Wally Guzman's "Perfin Memories" reminded me of an older type TV program that used to end with these words or similar - there are a million stories out in the city and this is one of them. We can say that there are many stories out there in the perfin world and Wally's was just one of them. I'm sure other members of our group also have interesting stories and we would like to see them in the Perforator.

At BNAPS94, during the Study Group Officers seminar (I don't know how many or who attended) it was suggested that each Study Group promote itself by entering a one frame display relative to its specialization. Without any further input from Study Group's not represented, this suggestion has become a fact. I feel this concept was rushed for BNAPS95 as the mechanics of getting a display together needs more time and study than is available. If, for example, a Study Group member(s) enters a competitive display, then a Study Group display is not really needed, but if a Study Group display is entered by what means does the Study Group give its approval as to its appropriateness etc. Further, if a member prepares a one frame display for the Study Group, he might as well take it one step further and make it a 2 frame display and enter it in competition. Regardless of my personal opinion, here are the details.

One frame of 16 pages 8 1/2 x 11 size, exhibiting material relative to our Study Group, with the idea of disseminating information of what can be collected in that particular area. One, two, or up to sixteen members can put together

a frame. These frames will not be judged in the traditional way but voted upon by attenders of the convention. A prize, not specified, will be awarded the exhibit voted most popular. The \$10.00 entry fee will be paid by the Study Group. Deadline for entries is May 15th, which I feel may have some leeway. If there are any takers, please get in touch with me as soon as possible to see what can be worked out. (Ed. Note: This newsletter will only be mailed on May 15th, so I hope we do get some leeway.)

Although the Perforator is only bi-monthly or so, there is a great deal of activity, behind the scenes so to speak. Steven and I correspond on the average of once a week on Study Group business, and I am in frequent contact with Conrad and Patrick. Other members also get in touch with us. Barry Senior of Terrace Bay ON who has a special interest in NFLD perfins had offered to update that survey not knowing it was Russ Deveau's intention to do so. Offers of help are few and far between and it is particularly unfortunate when we cannot accept them. Peter McCarthy of Richmond PQ sent me his file of correspondence, back about 10 years, that he had with the CNR in Winnipeg and Edmonton in regard to their perforators, which moved me to write the Systems Controller, Winnipeg, to see if the whereabouts or the fate of the C45 machine could be ascertained. No reply to date.

Garvin Lohman of San Francisco CA had difficulty with Canada Post in delivering his dues to Steven so he sent them to me, which gave me the opportunity to bore Garvin with a one page letter. Ray Skrepnek of Fairview AB had purchased 07 - 256 and 264 coil and wondered if they were genuine. He was referred to a person more knowledgeable than myself on OHMS's for an opinion. Conrad Tremblay was contacted by a widow seeking advice as to the disposition of her late husband's USA collection. And so it goes.

From time to time we have published an index to the Perforator, and our last index brought us up to the end of 1988. Would someone please volunteer to prepare an index from January 1, 1989 to December 31, 1994, and let me know.

Steven mentioned in one of his letters to me that through the excellent effort of Conrad, our actions are more frequent, have more lots, and raise more money than those of the Perfins Club in the USA. While on this subject, Conrad wondered seeing that he was receiving an increase in lots to sell and that bidders were increasing and prices realized were good, if auctions should be more frequent. My reply was - go for it - and if Study Group members objected, we would probably hear from them.

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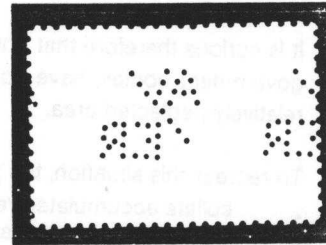

A relatively common American perfin pattern has recently been discovered on a Canadian stamp. The American pattern is number A287 "AY/ER" (note the spelling is not AYRE) and is on an unused 2¢ 1927 Confederation stamp.

This stamp, found in Southern Ontario, may have been removed from a business-reply envelope.

Australian Tribute to Joe Purcell

Steven Koning recently acquired a copy of the new Australian Perfin Catalogue and noticed in the Forward, a fine tribute to one of our deceased members, Joe Purcell. Joe was one of the founding members of our reformed and current Study Group. He co-ordinated and tabulated the survey forms, starting back in 1980, that contributed much of the information incorporated in the 4th edition of our Handbook. He was also our Secretary from late 1982 until his passing early in 1986. The aforementioned Forward is reproduced in its entirety below.

FOREWORD AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

The study of commercial perfins is an aspect of the history of postal usage which focusses on a security measure employed by major users of the postal system. The one thing shared by perfin users was that each was a sufficiently large user of the postal system to warrant the protection of their stamp stocks through the puncturing of identifying initials or insignia.

In all Australian colonies prior to Federation, and later in the Commonwealth period, perfin users were required by the various postal administrations to obtain official approval to the puncturing of stamps. Legislation, regulations and administrative instructions governing the use of perfins have remained continuously in force over the period 1884 to the present day.

It is curious therefore that until recent times, Australian perfins, particularly those used by non-government bodies, have not enjoyed any serious attention from philatelists and have been a relatively neglected area.

To redress this situation, the purpose of this book is to:

- . collate accumulated research efforts;
- . stimulate further research into commercial perfins; and
- . establish a system of reference numbers with which to facilitate further research.

We wish to record at the outset that the information contained in this book is not solely our own work. In fact, the book has a long history.

The credit for commencing a systematic listing of Australian commercial perfins lies with a Canadian, Mr Joe Purcell, now deceased. In collaboration with other Canadian philatelists, Mr Purcell produced approximately 100 pages of research notes including illustrations and technical details. These notes were based in large part on the Australian perfin collection of Mr Ed Williams of New York. Those research notes, while now somewhat dated, have been the foundation work for this book and without them, the book would have been considerably less complete.

Once the Purcell research notes had been completed, they were passed to Dr Derek Pocock of Perth, W.A., who over a period of years was the focus of further research efforts by perfin collectors and who commenced the laborious task of editing Mr Purcell's notes with a view to the production of this book. In time, the accumulated research efforts were provided by Dr Pocock to us, to see through the book to its completion. We wish to place on record our deep appreciation of his work and our thanks for his advice, encouragement and forbearance as the book has progressed.

It would be remiss if we did not also acknowledge the *Perfin Club of New Zealand and Australia* and the editor of its Bulletin, Mr D W Andersen of Sydney. The Club was formed in 1986 and now, apart from its excellent quarterly Bulletin which co-ordinates on-going research, it boasts an active exchange circuit and over 100 members in Australia, New Zealand and further afield. We wish to acknowledge the considerable advice and assistance of Mr Andersen in the production of this book and our use of the Club Bulletin as a key reference source.
