On page 7 you will note Vernon, B.C. as the site of a World War One Internment Camp. The following is taken from the Kelowna Daily Courier of Sept 13, 1976 - SIXTY YEARS AGO - quote "Twelve interned prisoners who escaped from the Vernon Internment Camp were still at large. They had dug a tunnel nearly 100 feet long with a homemade wooden auger. The dirt was pushed under the floor of the kitchen, and the entrance to the tunnel was covered by a bread box." unquote. Information of this type isn't found in your average philatelic journal but adds a bit of spice to the topic, don't you think?

## 88...Scarce postmarks



# 89...More interesting postal markings

Wayne Curtis sence a photocopy of a censor marking used by Force "C", Hong Kong. It was applied to the back of the cover. The receiver's strike is dated Jan 10 42. Guertin's book illustrates the triangular mark but is numbered 136. Wayne has added another dimension to a little known area.



Two Emergency cancels are shown, one used at MPO 114, Cedar Springs (London District) and the second from Edmonton District, Emergency No 2 which might have been used at Wainwright? Have members details on these or examples of other cancels used during wartime? Please advise. The cover is clean, the photocopier was set too dark. Have just found a note stating that Cedar Springs never had MPO postal equipment. It was an Army base. According to one writer it opened Jun 18, 45 and closed Jun 29, 45. Presumably these are the MPO operation dates not the base opening and closing dates.

In mid-1940 the first definitive Naval censor marking was introduced into the R.C.N. replacing the straight line "PASSED BY CENSOR"

There are few variations in size and style considering the large number of stamps that were manufactured. Examples of the six (6) known varieties are shown here and numbered for ease of reference.

Earliest known date of use for #1 and #2 type is 7 June 1940.

#3 is not common but is known used on both East and West Coasts with the earliest recorded date being 12 December 1942

#4 seems to be very scarce with no dated copies seen to present.

#5 and #6 are known used on the East Coast only, with earliest date being 30 September 1940, from HMCS "St. Clair" at Halifax.


