Now that I have cleared my conscience, I can get on with the job at hand.



The Chairman's Chatter

BNAPEX 95

I enjoyed attending the convention in Edmonton where I was able to renew acquaintances with Study Group members who I had previously met and to also meet several to whom I had not previously had the pleasure of speaking. It was great to see Barry Clarke there all the way from New Zealand. Was able to get some good perfin from two dealers who I knew casually yet who are not known for having this type of material. Just goes to prove the old saying - seek and ye shall find.

Entered a 4 frame 64 page perfin display just rambling across the whole perfin spectrum. The display frames were quite a contrast to the ones used in Vancouver that only held 6 pages. The frames used in Edmonton would appear to be the latest and most up to date for philatelic use with ultimate security but rather difficult to access when setting up and taking down a display. They are hinged at the top and a special support rod has to be used when open as the cover forms a canopy under which you work. They seemed very new and I would say very expensive.

After the exhibits were judged, which was certainly not rushed indicating careful consideration by the jury, I viewed each one, not only as a display but also from a statistical point of view. There were a total of 35 exhibits receiving the following medals:

Gold	8
Vermeil	10
Silver	8
Silver-Bronze	8
Bronze	1

The displays were made up as follows:

Mostly Covers	23
Mostly Stamps	10
Half & Half	2

Only one stamp exhibit received a gold and that was revenues. There seems to be a swing away from the display of stamps only to displays that require covers.

At the critique, each display was dealt with by one of the judges in the order in which they were printed in the show booklet. Possibly the concluding remarks by the Jury Chairman summed it all up. The medals awarded at this show by this jury are by their considered judgement, however at another show at another place by another jury, the same displays might receive the same, a higher or a lower medal.

I noticed in the January-March 1996 edition of BNAPortraitS that new guidelines for exhibiting and judging material have been approved, so maybe the judging in the future will be less of a subjective matter. I also feel that the more perfins are displayed the more recognized our specialization will become.

My awards. A BNAPS Vermeil medal and the American Association of Philatelic Exhibitors gold pin Award of Honour for Creativity in Philatelic Exhibiting. If I ever get the 8¢ registered letter stamp perforated I1, the display might move up a notch.

FOLLOW UP

This is an update regarding the suggestions made at our Study Group meeting in Edmonton.

- The revision has started to the current edition of the Perfin handbook in preparation for printing of the 5th Edition. This will take time.
- I have asked Patrick to do whatever he can to expedite delivery of the Perforator, containing auctions, to far away places.
- Jon Johnson wrote to our President in regard to the suggestion for a joint meeting with the Perfins Club at BNAPEX96, and he has approved.

- Conrad Tremblay has sent me interesting copies of 2 pages of a survey he started in 1979 listing all perfins that have become known to him, by type, by catalogue number, and by position. This could be the basis for the listing that I mentioned at our annual meeting.
- The Guide to Perfin Exhibiting prepared by the Perfins Club has been circulated as was suggested. See page 3 of BNAPortraitS whole number 8. Steve Koning ordered a number of copies which are available to members upon request.

BNAPEX96

Jon Johnson will be attending and he has agreed to chair the Perfin Seminar and Annual meeting and will also set the date and time for same.

Not only that, he has offered to make a presentation on perfins, the exact nature of which he has yet to determine. As if all this wasn't enough, Jon will contact the Perfins Club to ascertain what arrangements can be made with them for a joint meeting. Thanks Jon.

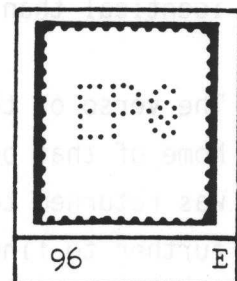

New Pattern

Barry Senior recently sent me a photocopy of a stamp that one of his U.S. trading partners had in his "unidentified pile". The stamp is the 2¢ red admiral (Scott #106) with the letters "EPC(o)".

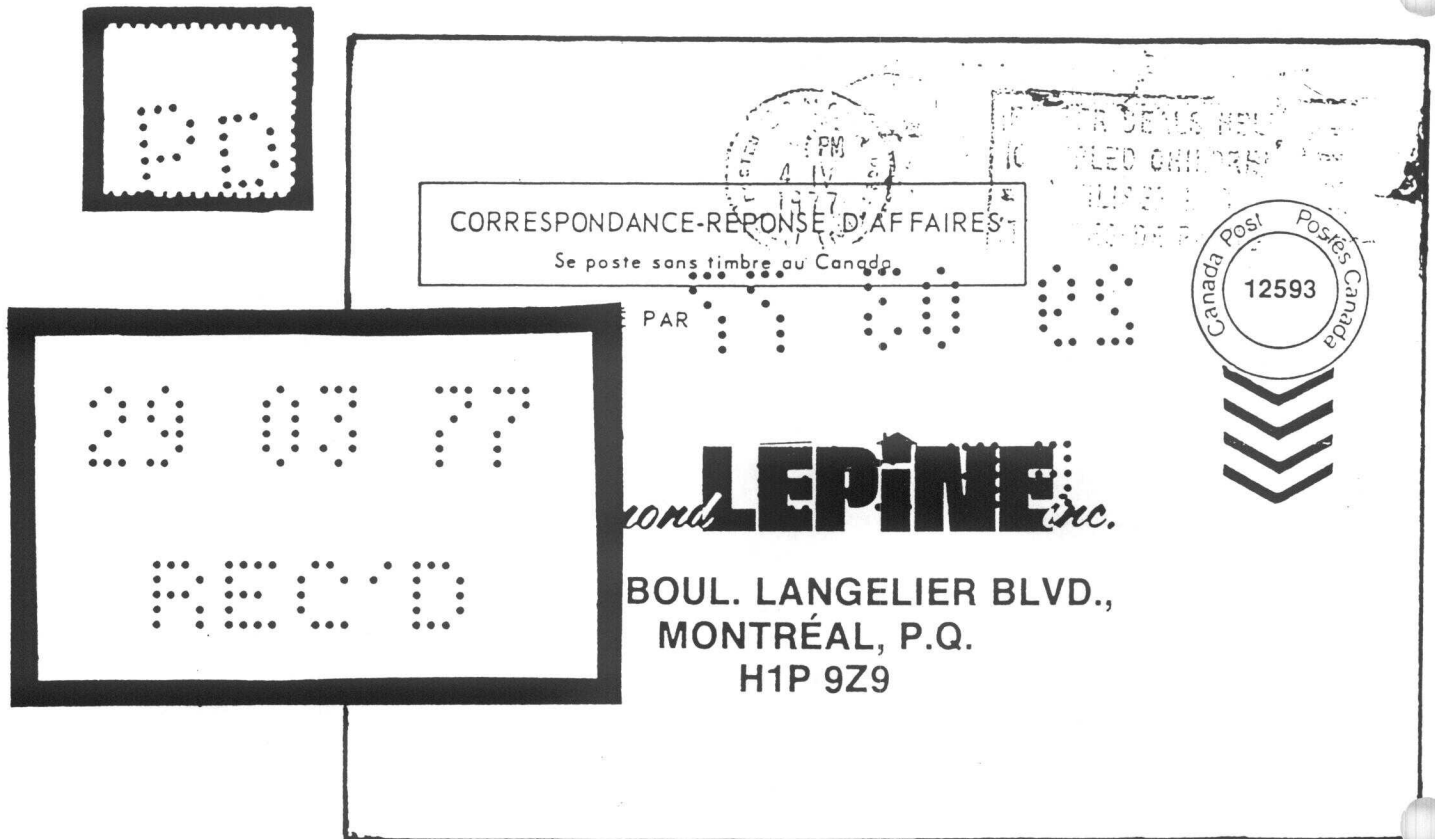
According to the U.S. perfin catalogue it is from the Eagle Pencil Company of New York and is listed as Pattern E96. According to Barry it has already received the Canadian pattern E8. (Although Jon Johnson has not confirmed this). Barry also indicated that his U.S. trading partner wanted it back (much to Barry's disappointment.)

Anyhow, a reproduction of the stamp is below as well as a copy from the U.S. catalog illustrating the E96 contact photo.



My answer to Steve Koning's article "STUMP'D" in the last Perforator.

At first, I had the same reaction as Steve, but digging thru my revenues, I found a couple examples of that square "D" punch.

The first one I found (illustrated above) the same type of his square "D" preceded by a larger "P" - Could it be an abbreviation of a PAID punch or one used by Parke Davies ...?

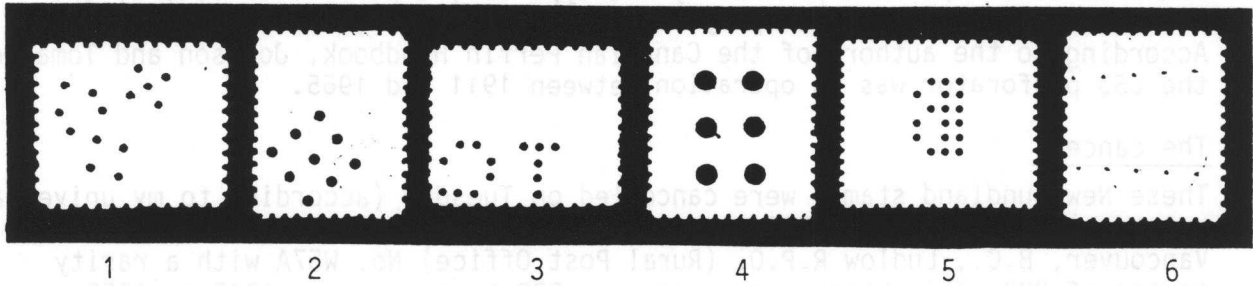
Then my research paid off - I found the return postcard illustrated above issued by a plumbing and heating firm offering a free price list of their products for their retail and wholesale business. The size of the "D" is identical than Steve's and both are obviously a RECEIVED punch.

The verso of the postcard shows a Chateaugay, Quebec address, most likely the home of that punch perforator. The punched date is April 29 1977 and the card was returned to Lepine on May 4. Unfortunately, I never pushed my curiosity further to find out what company owned that perforator, but eventually, I will make an attempt to locate that company, with time and God helping!

WHAT ARE THEY?

In the December edition of the "Perforator", on page 11, I noticed (like many other collectors) a "Snowflake" punch listed. It would greatly be appreciated if this punch could be reproduced in the Perforator for the benefit of all of us.

While going through my revenues in search of different punches, I pulled out of the dust stamps that did not see the light for at least 20 years and for some of them, I certainly would appreciate help to identify the company using those perforators.



The No. 1 seems to be a Kodak type - it looks like the figure 8 followed by 5 dots often seen after a number. Any opinion?

The No. 2 was used on a wide range of issues - both on revenues and on regular. Here is what I found:

Four different war tax revenues (1¢ value to 50¢).

One inland excise tax, a \$1.00 value.

Three excise tax, two leaf-type, from 2 to 10¢.

One on 1937 George VI issue No. 233,

and finally one on Ontario Law stamp (R68) a 2\$ value.

Could this law stamp unveil the home of that perforator?

The No. 3 and 4 are on excise revenue stamps.

The No. 5 - IB initials - are on the regular animal issues (1987-91): No. 1156, 1158, 1172 and on the 40 and 42¢ coils

The No. 6 is on No. 233. It is the second such perforated stamp I see with two rows of well organized pin holes. Very intriguing.

Any information concerning these punches will be appreciated by all of us. Your help will make this field of collecting more interesting and challenging in a constant search of the unknown... I hope.

GREAT TRAVELLERS AND FREE-LOADERS

The stamps:

In 1941, these 5¢ stamps (Scott catalogue No. 257) were the second regular issue in use in Newfoundland until June 23, 1947 when a new 5¢ stamp was used to commemorate the 450th anniversary when Jean Cabot named the island Newfoundland.

The perfin:

These three stamps were punched by the type C53, a perforator used by the Canadian Pacific Railway Company located in Vancouver, British Columbia. According to the authors of the Canadian Perfin Handbook, Johnson and Tomasson, the C53 perforator was in operation between 1911 and 1965.

The cancel:

These Newfoundland stamps were cancelled on Tuesday (according to my universal calendar) September 30, 1952 on a train following the route No. 11 from Hope to Vancouver, B.C., Ludlow R.P.O. (Rural Post Office) No. W57A with a rarity factor of 220. This hammer was used on a CPR train between 1947 to 1953.



Rarity of this strip:

To this date, only one other strip of three is known. It is the Newfoundland No. 270 perforated by the style T13 (TRAV) as illustrated in the "Perforator" No. 59 - Volume 9, No. 4. With these stamps illustrated above cancelled in 1952, we now have the latest known cancel on a Newfoundland stamp used in Canada.

Their long trip:

The happy trio left the herd of caribous living on the Island and travelled on the main land after their former country joined the other Canadian provinces on April 1st, 1949. After that historical date, no other Newfoundland issue was printed. However, their postage stamps were still valid to be used anywhere within Canada.

In conclusion:

This inseparable trio made a memorable trip: they travelled from the most North-Eastern Island (Newfoundland) to the most South-Western Island (Vancouver). Diagonally, it is quite a distance for caribous to travel - freely - by boats, by train or on foot - real free-loaders! And that makes me wonder: where were they hiding during that three-year period - 1949, when the last stamp was printed in Newfoundland and 1952 when they were used British Columbia? We may never know!

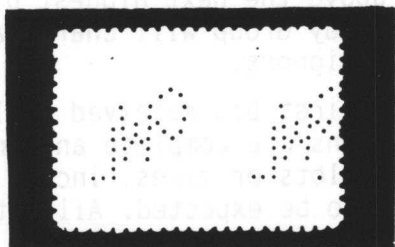

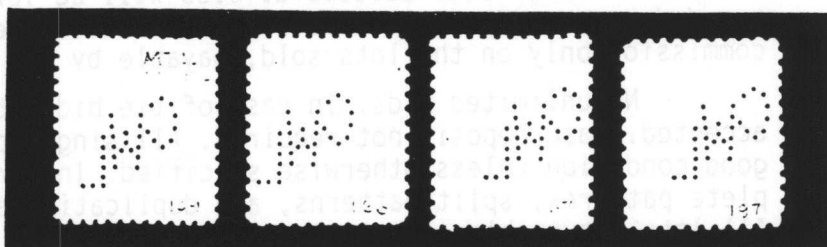
G17 or G20 ???

Last summer, I bought two collections of perfins from the Great-West Life Assurance Co., the G17 and G20 designs, mainly for two different reasons other than to add few new issues or positions to my collection:

- G20: I was looking for a large stamp with two complete punches - one design without the code hole (illustration 1). I had aside a small collection of G17 with a Montreal cancel (illustration 2) instead of a Winnipeg cancel where the perforator was located. Furthermore, they all had the same and only pin missing in the "G" and without the code hole, of course, illustration No.3.

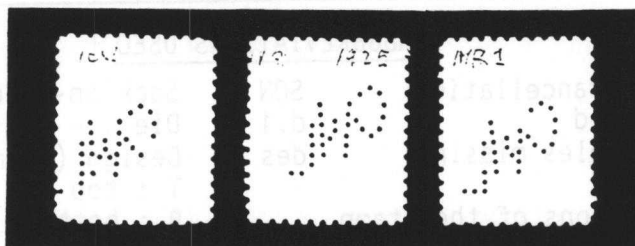

The illustration #1 is the Scott No. 155, the 10¢ from the regular 1928-29 scroll series. The Montreal cancels could look like ill.#3, circular with a duplex figure or number inside, or a large magenta cancel from the Union Bank branch located in Montreal. It could also be a Montreal roller or a slogan in french.

- G17: This perforator was located in Winnipeg, Manitoba and the designs of the 10-die perforator had no code hole. It was used between 1913 and 1950 - years with the earliest and latest cancel.

Care must be taken for the proper identification of the G20 pattern with a missing code pin (ill.#3) and the patterns in the ill.#4, all G17, all with a similar "G" with a pin hole missing, but with at least one extra hole missing in each letter of the design.
