COLLECTING THE 10C SMALL QUEEN PRECANCEL

I have started to put together a more specialised collection of the 10c small queen precancels and would appreciate information from other collectors on any different shades or precancel style/type they may have on this stamp. I would like to purchase or trade for any that I don't have and would also like to obtain more examples of the pitted "o" variety. Some of the stamps came from the Lussey sales and from the Reiche collection but the majority were bought at Robert Lee auction sales in Vernon over the last few years and are from the Bowen collection.

There are 35 listings of the 10¢ small queen in the *Standard Precancel Catalogue*. (45 is red brown shade and 45a is dull rose shade.)

The following items were sold at Robert Lee auctions from the Bowen collection Auction 98 listed as rose pink not dull rose, A45a-D, J45a, J45a-D, J45a-VD, R45a, R45a-D, R45a-V, S45a, T45a, T-45a-D. Also included were S45b salmon, T45b-V salmon, T-45 brick brown, T-45-D brick brown Auction 100, Listed as pink 45b, J45b-D, R45b, R45b-V, S45b, S45b-D, T45b-V.

Many of the unlisted shades were sold along with the more common shades and for those fortunate enough to be on the floor the difference was obvious. I

agree with the argument that you can't include all shades in the precancel catalogue listings and it is better to write an article for the newsletter for anyone interested to follow up on. However in the case of the 15c large Queen where Scott has a major listing of 29 (Grey Violet) and 30 (Grey many shades.) I think we need to seriously consider changing the listings. I have several examples of what is obviously the blue grev shade but there is no listing in the catalogue.

It is not possible to show the different shades of the 10c or 15c in a newsletter but I will bring them to BNAPS in Ottawa for anyone interested to have a look at during the study group meeting

A NEW RESEARCH EFFORT

Recently, I have been attracted to some of the covers sold through eBay and have bought a few. In turn, this led to looking at stocks of postal history at a couple of recent Bourses where I also bought a few. Oh, I guess I should have started by saying that the covers all have precancels and most also have corner advertising. But I guess that is probably obvious to anyone reading this.

Today, I signed on to the precancel section of eBay and there was another cover, this time with a newspaper corner ad from Halifax. This started me thinking about Norm Wagner's interest in the companies that used precancels and the stories behind them. In turn, I began to wonder how many different companies have used precancels in their

mailings over the years and THIS REALLY GOT ME STARTED down a new direction.

I wonder if it would be practical to compile a list of companies whose name has appeared as corner advertising on precancel covers?

I know, I know, the number must be tremendous. But you could break it down based on the stamp used or the type of precancel or the location or even the time period if it was shown somehow. I'll bet that a few individuals who also wondered if it would be possible to accomplish something started the current listings of slogan cancels.

Keeping track of the results shouldn't be too difficult as

the data could be entered on a spreadsheet, which some day might lead to some form of printing if you wanted a hard copy. It would probably be just as easy to keep it in digitized form because the cost of distributing the results on a CD is not very high.

Is the information available? I should think so as most of us have some precancel covers lying around. Gathering the data might be a little tougher, but that is what research is all about, isn't it?

In any case, I think that I will put together a simple spreadsheet and fill it in with the info that I have on hand. I will post the result on our Web Site and ask our members to add data from their holdings. And let's see where this leads us.

As far as technology goes, I have Quattro Pro 9, Microsoft Excel, LOTUS 123 release 5. and Microsoft Works installed on my computer. I don't know if these can be opened by each other and I am not knowledgeable enough to know which program would be the most available and used by our members. Perhaps you could advise me on this aspect. Personally, I like Quattro the best, but there isn't really much to choose between them all.

Anyway, at this point I am just throwing the ball up in the air. Who wants to take a crack at getting involved? Best regards.

Editors Note: I believe that there is a way of opening all of the formats in Microsoft Excel, but the opposite is not necessarily true.



BRANTFORD 3-105 SHEET REVISITED ... AGAIN

Bruce Field's article on Brantford 3-105 sheet revisited made the observation 'if this plate is found to have been used to print the medallion issue, it would be almost certain that only one plate was used to print the Brantford type 3 precancels." I went through my duplicates of Brantford 3-195 and was able to send Bruce a copy that confirms the same plate was used to print the medallions.

I also went through my variety collection and found the following examples of the use of a plate over an extended period of time. Montreal Style 4 (shown from top to bottom, left to right), Admiral 4-105 dies 1 and 2, 4-112, Scroll 4-149, 4-150, Leaf 4-162.

RARE OR UNUSUAL PRECANCELS

Shown here are some of examples of some rare and/or unusual precancels.

Hans Reiche stated that the Carlton Place, 1-196, missing city name, was from plate 1 LL position 73 to 78. (Figure 1)


These three examples on **W-162** clearly show that the stamps were printed both normally and inverted. Since it is normally not possible to tell when a bar style has been inverted, no attempt is made to say which one of the pair is inverted. (Figure 2)

The Carlton Place, 1-163 missing province, is one of three known copies. (Figure 3)

195 missing town name. (Figure 4) (I think this is probably the previously unrecorded Hamilton style!!! But I was unable to persuade Norm Wagner to pay the appropriate price for such a rarity.)

This is an extremely rare cover as it is one of the two known copies of **Peterboro 1-105-ID**. (Figure 5 shows a closeup of the stamp.)

The Montreal stamp (Figure 6) is interesting. It was probably the caused by underinking. There is a faint trace of the start of the Q where the province name should be.
