Trading Perfins - A Proposal

This idea may not be new, and it may not work, but here it is, perhaps members can react to it, with the view of either rejecting, changing or improving it.

Say I have a "D" perfin (rarity factor), that I wish to trade since it is one of my duplicates.

My trading partner has no "D" perfins which I need, but has many "E" factor perfins. Would it not make sense to trade one "D" perfin for three "E" perfins? Yes you say, but what about catalogue value? Well, catalogue prices themselves reflect relative rarity. So, a "D" factor with a catalogue value of \$3.00 would be traded for three "E" factor perfins each worth \$3.00 in catalogue value. Or, a "D" factor with a catalogue value of \$1.00 would be traded for one "E" factor perfin with a value of \$3.00.

Say I have an "A" factor perfin which I wish to trade away. I should receive in return three "B", nine "C" or 27 "D" perfins. As you know, each letter reflects a step up of a factor of approximately 3, all catalogue values being equal.



During the BNAPS convention in Toronto last year I had the pleasure of meeting Jon Johnson and several other members of our Study Group for the first time.


After the 2 hour session that our Study Group had, I introduced myself to Jon and asked him what the largest multiple of the O7 5 Hole "OH/MS" was that he had seen.

After his reply of 15, I showed him this illustrated multiple of 30. I bought this on a Business Trip to British Columbia in 1990. Note that it includes 6 complete impressions of the 5-Die setting.

He commented that it was now the largest block he had seen and that it appeared to be genuine.

It is on the 3 cent George VI (Scott #233) and is dated Victoria, B.C. April 14, 1940.

I am proud of this piece and was able to share it with the group this month because we had an unused page in the Perforator.

PERFIN STUDY GROUP AUCTION No. 8

Welcome to the 8th auction of the club.

6 consignors offering 444 lots of which 133 are illustrated to help you evaluate the item. A full description of the lots is given, including the perfin factor (PF), the condition of the punch (pattern), the stamp and the cancel if not average. Special cancels are also noted. They explain the higher estimate or reserve price asked.

Starting with this auction, 204 lots from a large collection of perfins are offered. They all have a PF (perfin factor) between "C" to "F". Between 200 and 300 lots from that collection will be offered for sale in each of the following auctions. Several good or rare items can be found. Check carefilly every lot!

The lots photographed are:

- All the double or multiple punches, regardless of value;
- All lots with an estimate or reserve value of 5\$ or more;
- All the covers, postcards and perfins on pieces. These lots are reduce in size to 50% to save space.

No bid will be accepted under the reserve (R) value, but are accepted lower bids on lots with an estimate (E) value given by the consignor or by me. Bids lower then 75% of the estimate value will be declined.

Kindly bid by lot number in 10ℓ increments below a dollar and 25ℓ increments otherwise. Successful bids will be 10% above the next highest bid, rounded up according to the above increments. The Study Group will charge a 10% commission only on lots sold, payable by the consignor.

Successful bidders will be notified by mail. The stamps will be forwarded on receipt of funds. All lots with a 100\$ value or more will be sent by registered mail. Mailing cost will be paid by the bidder.
