2nd issue 1955 - 1¢ brown - 2¢ green - 5¢ blue - 10¢ orange - 25¢ yellow
50¢ vermillion - \$1 light rose - \$1 deep rose - \$2 olive.

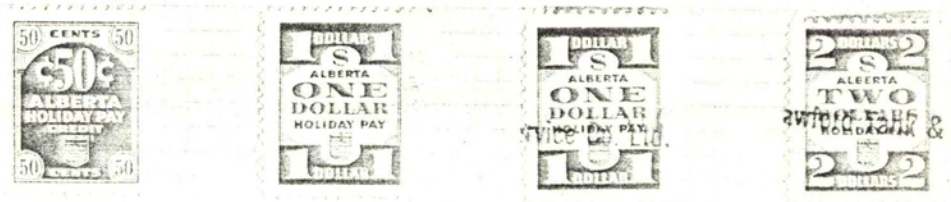
