


287...Future projects

290...Mails for Reinforcements - WWl


The reference used for this item is, "Historical Memorandum of the Canadian Postal Service with the Armies in France, Belgium and Germany 1914-1919", Part 6. See BNA TOPICS of January 1965.

Cuoted briefly. The provision of postal facilities for Canadian drafts and reinforcements during the period between their despatch from the training camps and depots in England and their arrival with the battalion or other unit to which they were allotted presented a serious problem for the following reasons:-

- a the organization for reinforcing fighting formations changed periodically
- b not infrequently men were drawn at short notice to provide reinforcements for units other than those previously named

In the early part of the campaign mail was redirected from England for reinforcement but this proved impractical. Also, soldiers discharged from hospitals in France were collected together at the Base Depot at Havre hence 6 members of the Depot staff were kept fully occupied redirecting correspondence. etc.

290 ... cont'd.



A card posted at the Base Depot C.P.O. at Harfleur, unications: it was designated 16 NO 1916. Card reduced in size.

The number of men varied from 2500 to 4000 and arrangements were then made to accomodate 8000. They transacted their postal business at an Imperial Post Office 12 miles distant where they posted over 3000 letters daily and purchased 3000 fr. worth of postal orders.

It was accordingly decided to establish a Canadian Post Office in the Base Depot at Harfleur, near Havre, with a staff of 1 Sergeant and 3 men and this was opened on 26 July 1916. The office functioned in the same way as Imperial Post Offices on the Lines of Comm-

S.22 and cleared its

mails through the Imperial Base Post Office at Havre.

Ten months later A.P.O. S.22 was moved to Etaples the site of the reorganized Canadian Base Depots. At this time the number of letters received daily was 9200 and despatched, 7700. Other postal services also were available. Unquote.

P.S. Can a member provide a photocopy of the A.P.O. S.84 handstamp as it was a Canadian Post Office in France?
