

Watermarked copies exist and are worth 3 times those without. Complete booklet panes are worth 5 times singles. Prices are for single stamps.

P. E. I. Tobacco Taxx Stamps exist with various size roulettes. There are often different size roulettes in one booklet pane. Space does not permit a list of them.
