29...Identification Chart

A number of readers have suggested a means of identifying cancels to make for more accurate and uniform surveys. After four attempts and vetting by three members we have designed the chart attached. Basically it was drawn up with the World War Two period in mind but then additions were made to include post war markings as well. Possibly it will serve the pre war time also. Please "TYPE" your WORLD WAR TWO cancels from Nova Scotia and P.E.I. and record the results on the Survey sheet. Suggestions for additions or corrections to the chart will be welcomed. It probably will be necessary to enlarge upon or add other TYPE charts as the scope of the surveys increases.

Its a start and we hope it will make the surveys more interesting and useful.

30...REGISTERED oval type postal markings - WW1.

R.A. Kingston, our member in England, reports the following markings used by Canadian Forces in England. Size of the marking is 30mm by 24mm, Registered on top, legend at bottom, with date in straight line across centre. All dates are 1916 except one which was 1918 from Witley.

31...SURVEY - Nova Scotia and P.E.I. - World War Two period only

32...Stamped "Free Franked Soldier's Mail".


An interesting collection might be made from soldiers letters (covers) sent from overseas during World War One at the FREE rate but stamped on arrival in Canada. The Canadian Flag Cancel Bulletin Vol 1 No. 4 for May 1975 details the events which brought this situation about. Briefly the main points in Canada who applied the stamps were:-

Halifax, St. John, N.B., Cuebec, Montreal, Ottawa, Kingston, Toronto, Hamilton, London, Winnipeg, Medicine Hat and Nelson RPO, Calgary and Vancouver RPO, Vancouver and Victoria.

Until July 28, 1917 it was necessary for these exchange offices to affix Canadian postage stamps to all stampless letters arriving from overseas forces, and to cancel the stamps. An agreement was reached with Great Britain on July 20, 1917 and put into effect July 28, 1917 permitting free franking of soldiers mail. Stamped and cancelled covers are known dated after the effective date. Perhaps you have one?

Members can assist our efforts by studying the type chart and applying their cancels to it. Place tick marks in the squares provided on the Survey sheet, one example only being required. Duplicates need not be recorded. Good luck.


#1 KILLER edges in line at postmark. 27a
