# THE "SUN LIFE" PERFINS THE DIFFERENT 5-DIE SUN LIFE PERFORATORS A LOOK AT THE 19 PERFORATORS USED IN CANADA by Conrad M. Tremblay

This second article will give you the opportunity to have a closer look at all the perforators used by the Sun Life Assurance Company in Canada. The punches from the various 5-pattern perforators are grouped here all together to give you the chance to check some of your stamps perfinned by this pattern. Starting by the next issue of this paper, you will have the results of the research I have done for each perforator. Also, I will reproduce for you all the slogan cancels used during that era of my study - 1930 - 1935, by each post office where these perforators were used. This later information will give you an extra tool to identify faster and more accurately a greater number of your S-11 perfins, being in many cases the only way to classify them, specially when the perfin is incomplete or show a split perforation.

The originals for the following reproductions were made from accurate vacuum—made contact prints and show clearly the true appearance of the pattern for reliable references.


The plating for 11 perforators is completed leaving unfinished the following perforators: 8, 11, 12, 13, 15, 16, 17, and 18. For the perforators used in these cities, I have shown the 5 patterns but not in the proper sequence as they appear in the perforator from left to right. However, for the perforator No. 15 and 16, the pattern shown in position 1 (on the left) belong to that position in the plating. Also for the perforator No. 18, the patterns in position 1 and 2 belong there in the plating.

Consequently, I will absolutely need your help before the plating of the last 8 perforators can be possibly completed.


Finally take note that the distance between each pattern is approximate. Only a punch from the perforator showing the 5 patterns on a strip of stamps or plain paper would give us an exact image of the spacing between them.




2 - SAINT JOHN, New Brunswick




3 - QUEBEC, Quebec




4 - TROIS-RIVIERES, Quebec












11 - WINDSOR, Ontario



How YOU can help in the Sun Life study:

- By sending a list of your S-11 holding of issues and positions

for each of the perforator.

- Where the plating is not completed, by sending for a contact print by me any of your large regular or commemorative stamps, pairs or multiples where 2 or more patterns are shown. Also of great help in many cases are the split punches showing part of 2 patterns on the small regular issues.

It is only with these on hand that I can complete the plating of the last 8 perforators. In return, it will be my pleasure to assist you with the problems you may have in identifying some of your troublesome perfins with incomplete patterns or with many holes missing, etc.

My personal thanks for those who gave me their full confidence and collaboration, namely Jean-Guy Dalpé, Jonathan Johnson and Gary Tomasson for lending me for study their collection of S-ll or all their duplicates, and of course, also to those who already sent me a list of their holdings, issues and positions of S-ll's. Note: Although the period of study for the plating of the S-ll perforators was between 1930-35, period selected from the material I had on hand, the survey and study starts with the first issue to the last.

Being in the process of reproducing all slogans I can find used on S-11 perfins on a piece or envelope, I would appreciate receiving a photocopy of the ones you may have in your collection for the benefit of all the other perfinners interested in that kind of documents.
