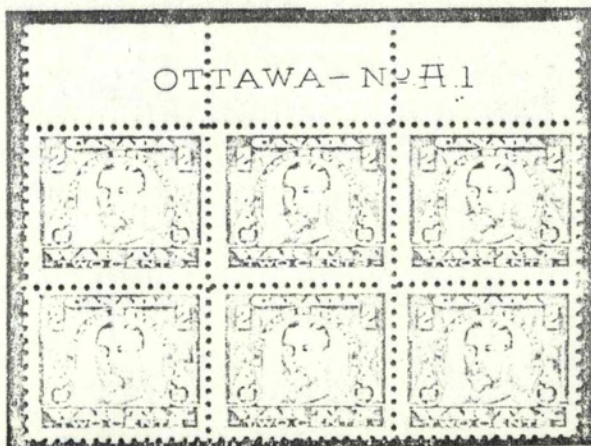


Plate blocks show:
