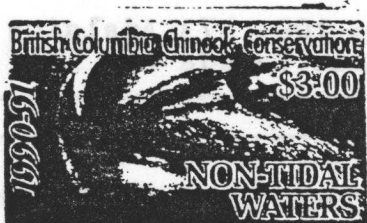

# 1868 THIRD ISSUE BILL STAMPS - EARLY USAGES

The Official Issue date for the stamps is recorded as April 1, 1868 but much earlier dates are known for all values. This also holds true for the stamps which were overprinted N.S. for exclusive use in Nova Scotia. Zaluski has documented that the contract for the printing of the stamps was signed on February 8, 1868 but actual usage proves that the stamps had been prepared prior to that date, as evidenced by a Halifax, Nova Scotia document. A 6¢ stamp, on another page, carries a very clear handstruck date of February 1, 1868 by the Bank of B.N.A. Toronto. I do not consider this to be conclusive proof that the stamps were available on that date as a clerk may have used an instrument on which the date had remained unchanged for several days. All specimens which appear on this page are on the "PELURE" paper.

# 1868 THIRD ISSUE BILL STAMPS - EARLY USAGES.

The dollar values are seldom found with early dates and this may be due, in part, to remainders of the Second Bill Issue being used up. It is a possibility that the \$2.00 & \$3.00 values may not have been distributed until some time in 1870. Here again all specimens shown on this page are on "PELURE" paper.
