THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES CONVERSATION STAMPS

These six stamps were designed by Dr. Rowan who also designed the 1955 Whooping Crane Postage Stamp. The issue stemmed from Dr. Rowan's interest in wildlife research in the Prairie Provinces - he had hoped that the sale of the stamps would support a major research project.

The stamps were distributed by the 'Game Department' through the various outlets for hunting licenses. However, most hunters bought only one stamp and the project did not generate the hoped for income.

Shortly after Dr. Rowan's death in 1957, The Edmonton BNAPS Group obtained the balance of these issues. They are now available for purchase at \$1 for the complete set of six stamps. They may be obtained from Keith Spencer, 10631 - 148st., Edmonton T5N 3G9. Proceeds from the sale of these stamps will help finance the 1977 convention of BNAPS which is to be held in Edmonton.

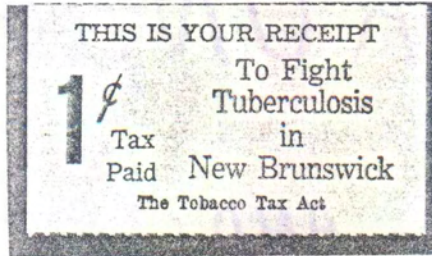
FOREWORD

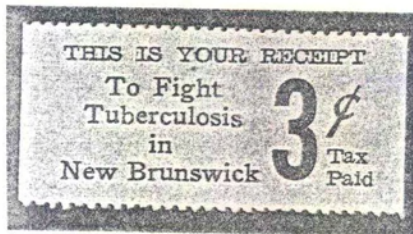
