GTR PERFIN USED BY STEDMAN BROTHERS LTD., BRANTFORD ON

Bob Traquair enquired, in Perforator #71, as to whether or not this situation could be explained. I have a possible, if not correct, explanation based on the following.

- The GTR had a presence in Brantford as evidenced by a library book containing a photo of the station in Brantford, with this notation. "Brantford CNR station which was built circa 1904 by the old Grand Trunk Railway, which operated until its amalgamation with the CNR in 1923".

- Stedman Brothers were wholesalers of general morchandise.

- In 1920, the date of the strange usage of the GTR perfin, a dollar could purchase a considerable amount of merchandise. For example liquid ink, pen holders and pen nibs were the writing materials of the day. Wholesale prices at that time would be in the neichborhood of - bottle of ink 12¢, pen holder 3¢, pen nibs 20 for 7¢, paper clips 7¢ a box, stick files 7¢, so if office supplies were needed, GTR could get a lot for a buck.

- The GTR would no doubt bulk purchase at its head office in Nontreal and send any supplies needed to its various locations, and thus local purchases would be non existant or only by an authorized requisition from Mead Office, taking more time and trouble than it was worth to obtain.

- For every rule and regulation there is usually a way around it. I spent all my working years in the wholesale hardware business. We would sell to local offices of government departments, which had a limit on the amount that could be ordered locally. If, for example, the limit was 210.00 and the office wished to buy 15 items costing \$1.00 each, instead of retting a purchase order for \$15.00 from Head Office, they issued 2 local purchase orders, one for \$10.00 and the other for \$5.00. They had the goods they wanted instantly and not around the regulations.

- My first job in the wholesale hardware business in the late 30's was to open the mail and distribute it to the departments concerned. Sometimes it did occur when a small monthly statement was paid by cash or stamps or a combination of both. This was acceptable to the company, as after a bookkeeping entry, the stamps came back to me to use on outgoing mail.

- From the many examples that exist of the private use of company perfins, it is evident that the post office paid no attention to this practise much less a bank concerning itself about the type of stamp on cheques.

Having said all this, imagine this scenario. One of the CTR agents in Brantford, be it passenger, freight or express, with no authority to purchase locally, needs a few office supplies in a hurry. He arranges with Stedman's to purchase on a cash sale, payment being by stamps which he would no doubt have, and possibly doing so on more than one occasion. Stedman's thus had GTR perfinned stamps which they used to pay the excise tax on cheques issued, probably feeling there was less likelihood of this being noticed by a bank than the P.O. department.

The above should qualify me as a detective or fiction writer, I don't know which, if either, it would be.

CCNETITUTION

BRITISH NORTH AMERICA PHILATELIC SOCIETY PERFIN STUDY GROUP (1979)

JBJECTIVES:

(Revised 1992) approved at 1993 Study Group Meeting at Rayal York, Toranto.

To update, on an ongoing basis, the information in the current edition of the BNAPS Handbook on Canadian Perfins with the intention of eventually printing, when circumstances dictate, a revised edition.

To add information to that presently in the Perfins Handbock which is of interest to perfin collectors and other specialty fields.

To provide perfin collectors with a source where answers to Canadian perfin queries or problems may be found.

To promote perfins by assisting collectors in writing articles and perfin postal histories for philatelic journals and newspapers.

Where possible to encourage collectors to exhibit perfins at all levels of philatelic shows.

MEMBERSHIP:

Must be a member in good standing-of BNAPS.

ORGANIZATION:

Will have a two member executive - Chairman and Secretary. The members holding executive positions will be reviewed annually, at the annual BNAPS Convention, with positions being confirmed, withdrawn or appointed by a majority of the Study Group members attending. The executive has the option of appointing a Newsletter Editor and an Auctioneer, if they deem such positions advisable.

DUES:

Each member upon joining the Study Group will pay an entrance fee, equal to the current year's annual dues, to the secretary. Annual dues will be set by the executive to cover expenses incurred by the Study Group, which are primarily costs related to the printing and mailing of the Perforator. Dues will not be set in such a way that a large credit will be built up in the name of the Study Group.

AFFINITY WITH OTHER PHILATELIC SOCIETIES:

Will be in contact with other Philatelic Societies and their members, in the Study Group's name, to achieve the objectives listed above. The Study Group will accept research assistance from members of other Philatelic Societies. Whenever possible these people will be encouraged to join BNAPS and the Study Group, officially.

EXECUTIVE RESPONSIBILITY:

The secretary controls the funds, held to cover operating expenses, and records and files of the study group. Both the chairman and the secretary will jointly direct the activities of the Study Group, and either may correspond with third parties regarding Study Group business. 


