## Anglo- Newfoundland Development Company - Pattern A3

The Anglo Newfoundland Development Company came about as a result of the Harmsworth Brothers and associates need to ensure another supply of printing paper for their newspaper, the London Daily Mail. In the event of a European war they were fearful of losing their current supply of newsprint from Scandinavia and Finland.

The Harmsworth Brothers decided to construct a pulp and paper mill in Newfoundland. Grand Falls was chosen as the site. It was only a few miles from the railroad, twenty miles from a deep water harbor and was on the bank of a river with the largest water shed in Newfoundland. Pulpwood from the territory above the site could be driven down river with very little expense. The manufactured pulp and paper could be shipped by water from Botwood or via rail to an ice free port during the winter period.

The Anglo Newfoundland Development Company Limited was incorporated at St. John's on January 7, 1905 and was approved by the legislature of Newfoundland on June 13, 1905. The first shipment of paper from the new mill was produced in December 1909 and was transported by the Newfoundland Railway to Heart's Content, Trinity Bay to be sent to England.

In April 1961 the merger of the A.N.D. Company and Price Brothers and Company Limited took place and as a result the name was changed to Price Pulp and Paper Limited on April 29, 1965. In 1975 Abitibi Price Company acquired controlling interest in the Price Company and in 1980 the name of the company was changed to Abitibi Price. The Company is now known as Abitibi Consolidated.

## Ayre and Sons Limited - Patterns A8 and A9

The beginning of the Ayre & Sons Limited occurred in 1859 when Charles Robert Ayre opened a store on Water Street in St. John's. Three years later he joined Alexander Marshall and formed a new company, known as Ayre and Marshall. They operated as importers and wholesale and retail provision merchants. In 1884 Marshall retired and three of Ayre's sons, John Bray, Frederick William and Robert Chesley took over in his place and the name of the business was changed to Ayre and Sons. Upon Charles Robert Ayre's death in 1889 a fourth son, Charles Pascoe, entered the business.

A few years later the four brothers began expanding the business, opening a department store in St. John's and beginning a mail-order service for clients outside the city, while continuing to operate a wholesale service. During the Great Fire of 1892 their premises were destroyed but soon after a temporary building was constructed and within two years the company opened a large new store on Water Street.

In 1903 Robert Chesley Ayre died and the company became known as Ayre and Sons Limited. In the next thirty years the company opened a five-storey building in which hardware, groceries, stationery, books and other retail departments were housed. They acquired a third building, adjoining their older store, which allowed them to expand other retail departments.

By the late 1930s the second generation of directors had died and the company was being managed by grandsons and great-grandsons of the founder.

This was the period which saw the most prolific use of the Ayre perforators as they were phased out in the 1940's with the coming of Postal Meters and Confederation with Canada.

Wally is a long time member of the BNAPS Perfins Study Group as his name appears as a contributor to the second edition of the Perfin Handbook issued in 1961.

In the letter from Wally he states that he has greatly enjoyed being a member of the Study Group over the past years although he didn't always find time to take part in various studies. He also said that perfins continue to rise in popularity, a fact that pleases him greatly as he will soon dispose of his collection.

Welcome to the 19th PSG Auction.

You will find 310 lots with many issues never seen. This is the 3rd portion of four from Albert Aldrich perfin collection. This auction is a great source of Winnipeg tagged. Do not miss this opportunity.

Usually, all the lots with an estimate or reserve value of 10\$ or more are photographed, and they are reduced to 50% to save space. But not this time. Too many lots would have to be illustrated. I selected only the perfins which I couldn't describe perfectly, as double punch, or high values...

Important notice: the estimated values I inserted only represent a selling price based on several factors like - perfin factor or quantities in circulation of that perfin, the stamp and the cancel condition, the period of usage, the growing demand for perfins and also the increasing number of perfins collectors. But remember: the starting bid is always 75% of the estimated value, unless the lot has a Reserved asking price which becomes the starting bid. That's what I meant in the pass when I wrote "Bids lower than 75% of the estimate value will be decline". Take advantage of that starting bid if you thing you may have a chance to buy that lot at that low price...

Kindly bid by lot number in 10¢ increments below a dollar and 25¢ increments otherwise. Successful bids will be 10% above the next highest bid, rounded up according to the above increments. The Study Group will charge a 10% commission only on the lots sold, payable by the consignors.

No unlimited bids. In case of tie bids, the first bid received will be accepted. Cash deposit not required. All single perfins are complete and in good condition unless otherwise specified. In larger lots or mixes, incomplete patterns, split patterns, and duplication are to be expected. All lots returnable if not as described, EXCEPT, large lots or mixes. Lots must be paid for or returned within THREE (3) days of receipt.

Successful bidders will be notified by mail. All lots with a 100\$ value or more will be sent by registered mail. Mailing cost will be paid by the buyer. Bid by lot number.

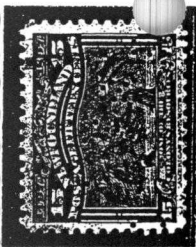

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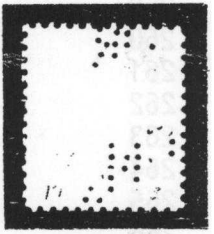

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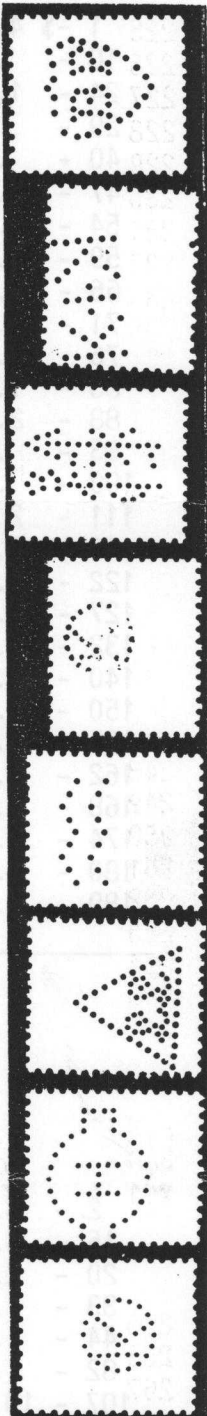
