VERTICALLY IMPERFORATED \$3.00 1895 ELECTRIC LIGHT CONFIRMED

Thanks again to Harry Lussey for his contribution of the attached article which proves the existence of at least a part perforated sheet of the \$3.00 1895 Electric Light Inspection Stamp, FE 13. The single example in my collection is number 19002 which was also cancelled in Regma, Sask at approximately the same time as the Lussey strip. Does anyone have 19001 or 19003 to sell?

ELECTRIC LIGHT INSPECTION - 1895 CROWN TYPE.

At last this Issue has a "Ranity". It is a reconstructed strip of three from a sheet which was, at least partially, imperforate Vertically. These had been on a certificate issued July 30, 1918 in Regina Sask. By arranging the stamps according to the Control numbers it was possible to reconstruct the strip. A document with a strip of four accompanies the part perf piece. A millimeter gauge showed it was exactly 68mm from the Left outer frame line on #19048 to the Right outer frame line on #19050. Making similar reasurements on stamps \$18517-8-9 in the strip of four, also on stamps #18518-9-20, it was also found to be exactly 68mm. This is rather conclusive proof that the strip is from a part perf sheet. I wonder how many single stamps have been destroyed as being "Clipped" and therefore defective!!
