Internet sales of perfins, namely on e-bay (since I don't visit other sites - no time!), are on the rise. Just a word of caution, since many sellers of perfins are not familiar with perfins and if you like complete patterns only, ask the condition of the stamp before bidding to avoid disappointment.

NEWFOUNDLAND PERFIN SURVEY

The intent of this survey was to try and compile a list of perfins known on stamps of Newfoundland or used by businesses in Newfoundland prior to Confederation. The scope is limited to the following patterns:

A3 - Anglo Newfoundland Development Company

A8 - Ayre and Sons Ltd.

A9 - Ayre and Sons Ltd &

G5 - George Knowling Ltd.

Other perfin patterns are known on Newfoundland stamps but in my opinion these all (except pattern B7) occurred after April 1, 1949 when Newfoundland became a Province of Canada. At that time the remaining post office stocks in Newfoundland were distributed throughout Canada. Some of these issues are known to have been used well into the 1950's. This survey will not deal with cancellation perfins such as "CANL'D/C.S.O." and "C.H." found primarily on Newfoundland Revenues but also on some postal issues as well.


This report furthers a previous survey published in volume 16, Number 1 - Whole Number 92 of The BNA Perforator on March 26, 1995. That report was compiled by Russell Deveau and dealt with information supplied by 113 collectors in the late 1980's. All I have done here is list any additional positions or issues brought to light since that time. I have also revised the list of

known covers and perfins on revenue documents as well as early and late reported dates of usage.

The ERD for A8 is now November 21, 1925 on a blue Ayre and Sons advertising envelope. The ERD for A9 is February 23, 1925 on a revenue document. The LRD for G5 is October 3, 1922 on a postcard to England.

One item of interest is a piece of cover with an A8 SC# 164 and an A9 SC# 145 both tied with a date of August 19, 1929. This is the only item reported with the two Ayre types on the same piece.






Ever since the 4th edition of the Perfin Handbook came out and listed the above item, I have tried in vain to acquire it, but never saw it in an auction or for sale. The closest I cam was several years back while attending a stamp show in Regina. A dealer was there from Ontario and he had a couple of QV Jubilees with the S13 perfin, which took my fancy, and in the process of conversation, he asked if I was interested in the I1-F2 perfin and I said yes. He said he had one on cover and if I wrote to him for a quotation he would give me one. I wrote and when I got the reply, I immediately lost interest in the cover, as his price was \$2,750.00 - no error in the decimal place. Even if this was the only such cover in existence, and I don't think it is, the price seemed grossly over-inflated. Years went by and one day, much to my surprise, I received the above perfin on approval at 10% of the price on the cover, so I went for it and fulfilled a fifteen-year dream!

QUESTIONS

This was a question posed in the last issue of the Perforator, and below it, is an answer:

"Here is a copy of GB cat. no. 112, 1½p, cancelled by London hooded circle, Dec. 11, 1897. The perfin is PL/LD, number 2990.01, (<u>Tomkins Catalogue of Identified G.B. Perfins</u>, 7th Edition). The cancel does not appear to be faded in any way and the violet portion of the printing is missing. Even if this was treated chemically to remove the violet portion of the printing, how is it that green is still intact, and barely faded?"





Answer:

"Nearly all British stamps between 1d and 2s6d in value, issued between 1883 and 1910, were printed partly or entirely in doubly fugitive ink. This special ink, which could only be produced in purple or dull green, was designed to fade if the stamp was tampered with. The purpose was to prevent removal of cancellations but water and sunlight can fade these inks very badly. I suspect that the stamp illustrated has simply had the purple ink faded out. This would not affect the ordinary ink of the green part of the design or the indelible ink of the postmark.

The dull green fugitive ink used on some other values fades even worse, and many of the 2d values of this issue have pale yellow-green frames.

I hope this information helps."

No unlimited bids. In case of tie bids, the first bid received will be accepted. Cash deposit no required. All single perfins are complete and in good condition unless otherwise specified. In larger lots or mixes, incomplete patterns, split patterns, and duplication are to be expected. All lots returnable if not described, **EXCEPT**, large lots or mixes. Lots must be paid for or returned within **THREE** (3) days of receipt.

Successful bidders will be notified by mail. All lots with a \$100.00 value or more will be sent by registered mail. Mailing cost will be paid by the buyer. Bid by lot number.
