## Red Rose Tea Stamp Catalogue

The Red Rose Tea Stamp Catalogue, containing 48 pages, 3 3/8" x 6". Printed on a cheap paper, which now has turned quite brown and stained. Title inside reads "Red Rose Tea Catalogue of Stamps of the World". Order form to be mailed to Red Rose Tea Company, 708 Walnut St., Montreal, Que. No date, but many stamps from 1930's, latest sets being 1938. Also a big section on British Coronation Issue. Can anyone provide a date, or another edition?

Includes a section on "Honor-Bilt Packets". Can anyone provide any details on this line of packets? They list 100 Canada, packet No. 1425 at \$1.00, or with Red Rose Labels, 64¢. Also a article by H. E. Harris & Co., Boston called "The Treasure Hunter's Guide" which mentions several finds worth fortunes, including the sheet of 100 US Airmails bought for \$24.00 and sold for \$15,000.00.

When finding stamps, they mention that you should keep stamps on original cover, as they are worth more. Would you pay \$12.00 for an 8¢ registration on cover, or \$1500.00 to \$3500.00 for a 12p on cover?

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
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The prices noted below each type of stamp indicate the range of values, from the lowest to the highest, given to that parrange of values, from the lowest to the highest, given to that particular type in the Standard Postage Stamp Catalogue. Although two or more stamps may be identical in design and denomination, they may be of different issues. In such cases collectors tell them apart by shades of color, perforations, watermarks, paper, etc. In the limited space available here, we cannot point out these differences, and we suggest that you consult the Standard Stamp Catalogue to tell which variety you have.
