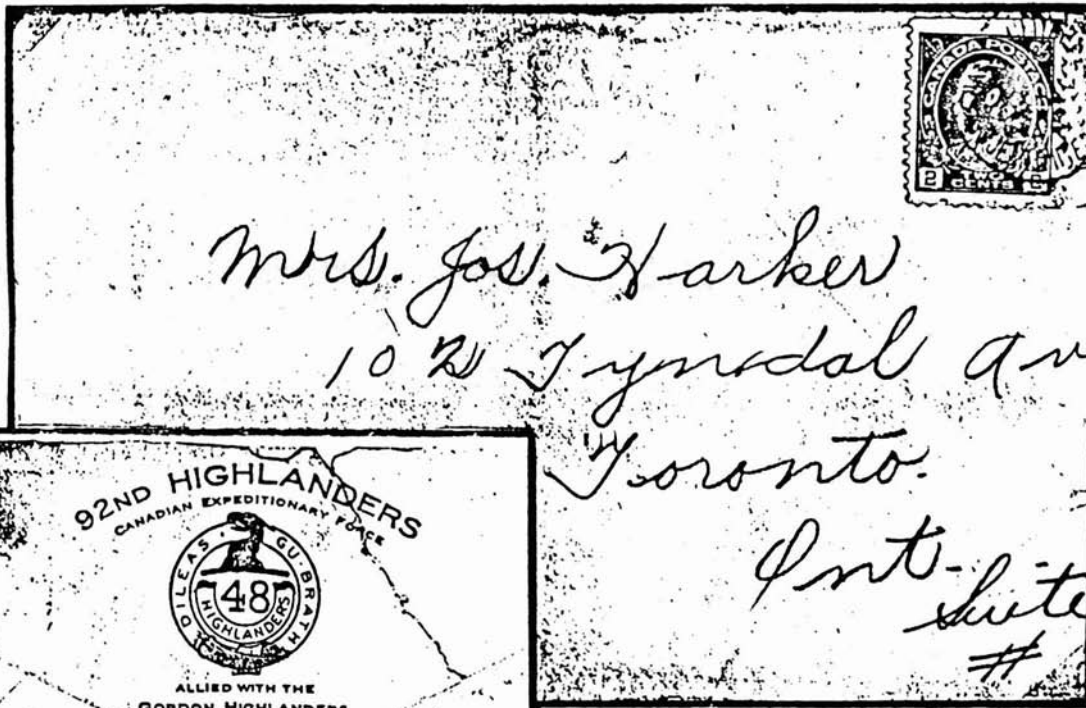

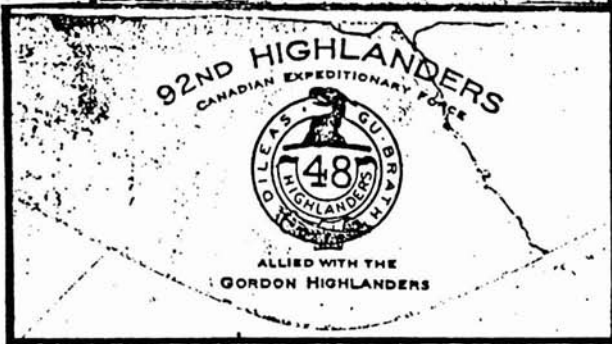

The 48th Highlanders (allied with the Gordon Highlanders) were raised October 16, 1891 with headquarters at Toronto, Ontario. There were eight Companies. The Gordons were first raised in Scotland and comprised:

1st Battalion	75th Regiment	raised	1787
2nd "	92nd "	"	1794

The 48th went overseas in 1914 as the 15th Battalion, Third Infantry Brigade, part of the First Contingent with Lt.Col. J.A. Currie, Officer Commanding. Their strength at embarkation was 1,155 all ranks. [Colin sent in an early related St. Jean CDS and it has been added.Ed.]

PRESS RELEASE

At last, the long-awaited Canadian Military Postal Markings 1881-1995 by W.J. Bailey and E.R. Toop has been published; a large 2 volume book in a hard-cover slipcase.

Its' 871 pages are complete with all the hundreds of postmarks illustrated full size, with a separate number and a rarity factor for each, so it will be most useful for dealer and collector alike. Bill Bailey and Ritch Toop started this compilation in 1981 and many have helped with it (as readers will note in the acknowledgements page). There is a short index and some very extensive appendices that include: Canadian Wars, Campaigns and Peacekeeping Roles; Unit and Formation listings of all Canadian Units who have gone overseas; Military Postal rates; and others.

The work is dedicated to Ritch Toop who died in 1995 before the book was completed. It is published and distributed by Charles G. Firby Publications, Waterford, Michigan., 6695 Highland Road, Suite 107, Waterford, MI, 48327, USA.

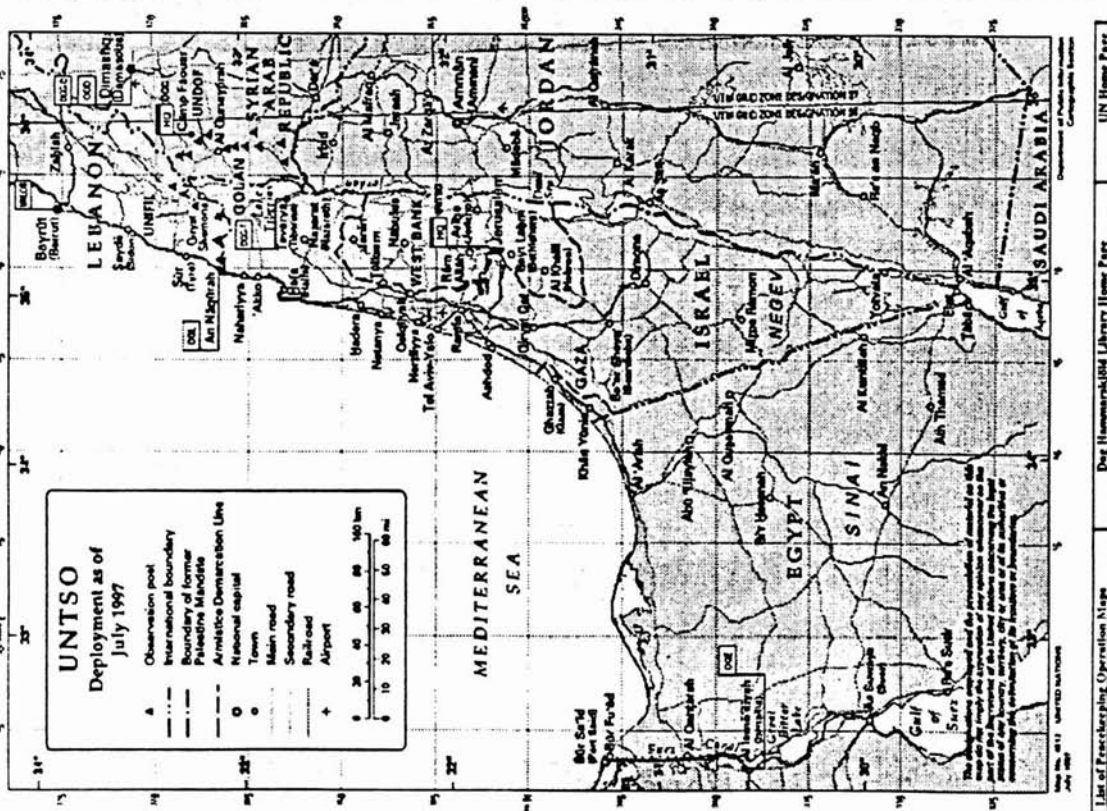

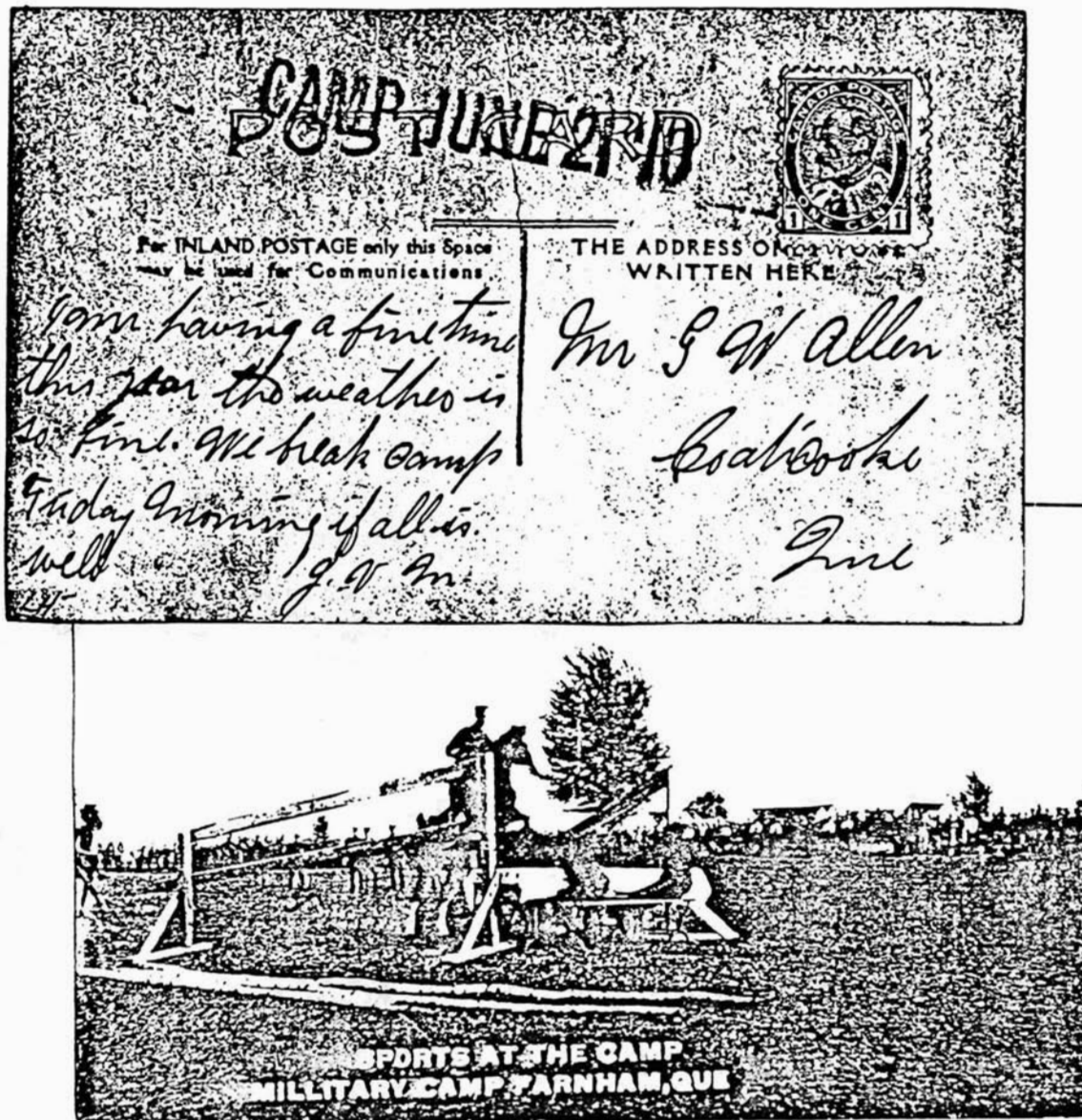

MYSTERY HANDSTAMP-FARNHAM CAMP--By C.D. Sayles



Back in Newsletter #76 (November 1987), Colin Campbell reported and illustrated this marking dated June 23, 1910. At a recent show, I was offered the example shown [above] and thanks to that earlier report, snapped it up. It is the same as the first handstamp, except that the date is two days earlier and the handstamp has not been used to cancel the stamp. At the same show I saw a third example in a dealer's box. It too is dated June 21, and [the marking] has not been used to cancel the stamp.

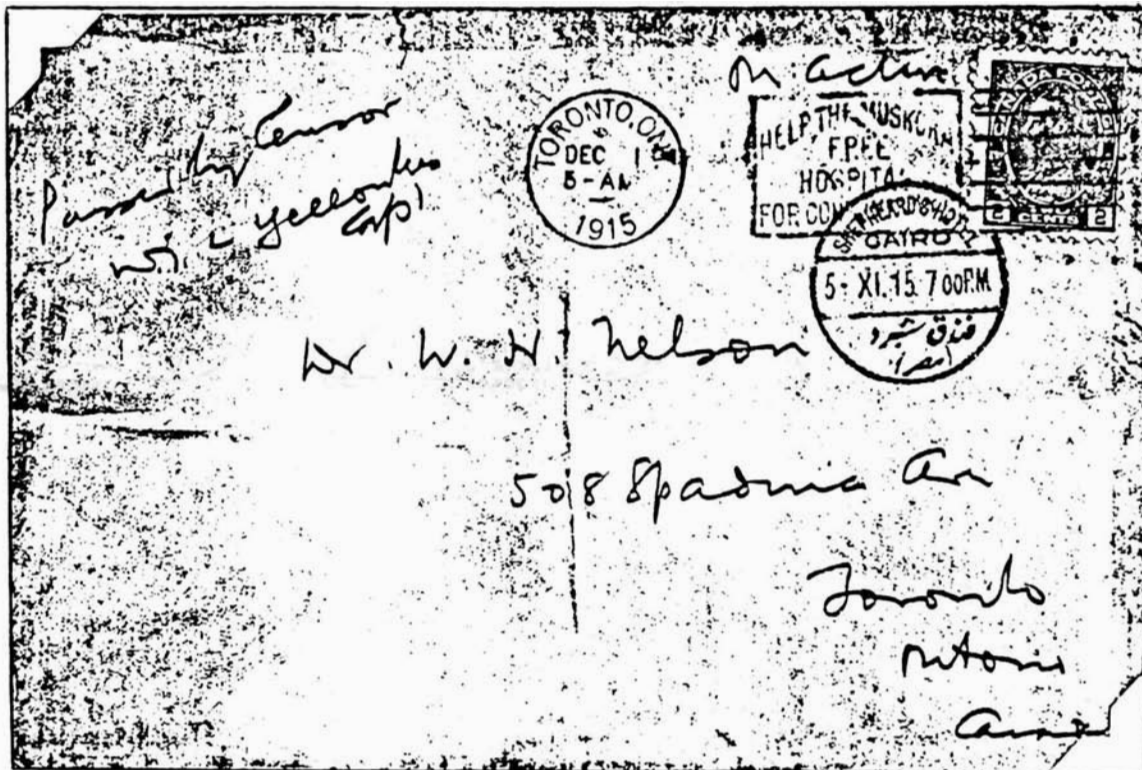
The card illustrated has been "doctored" by the addition of the stamp which cannot be the original, since it is faintly but clearly dated

1907. Hopefully this was done to replace a stamp fallen off or removed by a collector.

With three strikes now seen it is unlikely that this is a stray cancel, intended for something else, and mistakenly applied. To speculate, it could have been applied to Camp mail to indicate its origin to the civil post office, or possibly it is some variation on an orderly room handstamp. We simply do not know. Keep an eye out for this one and if you happen to have a copy, why not drop a line to the Editor with particulars?

SHEPHEARD'S HOTEL, CAIRO 1915--By Colin Pomfret



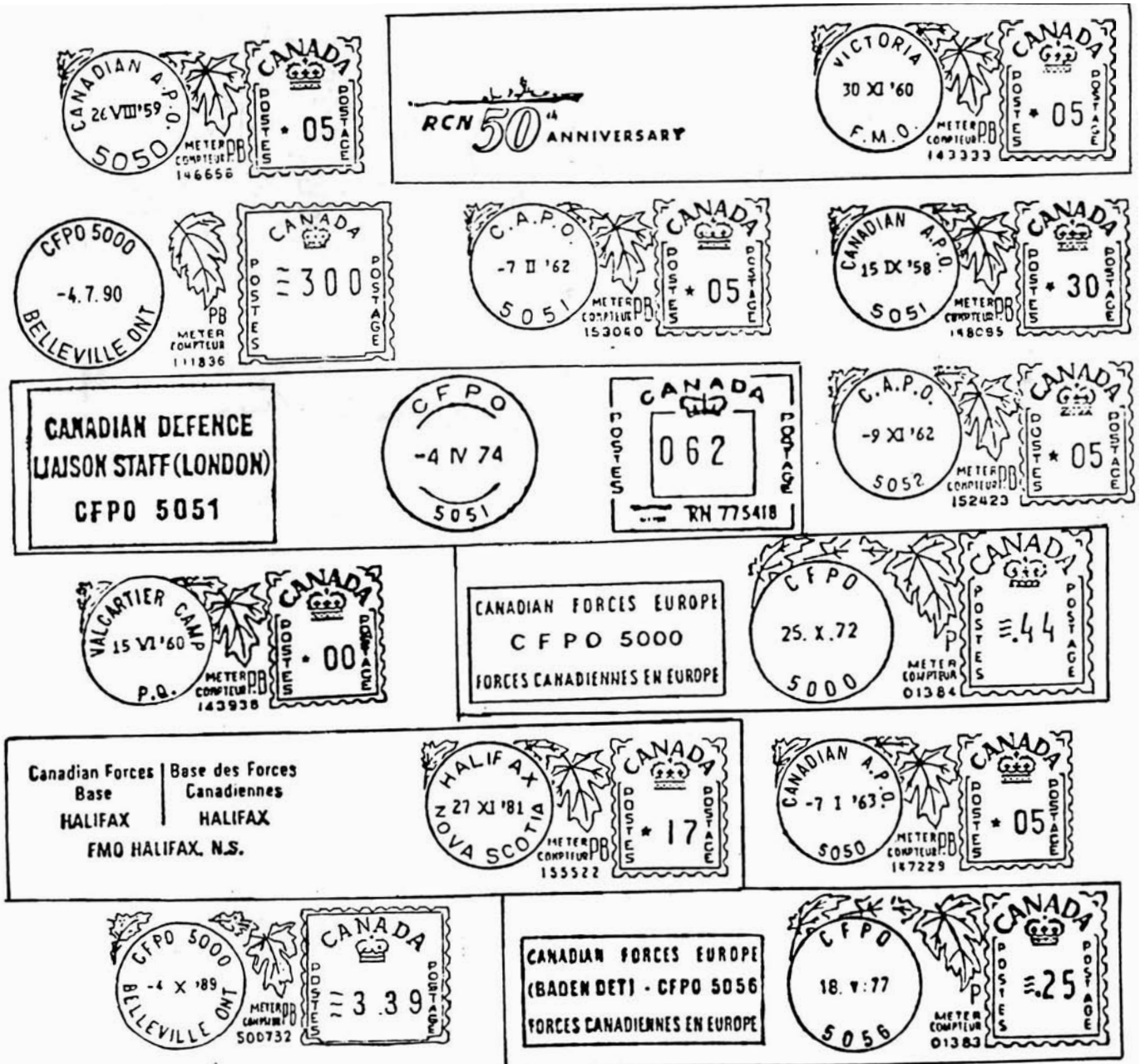
A cover to Toronto self-censored by Captain Norman James Lang Yellowlees, the Adjutant of No.4 Canadian General Hospital, is illustrated above. The Hospital sailed for Salonika from Devonport on October 18, 1915, staying in Egypt until November 7 and arriving at Salonika on the 9th.

On May 15, 1916 a Zeppelin was brought down by the fire from H.M.S. Agamemnon and Capt. Yellowlees, attempting to chase the wreck, was swept away as he tried to cross the River Varder. His body was recovered later and buried at Salonika.

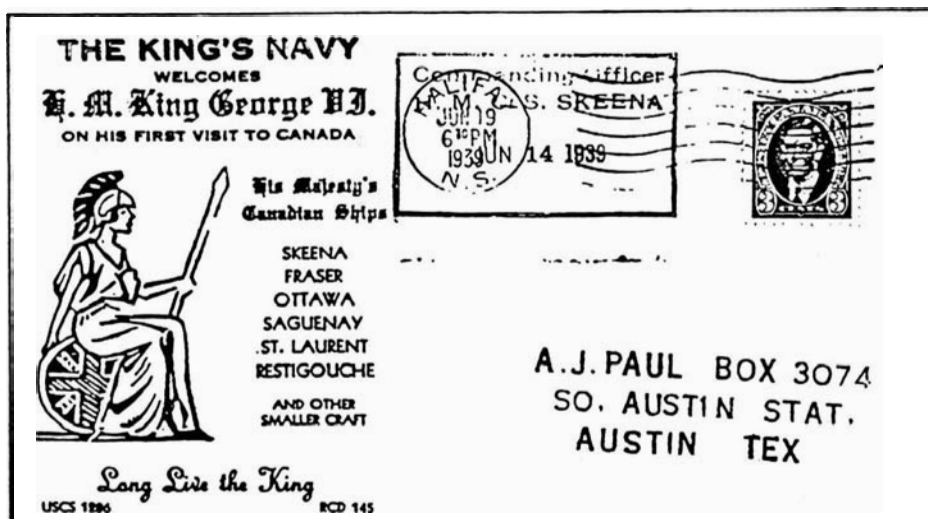

THE '39 ROYAL VISIT-RE-VISITED--By John Wannerton

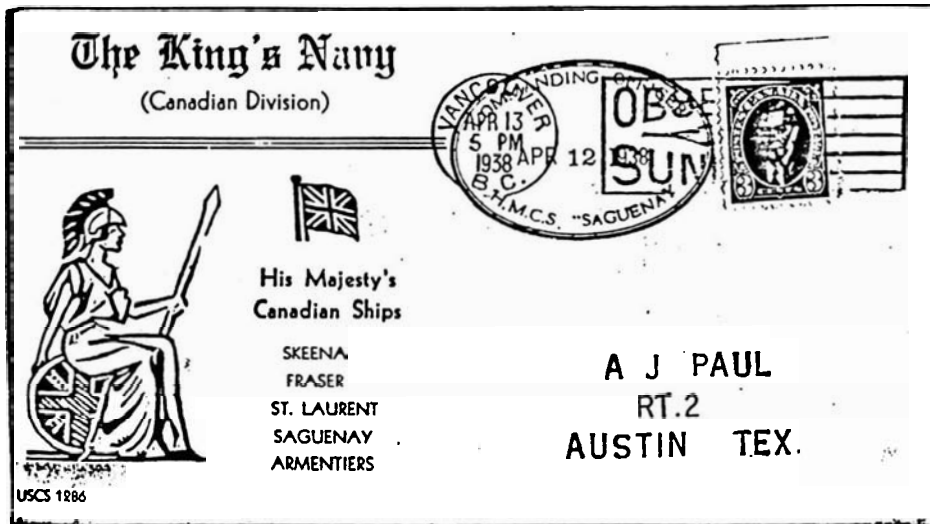

Next question: was the Royal Family at Halifax around that time?

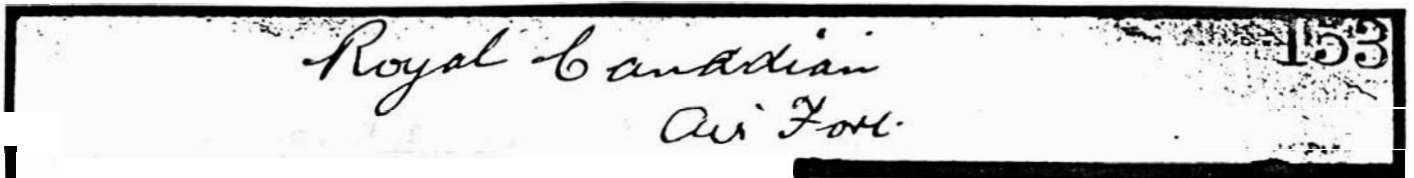

Canadian soldiers' mementos on exhibit

OTTAWA — On May 19, 1918, Mary Macdonald became the first Canadian military nurse to be killed in action in World War I when she was hit by shrapnel during the bombing of the French hospital where she worked.

Ten days later, her grieving fiancé, Capt. Ted Ballantyne, wrote from England to her family in Ottawa:

"Her funeral was wonderful.

"Her grave was lined with white and purple lilacs and pink peonies by the Nursing Sisters

"I can scarcely realize that all this has come to pass and that I am not to enjoy her companionship again.

"She was everything to me and our hopes were for the future."

Almost 80 years later, the poignant letter is on display in the Canadian War Museum's *We'll Meet Again* exhibition of letters, photographs, journals, scrapbooks and other mementos that tell the stories of Canadians' war-time relationships.

We'll Meet Again includes letters to sweethearts and families and photos that soldiers carried in their pockets throughout the war.

The mementos on exhibit include embroidered quilts, a Christmas card drawn on a piece of uniform, a record book kept by a Canadian soldier during four years as a prisoner of war and knitted dolls created for Croatian children by a grieving mother.

Though most of the exhibits are from the two world wars, one exhibit recounts the loss of a son killed in 1994, when he was serving as a peace-keeper in Croatia.

The museum collected the items with the help of Royal Canadian Legion branches and other veterans' organizations.

The exhibits, most of them never before publicly displayed, came from people across Canada who stepped forward to share their stories.

"People showed a wonderful trust by sharing their memories with us," noted museum director-general Victor Suthren.

"This is the very human side of war and its impact on ordinary people that we hope will touch Canadians of all ages."

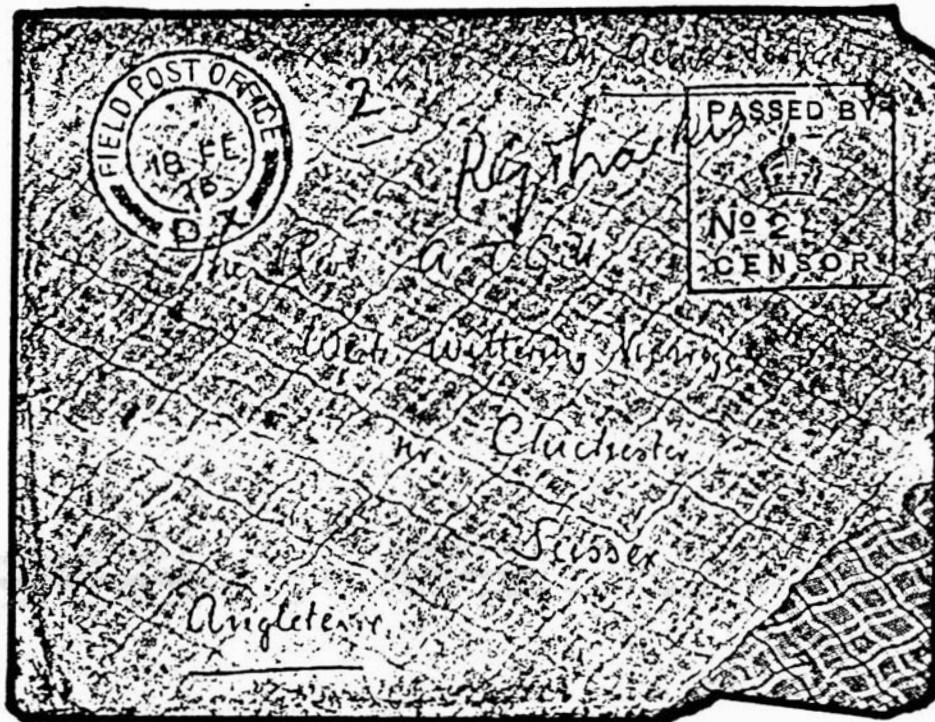

"FPO DX 18, 18 FE 15"--EARLY FIRST CANADIAN DIV. USE--

At first glance a cover dated over a week after the First Canadian Division left England for France (Feb. 8, 1915) wouldn't create much of a stir. It isn't until one realizes that the convoy transporting the troops ran into bad weather in the Bay of Biscay and was delayed for five days, that this cover [above] becomes a bit more significant. Most of the Division had only started to detrain at Hazebrouck on this date and this is the earliest FPO cover I've seen used from France by the Division. Can anyone report an earlier FPO usage by any First Canadian Division office?
