






ANTHONY LAW, RCNVR/RCN ARTIST--By W.D. Whitehouse

Among the many Canadian Naval officers who went to England on loan to the Royal Navy in 1940 was a young artist by the name of Anthony (Tony) Law from Quebec City. A number of these officers along with Tony Law were assigned to the R.N. Coastal Forces, in particular the Motor Torpedo Boat (MTB) Flotillas.

After serving in British MTB Flotillas Lt. C. Anthony Law, RCNVR, was promoted to Lt.Cmdr. and given command of the newly-formed Canadian MTB 29th Flotilla, just in time for D-Day operations in the Channel where he won the D.S.C.

Since his arrival in England Tony Law had been providing numerous naval canvases to the National Gallery of Canada and the Canadian War Museum. For Christmas of 1944 he prepared a drawing which the 29th Flotilla used on the face of its Christmas card.




In February 1945 five of the 29th Flotilla's boats were in Ostend, Belgium, when fire broke out [and] all five of the RCN and seven RN MTB's were lost together with over sixty officers and ratings. The 29th Flotilla was disbanded as a result of this accident.

At the end of WWII, Lt.Cmdr. Law transferred to the RCN and for Christmas of 1946 a drawing by him was used by <u>Uganda</u> on the face of its Christmas card showing the ship off Gibraltar. [I]nside was the ship's badge and a greeting [see illustration over].







### FORTHCOMING CANADA BOOK



#### YOUR HELP IS NEEDED

Assistance is needed in providing the information necessary to produce a comprehensive book on Canada during World War II. This will include not only civil censorship but also Foreign Exchange Control and perhaps also various patriotic items of the period. The scope may be wider than other books in the British Empire Civil Censorship Devices series to justify a separate book and to increase its sale following discussion with other specialist societies. Particularly needed are clear copies of the earlier censorship markings and labels and also copies of any official forms. Copies of Foreign Exchange Control district office markings are also needed together with any forms used except the resealing labels from 15 February 1940. Copies of the earlier labels used even if originally provided for other purposes are also needed.

Have you any details of mail that was returned or otherwise not passed by the censor or the Foreign Exchange Control authorities? What about the memoranda and circulars issued by either the censors or Foreign Exchange Control Board?



KITCHEN, Ron - (R.C.A.F. C.W.O. - Retired). Rodar Tech in W.W.11 (162 Squadron) and in various related positions until retirement in 1974. Member National Capital Area Dodo Bird Club, Legion Branch 16 and Canadian Forces Philatelic Society. Also Gloucester Historical Society and other historical and genealogical societies. At home, as he wished, on Sunday, August 3, 1997. He Jeaves behind his primary school friend and "pride and lor" of 55 years, wife Lillian Kerr. Also mourning his passing are children Jean, Robin (Christine), and Marian and grandchildren Laila (Todd Reis) of Hawaii and Arthur, Reena, Fiona and Tristan of Ottawa. Predeceased by his parents Jacob Henry Kitchen of Lloydtown, Ontario and Jean Guthrie Heron of Lochee, Dundee, Scotland. Born in Vancouver, December 18, 1919, his early prewar life was spent in Toronto where he enlisted in the R.C.A.F. Graduated from No. 31 RDF School, Clinton, Ontario in 1942. Always modest about his achievements, he treasured memories of working on the development and installation of W.W. 11 radar, and the rodar design of the Canadian Forces Sabre and AVRO Arrow.
