CONSULAR FEE (1949)

- Unwatermarked, white wove paper
- Perforated 12
- Used at Consular Offices overseas, in payment of fees for special services.



Cancellations are usually the large circular, one ring or double ring, consular office handstamp, quite attractive, and showing the office location.

CONSULAR FEE STAMPS - DISCONTINUANCE

MANUAL OF CONSULAR INSTRUCTIONS, CHAPTER 8.

The decision has been taken to discontinue the use of consular fee stamps. The new procedure will make use of the Official Receipt, Form EXT 25, for receipt, accounting and return purposes. The procedure is detailed in Chapter 8 (Sections 8.10.3 to 8.10.6) of the Manual of Consular Instructions. Chapter 8 is being promulgated as part of Amendment List 4 to the CI Manual and this Amendment List is being forwarded simultaneously with this document and also with an initial supply of the new forms required, as follows:

EXT 119, Fee Received - Consular Service Held in Abeyance
EXT 430, Passport Inventory and Record of Issues
EXT 765, Register of Passport Services

Additional supplies of these forms will be available from the Department of Supplies and Services and should be requisitioned in the usual manner.

2. The following steps are to be taken to effect the change-over to the new procedure:

- (a) The use of fee stamps and the procedure involved is to cease at midnight, October 31, 1971.
- (b) Implementation of the new procedure is to start the following day, November 1, 1971.
- (c) All unused stamps are to be accounted for and returned to the Department, Attention: ARFC.
- (d) Existing stocks of the following forms are to be destroyed at the post:
 - EXT 113, Requisition for Consular Fee Stamps
 - EXT 190, Statement of Consular Fee Stamps Affixed to Documents
 - EXT 119, /Eng. (Rev. 10/64) Temporary Cash Blotter
 - EXT 765E, Monthly Return of Consular Services
 - EXT 430, (5/69) Inventory of Passports and Consular Fee Stamps.

3. It is hoped that the new system will simplify the work and save time in our Consular activities. Following implementation, we would welcome your comments on the new procedure; they should be addressed to Consular Division.

4. Revision of the schedules of notarial, miscellaneous and merchant shipping fees is under consideration. The present schedules will continue in force until further notice.
