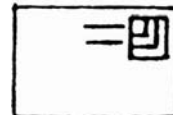

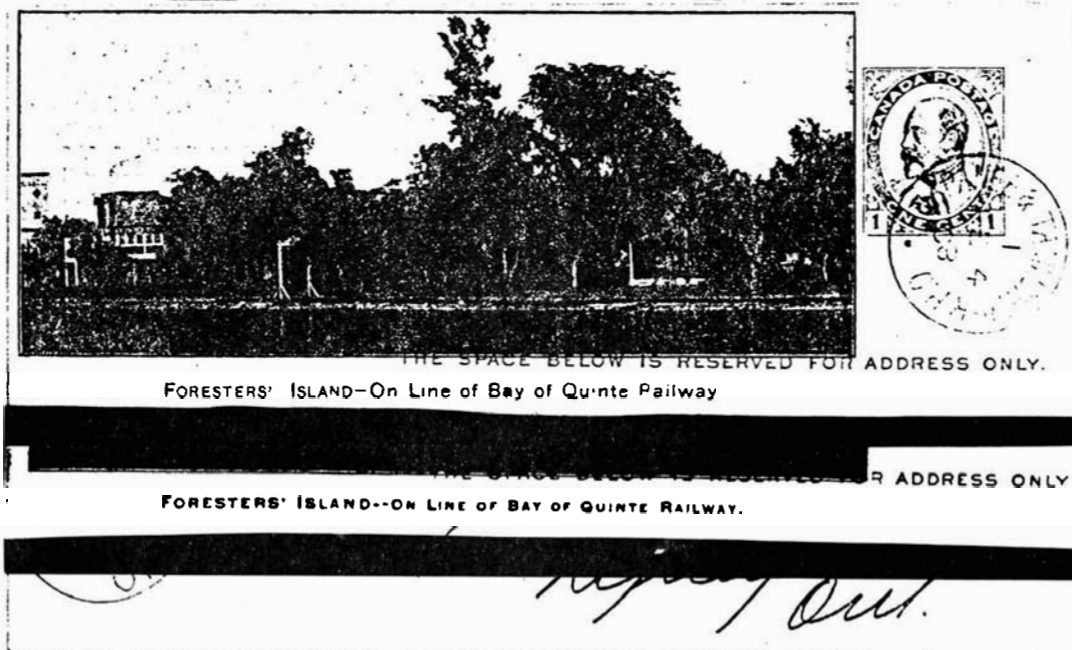
## THE RAILWAY PICTORIAL POST CARDS - LESS COMMON VIEWS AND VARIETIES

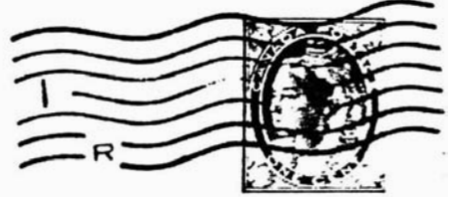
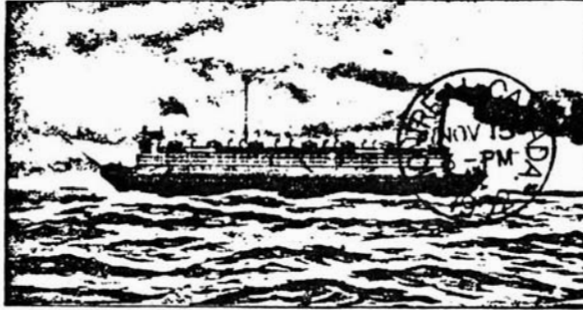

SETTING VARIETY ON OFFICIAL PICTORIAL POST CARD 55

Erick Middleton recently sent photocopies of two copies of one of the sepia official pictorial post cards (1932 series). The card is number 55, "Rideau Canal along Driveway, Ottawa, Canada". Although the printing of the text appears to be the same for the two copies, the number, "55", is in a different position and is in a different typeface on the two cards. Has anyone else found similar varieties on other cards of this series? Would any members who own one of the presentation booklets for this series please check to see which variety is found there.



SCOTT SPECIALIZED - STILL A PROBLEM FOR THE STATIONERY COLLECTOR

I normally wouldn't have gone out of my way to flail again at the stationery listings presented in the "Scott 1985 Specialized Catalogue of Canadian Stamps and Covers". I feel that a fairly thorough job was done in my letter to the editor of BNA Topics (Nov. - Dec. 1982) concerning the 1983 edition (see also PSN Vol. 2, pg. 7). The 1985 edition, except

for some cosmetic changes, is identical to the 1983 version. However, the new publisher and Canadian distributor, Unitrade Associates, kindly sent me a complimentary copy, obviously with the hope and expectation it would be reviewed in Postal Stationery Notes.

I grant that the wrappers and post bands have been separated from the envelopes (as in the 1984 edition), however, the numbers are completely non-consecutive for these items (they are the same as in the 1983 edition when the wrappers and post bands were mixed in with the envelopes). The numbering errors and pricing errors (including essentially all of the typographical errors) remain untouched. New discoveries (as reported in the 1983 Webb's catalogue and in PSN) are still unlisted. Even the new printings of the 32¢ envelopes do not appear. Prices are the same as in the original edition, ignoring market trends completely. The aerogrammes remain unlisted as do the letter cards. Newfoundland stationery does not appear. No one at Scott seemed to have any knowledge about BNA postal stationery whatsoever. What was worse from the collector's point of view was that no one at Scott even seemed to care. It is a pity. If the section on stationery had been reasonably well done, it might have encouraged more interest in that area of philately. As it stands, it is fortunate the post-Victorian listings are so badly mangled that few dealers have been tempted to try and use the Scott Specialized for pricing Canadian stationery.

Now the catalogue has a new publisher. We can only hope that once the deficiencies have been pointed out to the Unitrade, this firm will make an effort to have the postal stationery section rewritten by someone who knows something about the topic.

#### 1ST KARSH AND WILDING ISSUE PROOFS

Earle Covert recently furnished photocopies of some proofs from the collection of the National Postal Museum. First, there are four pieces for the 1st Karsh issue:

3¢ ("8955 Red")	marked "Approved ... 6 Nov 53"
3¢ ("8955 Red")	"Approved ... 23 Nov 1953"
2¢ ("51 Green")	"Approved ... 23 Nov 1953"
4¢ ("294 Purple")	"Approved ... 17 Feb 1954".

Second, there are three more pieces for the 1st Karsh issue:

2¢	marked "approved ... 17 Dec 53"
5¢ and 4¢	"approved ... 22 Jan 1954"
5¢ and 4¢	" <u>approved</u> for colour and printing ... Jan. 1954".

The disruption caused by the anticipated rate changes on April 1, 1954 is evident from the early approval of the 2¢ and 3¢ values and the later approval of the 4¢ and 5¢ values (of course 3¢ cards were prepared, but only issued after revaluation to 4¢). The 5¢ proofs, at least, must refer to the envelopes as there was no need for a 5¢ card, nor was one issued.

A third set of pieces is related to the 2¢ Wilding (1954) issue:

- 1) the central portion of the design showing the Queen's portrait and marked for minor corrections
- 2) a similar piece marked "approved ... 11 July 1954"
- 3) a full stamp impression marked "Approved for denomination ... 12 July 1954"
- 4) a full impression marked "Approved but not for colour ... 14 July 1954".

All of the above pieces (except for the first of the Wilding pieces) are marked with a handstamp reading "DIRECTOR OF FINANCIAL SERVICES".

ADMIRAL HEADING ESSAYS ???

Webb P27 is not a common card. Recently two copies were offered for sale, and these are shown below. There is no printing on the cards whatsoever except for the pseudo-(Webb)-type-8 headings. At BNAPEX Horace Harrison was able to show me three similar copies of P27. None was identical to the cards shown. Two bore the same crests. All had a similar print style. The copy without the crest had apparently been purchased a fair time ago, the other two about a year ago. Horace feels that these cards were prepared as heading essays for the Admiral Issue, and this certainly seems to be a reasonable explanation. Does anyone else have examples of similar cards?

Two questions arise here. First when was the heading B7 replaced by B8 ? Does P47a exist with heading B8 or P54a with B7 ? Secondly, is it possible to further narrow down the date at which heading B3 replaced heading B2 ?

#### A NEW REFERENCE BOOK - YET MORE ON THE BONNINGTON

In PSN Vol. 3, pg. 17,30 the identity of the vessel shown on the current #10 envelope (misidentified on the envelope as the Bonnington) was discussed. John Aitken reports a new book has been printed entitled "Sternwheelers and Steam Tugs. An Illustrated History of the Canadian Pacific Railway's British Columbia Lake and River Service". The book was written by Robert D. Turner, curator of the B.C. Provincial Museum, and published by SONO NIS Press, 1745 Blanchard St., Victoria B.C. V8W 2J8.

The vessel shown on the #10 envelope is essentially identical to the line diagram of the "Okanagan" shown in the book, but the figures showing the

Bonnington and the Rossland are considerably different. Apparently the Okanagan had a sister ship, the Kustanook, and the design of both these ships was based on the design of the Rossland. If permission is obtained from the publisher, it may be possible to show reproduce the relevant figures from the book in a future issue of PSN.
