CURRENT CIGARETTE EXCISE DUTY STRIP STAMPS C.D. Ryan

Illustrated below are some of the excise duty strip stamps currently used on packages of cigarettes. In order to detect packages smuggled from other provinces and the United States most provinces require the use of a distinctive colour for the duty stamps used within their jurisdiction. This has been made necessary by substantial differences in the tax rates applied at provincial, state, and national levels.

Two types of excise duty strip stamps have been seen by this writer. Domestic and American manufacturers use stamps which are printed on the cellophane tear strip (Figure 1). At least one importer of small volume foreign brands applies a self-adhesive stamp over the cellophane packaging (Figure 2).

ADDITIONAL EXAMPLES OF RARE INSPECTION STAMPS C.D. Ryan & M. Woike

Mervin Woike has submitted colour photocopies of some inspection stamps from his collection. The first item (Figure 1) is the second reported example of a low number (00108), non-denominated weights and measures stamp (van Dam's FWM 33). Woike's stamp has no gum and bears a smudged "cancelled" overprint in purple. Due to the indistinct nature of the cancel, no assignment can be made as per Lussey's article in the Second Quarter 1995 issue of *BNA Topics* (Vol. 52, #2, pp. 21-23). Given the 10-across sheet format suggested by Angst in the September 1995 *Newsletter* (#8, p. 2) (and, by this writer's extension, a 50-on sheet size), Woike's stamp would have come from the same sheet as the item held by Angst (serial number 00131).

The remaining stamps (Figure 2) consist of additional examples of the vertically imperforated \$10 electric light stamps (van Dam's FE 7a). These stamps came from the same sheet as those illustrated by Lussey in the May 1994 Newsletter (#4, p. 2). As with Lussey's stamps, Woike's were used at Regina, Saskatchewan in mid-1918 — Woike's June 7th, Lussey's July 30th. Woike reports that he purchased his stamps a few years ago as part of an accumulation/collection. The previous owner had purchased the set of four stamps from K. Bileski of Winnipeg. From other Bileski material in the accumulation it appears that this previous sale had occurred sometime in the mid to late 1960s.

The tally thus far for FE 7a is: Angst 19002; Woike 19020, 19021, 19022, and 19023; Lussey 19048, 19049, and 19050.

PART 3: The Weights and Measures Inspection Divisions of 1876 along with their Respective Deputy Inspectors

The first date given for each of the Divisions listed below is the date upon which the office commenced its inspection duties. In some instances different documents give different dates for certain Divisions. This discrepancy is indicated by the placement of an "or" between the two dates. In such situations the second date is that given by the later document and as such may have been a correction to the earlier document.

Exceptions to this rule concerning the first dates occur where the operational dates fell within the July 1877/June 1878 fiscal year. Official documents do not give dates in these cases and thus the words "post Jun 1877" have been used. Another exception occurs with British Columbia whose Deputy Inspector was not appointed until September 16th, 1878. Once again the documents do not give an operational date for this office.

Dates subsequent to the operational date of individual Divisions represent:

- the appointment of an additional or a replacement Deputy Inspector to a Division already in operation, or;
- the last day of Deputy Inspectors whose employment was terminated prior to June 30th, 1879.

The second of the above cases is represented in the listing by the word "to" between the starting and final dates of the officer.

These Deputy Inspectors were to be monitored by an Inspector assigned to each province. However, by the time of the 1879 suspension and reorganization of the inspection service, such Inspectors had been assigned only to Ontario and Quebec.

Unless otherwise specified, the employment of the Deputy Inspectors ended on June 30th, 1879. Only ten of these officers were reappointed as Inspectors or Assistant Inspectors under the terms of the Act of 1879. These individuals are marked with an asterisk (*) or, where a delay occurred in their reappointment, a double asterisk (**).

In some cases different documents give different initials for a particular Deputy Inspector. In such situations both sets of initials are given.

PART 4: The Weights and Measures Inspection Districts of 1879 along with their Respective Inspectors and Assistants

This part lists the Inspectors and Assistant Inspectors for each of the **Inspection Districts** established under the provisions of the Act of 1879. The operational date given after the name of each District applies, unless otherwise noted, to all of the officers listed for that District. The significance of the other dates is indicated by the following code:

"st" — The day upon which an officer was first employed. This may or may not have been the date on which his inspection duties began.

"ut" — The last day of the officer's employment.

"mv" — The last day on which the officer worked in a District before being transferred to the second District named.

"fr" — The first day on which an officer worked in a District after being transferred from the second District named.

"pr" — The last date on which an officer worked as a Assistant Inspector, or the first date as an Inspector, as a result of a promotion.

"ac" — Acting Inspector.

The period covered by the listing is 1879 through June 30th, 1897. In mid-1897 a reorganization occurred and several of the smaller Districts were absorbed into the larger Districts. The weights and measures inspection officers after 1897 will be detailed in a later part of this work.
