CANADA'S PATRIOTIC METER SLOGANS 1940-45 W. Whitehouse

In 1940, Canada's war effort required money, lots of money in order to produce the goods and services necessary to equip the Armed Forces and fight the war against Germany.

One method of maintaining a continuous flow of money coming to the Government was through the sale of War Saving Stamps. These stamps sold for 25¢ each and when one had acquired sufficient stamps, they could be exchanged for a Certificate worth \$4.00, and at maturity in 7 years \$5.00

The Government conducted an extensive advertising campaign in newspapers, magazines, on billboards and in all types of stores both large and small. It appears the first to use patriotic slogans in conjunction with their meter postage machines were the large volume mailers, gradually smaller companies purchased slogan plates for use on their postage meter machines. Some of the designs supporting the purchase of Stamps and Certificates, or the war effort in general, were so popular they remained in use from 1940 to 1946.

By 1941, it was obvious that larger sums of money were required than were being raised through the sale of stamps and certificates, consequently Victory Bonds were made available to the public. These bonds came in denominations of \$50, \$100, \$500, \$1000 and even larger, the plan being to raise hundreds of millions in a single drive. Commencing in 1942, there were two Victory Loan drives each year with the last two, the 8th and 9th, taking place in 1945. Once again slogans were made available to postage meter users and once again some designs proved to be very popular while others were seldom used.

The illustrated "checklist" which follows was first prepared for and published in the Canada Meter Study Group Newsletter, it contains those slogans known to have been prepared for use throughout the war period, whether they urged the purchase of stamps, certificates, bonds, or the patriotic effort necessary for the successful conclusion of the war.

Meter slogans connected with the 6th, 7th and 8th Victory Loan drives have not been seen by the writer, nor French versions of many slogans one would feel should have existed. Although a French version of a 3rd Victory Loan slogan #VL3-2F has been reported, a copy is not available for inclusion in the list.

The editor will naturally be interested to hear of any slogans of a patriotic nature in this time period which are not listed here, together with a photostat copy suitable for inclusion in a future Newsletter.
