?.

The timemark situation in 1985 is quite normal with BLANK throughout except for errors. Newman reports 29 IV 1984-00 for 1985, which accounts for this timemark, and 32 I 1985 BL which is an impossible date.

1986 becomes more interesting with TM 2 (no dash or period) reported on 2 and 3 I 1986. 3 I 1986 is also reported with BL timemark. An error is reported of 28-29 VIII 1987.1 for 28-29 VII 1986.1. The dates are correct on 26 VII and 31 VII. Another reported error in this period is 11 VI 1985-18 for VII 1986, which I cannot confirm. I do have 11 VII 1986 BL correct. Otherwise, 1986 is normal with only the BLANK timemark.

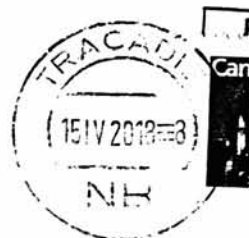
In 1987, .1 TM was in use from 02 I 1987 to 18 I 1987, and then from 22 I 1987 to 22 XII 1987, we find the . timemark. A number of errors are reported in 1987. Wally Gutzman reports 23 III 1987 \equiv 3 which is endorsed "Recd JAN 23/87." This is probably January 1987 and the 22 I 1987. may be a reporting error, although 26 I 1987. is a definite report. 15 VII 1988.1 is an error for 15 VI 1987 (confirmed by a meter impression of 12 VI '87 on the same cover).

1988 started off again with the .1 timemark which was used for a longer time from 04 I 1988 to the leap year date of 29 II 1988.1. From 1 III 1988 to the end of the year, the . timemark was in use. No errors for 1988 have been reported so far.

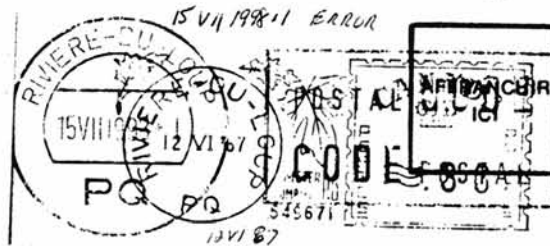
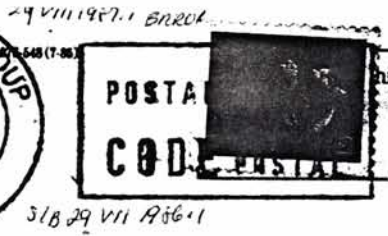
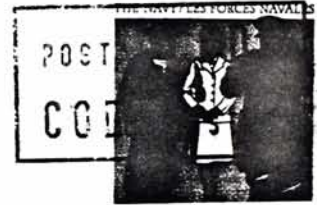
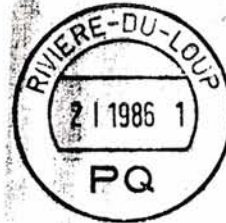
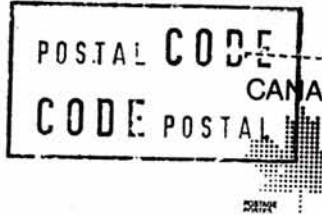
TRACADIE, NB error and timemark.

An odd year date error occurred with 15-18 IV 2018=9 for 15-18 IV 1989. This is also a new timemark.

MONTMAGNY, PQ in 1988.

Some odd things happened to this cancel during July, August, September, and October 1988. The normal timemark at MONTMAGNY in 1988 was BLANK. The last day of this BL timemark was 12 VII 1988. On 13 VII 1988, timemark . was put into use, which I have until 12 VIII 1988, the relatively short period of one month. On 15 VIII 1988, I record an error with a timemark change 15 VIII 1987 BLANK until 31 VIII 1987 (1988). On 5 IX 1988, I record the correction of the error with a new TM of .1 in use. This timemark lasted until 20 X 1988.1, about 1-1/2 months, when another error of 21 IX 1987 BL occurs, a year and month error which should have been 21 X 1988 BL. This lasted to 27 IX 1987 BL (27 X 1988) when a correction was made and again a new timemark occurred, 28 X 1988.2. I have no reports for 29 & 30 X, a Saturday and a Sunday. On 31 X 1988, the old BLANK timemark appeared again and held into November. This is certainly an interesting period with three timemarks and two errors. The 15-18 VII error is also a month error for VIII while 19 to 31 VIII have the month corrected but not the year.

ROUYN-NORANDA, PQ errors.

An interesting group of errors occurs in July 1986 with this Klussendorf cancel which leads to the use of four different timemarks in July. The normal timemark was -19 in 1986, except for part of April. The date cancels for July and August read as follows:

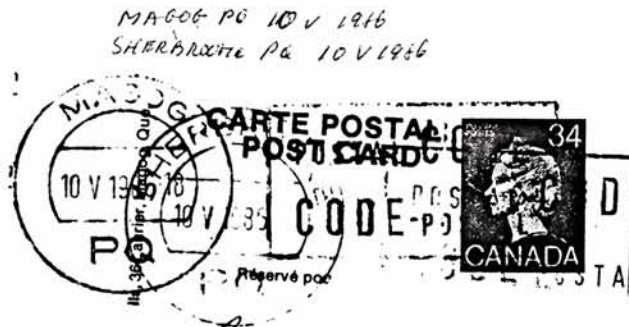

Everything was normal until July 10. On July 11, there was an error in the month with VI for VII, 1985 for 1986, and a timemark -18. The item bears a manuscript July 9, 1986 date. On July 12, the year was corrected to 1986, but the month remained VI instead of VII and a TM .8 was used (which I believe is the only time it was used at this town). July 13 was a Sunday, and on Monday the correct month and year were used with the new timemark . used until August 1, 1986. On August 2nd, the old -19 timemark resumed until the end of 1986. The -18 timemark was previously used by ROUYN-NORANDA in September-October 1984.



More ROUYN-NORANDA

A difficult date to get a Klussendorf cancel for is a holiday, especially Christmas Day. Shown below is a K cancel from ROUYN-NORANDA dated 25 XII 1986-19. Furthermore it is a double strike. (Or is it 25 XI? I'm going crossed looking at this one! kgs).



MAGOG, PQ and SHERBROOKE, PQ.

K covers with strikes of two different Klussendorf town cancels are unusual. The item above shows strikes of MAGOG and SHERBROOKE both dated 10 V 1986. The SHERBROOKE K is one of the more elusive ones.

Two more combination covers.

Shown below are combinations of SIMCOE 26 IV 1989 with STRATHROY 24 IV 1989 on the same cover, and FORT NELSON 17 III 1989-0 on the front with a SHEDIAC 23 III 1989 transit on the reverse of a cover going to Bathurst, N.B.



KEMPTVILLE, ON.

A matched pair has been found for KEMPTVILLE dated 05 VI 1989, with TM-12 and TM-17 used on the same day. In recording several hundred Klussendorf strikes for KEMPTVILLE, this is the first matched pair I have seen. The -17 timemark is much more common in 1989 than is -12. (In 1989, 53 strikes were -17 and 5 were -12). Three of the -12 strikes were Saturdays, one a Sunday, and 05 VI a Monday. It appears TM-12 is used on Saturdays generally now, the Sunday is a date error or special use, and the Monday date with the matched pair a case of forgetting to change the timemark on Monday morning and correcting it sometime during the day.



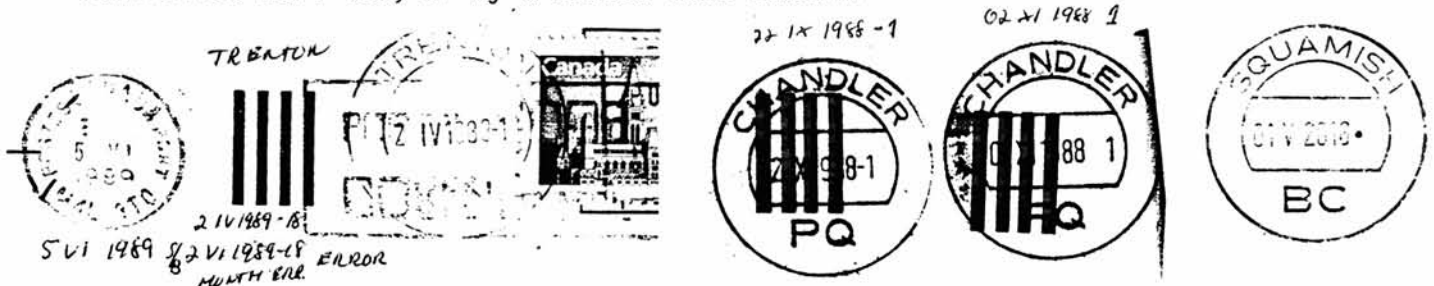

TRENTON, ON error.

A cover was found in a batch of K covers used May 15 to June 16, 1989 with a TRENTON Klussendorf strike dated 2 IV 1989-18 and an M4L 3T0 other machine cancel of 5 VI 1989, indicating that the TRENTON strike was a month error of IV for VI. This was corrected by 6 VI 1989. The only ways to prove these month errors are by day of issue of a stamp (which is useful infrequently), by a controlled mail lot, or by a second date cancel.



CHANDLER, PQ timemarks.

An unusual timemark change occurred at the end of September or sometime in October 1988. The normal timemark for CHANDLER was -1 in 1988. The TM was changed to 1 (no dash). In the -1 timemark, the first "1" of the dials was used (as in -18); in the 1 timemark, the second 1 was used (as in 21). This is one of the few times in any Klussendorf cancel that such a TM change has occurred. I have recorded a date of 22 IX 1988-1 for the old timemark and 27 X 1988 1 for the new one.

SQUAMISH, BC error.

Date error of 01 V 2018 (above). for 01 V 1989. Bill Robinson reports it corrected by 05 V 1989. Oddball years such as 2018 are fun to run across.

MANIWAKI, PQ.

MANIWAKI is a fun Klussendorf town to study because of its variety of possible timemarks and matched pairs. The EKU is 11 IV 1984. Timemark -17 is prevalent throughout with reports on hand from 6 VI 1984 to 7 VII 1989 continuously. Timemark -08 is noted as early as 25 IV 1984, up to 22 I 1988, but it is seen much less frequently than -17. A number of matched pairs of TMs -08 and -17 have been reported on the same day - ranging from 21 I 1985 (Newman) to 22 I 1988.

On 03 XI 1984, another timemark -12 is noted and is recorded as late as 23 I 1988. At present, there aren't any reports of -12 used on the same day as -08 or -17. The earliest report of -12 is for 03 XI 1984, a Saturday. Other reports of TM -12 are 11 I 1986, 29 III 1986, 16 VIII 1986, 23 VIII 1986, 6 IX 1986, 31 I 1987, 16 V 1987, 1 VIII 1987, 21 XI 1987, 21 I 1988, and 04 IV 1988, which are all Saturdays. Its use was reported for Sunday 30 XI 1986-12, which is either an exception or an error. This contradicts Geoff Newman's analysis in PHSC issue No. 54 where he suggested there are three daily clearances, at 0800, 1200, and 1700 hours. There appear to be only two clearances per day.

There is a report of timemark -07 on 10 I 1985 and also -08 timemark the same day. It is probable that timemark -07 is an error for -17. With several hundred strikes examined, this is only one of two TM -07 strikes noted. The presence of -07 and -08 the same day tends to corroborate this. The other report is for 30 XI 1987.

On 20 V 1987, another unusual TM appears, -05. A matched pair of -08 and -05 exists for this date, suggesting that -05 is an error; mail clearance at 5:00 AM is unusual but possible. It would be nice to find timemark -17 on this date, also. No other -05 timemark strikes have been reported.

TM -11 appears on 16 I 1988, 30 I 1988, and 12 III 1988, which are all Saturdays. This suggests that on some Saturdays mails were cleared at 11:00 AM and not at noon, as seen by the sequence:

16 I 1988-11
23 I 1988-12
30 I 1988-11 .

On March 14 and 15, 1988, a Monday and Tuesday, timemark -15 appears and is not noted elsewhere. Again, there is the possibility that this is either a timemark error for the normal TM -17 after the weekend or there was an earlier mail clearance at 3:00 PM instead of 5:00 PM.

On March 19, 1988, a Saturday, a new TM is reported. This suggests the previous mail clearance at 12:00 noon or 11:00 AM was changed to 9:00 AM. On March 26, 1988, another new timemark, 09, appeared. This is the same 9:00 AM Saturday clearance. On the next Saturday, 2 IV 1988, the timemark -12 showed up, for an apparent noon clearance. However, on 09 IV 1988, the next Saturday, we have -09 again. We have further reports of -09 on 23 IV 1988, 14 V 1988, 27 VIII 1988, 4 II 1989, 25 II 1989, 25 III 1989, etc.

An error of 24 X 1999.9 occurred for 24 IX 1988, which was a Saturday. Timemark .9 is also noted on 1 X 1988, a Saturday.

Maniwaki has errors of 30 VII 1984 for 30 V 1984, and 18 to 20 XI 1995 for 1985, reported by Geoff Newman in PHSC Journal No. 54, p. 34.

Maniwaki, therefore, has timemarks -05, -07, -08, -09, .9, -11, -12, and -17 with specific timemarks on Saturdays only. Eleven examples of strikes from MANIWAKI, showing most of the varieties, are shown at the top of the next page.

CORUNNA, ON errors and timemarks.

Some funny things happened at CORUNNA recently. I find reports of 13-15 IV 1989-18 in error for 13-15 VI 1989-18, the VI being reversed. This was corrected on 16 VI 1989-18. Whether this occurred in the earlier period of the month needs to be found out. Again, in July some funny stuff occurred. Everything is fine until 20 VII 1989-18. Greig Hutton reports an error of 21 VI 1988 BL for 21 VII 1989 BL. This is also a new timemark for CORUNNA. This was corrected by the 27th and we have reports of 27 and 28 VII 1989, which is also a new timemark.



ST BRUNO, PQ error and timemark.

Wally Gutzman reports an error of 3 IV 1988.0 for 3 IV 1989.0. This is also a new timemark. The error is recorded from the third to the eleventh, and is known to be corrected by the fourteenth.

While Al and I were discussing this list, we concluded that errors certainly are much more frequent now than they were in 1984 and 1985. Neither reports nor large unpicked lots from the early years have anywhere near the percent of date errors being found in cover lots from 1989. Why??? (kgs)

SWAN RIVER, MB errors.

Two different errors occurred here in July 1989. Everything was fine on 3 VII 1989. On 5 and 6 VII 1989, there was a partial rollover of the month and year so that it appeared to be VIII 1990.? On the 7th, all was normal. From 14 to 19 VII 1989, a second error of 14 VI 1987 0 occurred, which has been reported up to the 19th. On the 26th, everything was normal again.



ELMIRA, ON timemark.

This town normally has the timemarks -06, -12, and -18. On 17 VII 1989, timemark -13 is noted. This is probably an error for -18. More than one strike was examined and it is definitely a "13" and not a bad strike of "18." Timemark -18 was noted the next day.

The timemark here was changed from .1 to BL on 08 VIII 1989. This has been confirmed by strikes of 07 VIII 1989.1 and 08 VIII 1989 BL.



BELOEIL, PQ error.

An unusual month error has turned up here, of 31 VI 1989 8, an impossible date. This cover came from a lot dated July 14 to Aug. 15, 1989, and in this case the correct date can be pinned down to 31 VII 1989 8.

Jim Karr has sent in some reports of interest. Regarding the previously reported WESTLOCK, AB error (p. 67), Jim notes that the error occurs 09 VI 199 ≡4 through to 28 VI 199 ≡4. No Saturday or Sunday dates were noted. The error was corrected 29 VI 1989.2 and is correct through July and August.

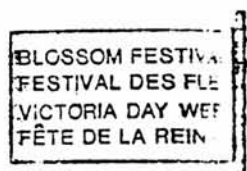
Jim also reports HIGH RIVER, AB has a correct date of 26 VII 1989≡ and then starts an error on the same day of 26 VI 1988≡0. This continues to 31 VI 1988≡0 (July 29 and 30 - Sat. and Sun. - were not seen). This was corrected as 1 VIII 1989≡0 with timemark ≡0 continuing. Also, OLDS, AB has a one-day error of 21 VIII 1990≡2 for 21 VII 1989, a Friday. Sat. and Sun. July 22 and 23 dates were not seen. This error was corrected on 24 VII 1989.1 and things then continue normally. Copies of these HIGH RIVER happenings are shown on the next page.
