



C.12 DESIGNS - STUDY AND IDENTIFICATION OF OFFICE USERS WITH MISSING CODE HOLES AND OTHER DIE DAMAGE--TO ALLOCATE AND ELIMINATE THE BELLEVILLE' EXAMPLES.



BY NOW SOME OF US WILL HAVE ABSORBED THE VERY FINE JOB THAT JIM CATTERICK HAS DONE IN OUR NOVEMBER ISSUE BY PRODUCING THE INITIAL SERIES OF THIS C.12 STUDY WITH MISSING OFFICE CODE HOLES. THE REPRODUCTION OF MY COPY IS STARK WHITE AND BLACK, EVEN BETTER THAN THE ORIGINAL MANUSCRIPT, AND MOST SUITABLE FOR MAKING ADDITIONAL COPIES AND 3-RING BINDER USE. THE CARE AND EFFORT REQUIRED IN

CREATING SATISFACTORY RESULTS FOR MEMBERS USE IS OFTER FROM POOR PHOTOS, AND "BLIND HOLES" AND POOR DIE IMPRESSIONS SOMETIMES NEED A LITTLE IMAGINATION AND HELP. MUCH CREDIT RESTS WITH THE EDITOR AND NOT THE MACHINE TO PRODUCE SUCH EXCELLENT COPY. SPECIAL THANKS TO THOSE UNKNOWNS WHO HAVE SPENT THEIR TIME AND EFFORT TO CHECK AND RECHECK MATERIAL, AND ESPECIALLY TO MESSRS. HANES, DALPE, TREMBLAY, JOHNSON, DICKETTS, WHO HAVE SENT ME PHOTOS AND ILLUSTRATIONS OF KEY MATERIAL WHICH HAS BEEN OR WILL BE APPEARING IN THESE COLUMNS.

OUT OF THE 18 OFFICES USING DIFFERENT CODE HOLE POSITIONS, THERE IS POSITIVE IDENTIFICATION NOW OF SEVEN USERS AND EIGHT DIFFERENT DESIGNS ALL WITH MISSING CODE
HOLES AND MOST WITH ADDITIONAL DIE HOLES MISSING. IN MOST INSTANCES THESE EXAMPLES
WERE RESTING IN THE 'BELLEVILLE' SECTION OR UNIDENTIFIED IN THE OWNER'S COLLECTION.
THE SEVEN OFFICE DESIGNS WITH MISSING CODE HOLES THAT HAVE BEEN IDENTIFIED TO DATE
ARE AS FOLLOWS:

IN CORRESPONDENCE, MICHAEL DICKETTS AND MYSELF HAVE FOUND THIS STUDY TO ELIMINATE THE 'BELLEVILLE' EXAMPLES MOST INTRIGUING AND SATISFYING, AND WE THINK THE ABOVE LISTING WITH THE SAMPLE INDEX ATTACHED IS AN IMPRESSIVE BEGINNING. IT WILL BE INTERESTING TO SEE TOWARDS THE END OF THE STUDY IF THERE WILL BE MORE THAN A DOZEN OR SO BASIC DESIGNS TO TAKE CARE OF ALL 'BELLEVILLES' AND IF ANY REMAIN COMPLETELY ELUSIVE TO IDENTIFY. THAT IS THE CHALLENGE, AND PERRAPS A HANDBOOK NOTE TO ASSIST THIS CAUSE WILL BRING SOME NEW COLLECTORS AND IDEAS INTO THIS FIELD.

AGAIN, WILL MEMBERS PLEASE RECHECK ALL C.12'S FOR A MISSING CODE HOLE, ESPECIALLY LARGE STAMPS, MULTIPLES, COVERS, WHICH MAY NOW BE MOUNTED OR BESTING IN THEIR CORRECT IDENTIFICATION, AND OVERLOOKED FOR THIS STUDY BY REASON THAT ONE DIE PUNCH HAS THE CODE HOLE INTACT. Such a careful recheck has just turned up much needed data requested under Index No. 2, where the 'O' position hole was off the stamp as first submitted by Dave Hanes. Michael Dicketts has just submitted the fine pair with a clear 'O' hole intact as illustrated herewith under Index No.2(2). The die damage to the Ottawa design with missing Code Hole '9' and missing holes C-4-7-11 and H-2 is now positively identified and complete.

A MASTER INDEX PAGE HAS BEEN CONCEIVED FOR USE IN CO-ORDINATING A QUICK REFERENCE TO ANY MISSING CODE HOLE EXAMPLE THAT MAY TURN UP. THE ATTACHED SAMPLE PAGE SUMMARIZES THE INDEX NUMBERS ALLOCATED TO DATE, WITH THE MISSING CODE HOLE OFFICE TYPE AND OTHER DIE DAMAGE TO LETTERS. IT IS SUGGESTED THAT A LINED PAGE BE MAINTAINED TO THE RIGHT OF THIS INDEX, AND MEMBERS CAN THEMSELVES ENTER THE DIFFERENT STAMP NUMBERS AS THEY ARE REPORTED, AND OTHER RELEVANT DATA FOR UPDATING.



Missing Die Punch Holes: No.7

- (a) Code Pin '7' at position outside of C-7.
- (b) Design Pins C-4-6-7
- (c) " " H-6
- (d) " " I-1

Note: This is the second London design to surface in this study with missing code hole, and this example shows additional missing holes or damage to all three letters. Due to a completely different pattern of die punch breaks which appear unrelated to the Admiral #106 precancel reported as Index No.5, the new index number has been allocated. It will be interesting to see how early or late in stamp number design this variety will be reported.


Note: The vertical pair illustrated has been read downwards as indicated by (\(\psi\)) to arrive at above missing code and die hole positions. Should this later prove incorrect, a note will be published under Index No.8 reversing the position numbers...Does anyone by chance have a horizontal format on a large stamp or pair with one of the dies showing the 'O' position to positively, the damaged die position?



Note: Design Pins C-6-7-8-9-10 (the back of the 'C') are off the stamp, and a single unidentified stamp with similar damage or large stamps with a damaged full die should be checked. Please report such stamp number with photo to Jack Benningen for update

Note: The answer (bonanza to me) was in my old files when three years back Dave

Hanes had sent me a lot of photos of his damaged C.12 material, including the illustration at left. This stamp issued 12 years earlier than #246 clearly shows that the missing holes of Index No.6 were already missing, and in addition C-6-7-10. This rather complex damaged design of Brandon is quite distinctive and easily recognizable by absence of the 'I' and 'H'-12 holes. A number of other stamp numbers with similar die damage may now come to light for reporting under this Index No.6. Reported to Study Group Jan./34 - Submitted by Dave Hanes.

Gerald Drew-Smith, in his extensive C.12 Branch Office research, reported on opening and closing dates of each office in TOPICS, September 1969. The Brandon office was recorded from H.O. information as closed in 1935. Al Pearson, in his C.12 booklet, picked up this information and stated that the perforator was missing and perfins were being reported on issues released much later than the closing date. In his check list he records three C.12 positions on #246, four positions on #243, and on War and '54 queen issues. The above illustrated #246 bears a clear Brandon postmark. The answer to this now positive use at Brandon after the office supposedly closed is not clear, but the later stamp issues on which C.12 is recorded suggests some kind of regular if limited use, and not, in my opinion, of philatelic origin.


Note: Except for the finer appearing holes, this example is identical to #155 reported under Index No.4. There is absolutely no trace of a Code Hole '08', and the stamp previously held as a C.12 'Belleville' example has now been allocated in the Montreal Office section as C.12m.

Further reportings of different stamp numbers with exactly the same missing holes will be recorded in the Master Index and reported to Members as a note under Index No.4.

- (a) Code Pin '9' at Position outside of C-9.
- (b) C-4-7-11
- (c) H-2

Note: Under Index No.2 (Nov/83) an appeal was made for a full die punch example as it was not known whether the design Hole '0' was intact. The damaged die first submitted on #155 was slightly incomplete since the '0' design was off the stamp. The splendid example illustrated at left

now completes the study of Index No.2, and positively identifies the Ottawa office use of the missing code hole with FOUR additional missing die holes as indicated above. The very positive value of pairs and the large stamp with two die punches is again emphasized for this study.


