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Dear Fellow Slogan Cancel Collector:

We are fortunate to have articles about the earliest slogans and about the most recent slogans. Our editor, Dan Rosenblat, proposes a radical new approach to the 1919 victory bond slogans. Dan would appreciate receiving your comments/critique of the article (address on masthead). Member Cecil Coutts provides an article on the British Columbia inkjet slogans. Non-member, Joel Weiner who belongs to a computerized network of inkjet cancel collectors, provides us with a listing of all the inkjet slogans from Provinces other than British Columbia. The inkjet cancel collectors have developed their own numbering system which is used by Dr. Weiner.

While we do not have any new members to record in this issue of the Slogan Box, I would like to recognize a member whom I omitted in the listings in the last two issues, George Dresser of College Station, Texas. George, welcome.

*I am sad to report the recent passing of Allan Steinhart. Allan was a former member of the Slogan Study Group. dealer in postal history and philatelic author. He will be sorely missed.*

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For a Canadian slogan collector, 1919 may be the most interesting single year of slogan activity. Not only were the majority of the International machines, used since 1902, replaced by Universal machines, obsoleting almost all slogan dies used in the 1912-early 1919 period, but also the use of government fund appeal slogans was very massive, extending far beyond their pioneer appearance as the 1917-18 Flags.

Documentation for the period is sketchy, but with the help of Sessions' "Early Rapid Canceling Machines of Canada", a survey of the machines available in early 1919 can be listed. Sessions lists non slogan use of an I and a U machine at CAMP BORDEN in 1916-17, but use of any kind in 1919 appears unlikely, as the Camp was probably closed after the war ended, so this office is omitted from the 1919 usage listing. What appears as correct is that in early 1919 a total of 64 offices had machines, 52 with I machines only, nine with U machines only and three with both types. The exact number of available machines cannot be determined, but multi die usage at the major offices in this period indicates that there must have been a minimum of 77, of which 65 were Internationals and 12 were experimental Universals.

The major usage of most of these machines in the first half of 1919 was with dies of English slogan B-790 - 895, BUY WAR SAVINGS STAMPS AND HELP RECONSTRUCTION, and a single die of the French wording as slogan A-20 - 27, used at TROIS RIVIERES. Of the 64 offices with machines, 49 used the slogan, 44 using English version I dies, six using English version U dies (OTTAWA using both types) and TROIS RIVIERES using the sole French version I die. Fourteen offices with machines were omitted from the usage, oddly including such relatively large offices as BELLEVILLE, BROCKVILLE, NIAGARA FALLS, PETERBOROUGH, PORT ARTHUR and ST. CATHARINES, together with eight minor offices. The dies employed for these slogans were 53 English I dies, one French I die and seven English U dies.

It does not appear that continuous use of these dies in early 1919 was much disrupted, as not too many other slogans were employed in this period. The exceptions appears to have been the following. PRINCE ALBERT's single I machine used the PRINCE ALBERT EXHIBITION Flag during the month of June, SASKATOON's single early U machine used the SASKATOON INDUSTRIAL EXHIBITION Flag from mid-May to mid-July, CALGARY's single I machine used the CALGARY EXHIBITION from mid-May to early July. As of this writing, no BWS use has been recorded from these offices during the periods indicated.

In early June of 1919, for unclear reasons, the Post Office Dept. became totally dissatisfied with the International Co., and replaced all but four I machines in small offices (possibly Post Master owned) with largely Universals, but also some Columbia machines, the latter never before having been used in Canada. These Columbias were, for the most part, replaced shortly by Universals, possibly because Columbia slogan dies could only be manufactured by the Columbia Co. in the U.S., at a cost much higher than that charged by Pritchard & Andrews, and with a much longer interval between ordering and delivery. Another explanation may be that not enough Universals could be supplied to complete the transition in mid-1919.

In the course of this conversion, significant changes occurred, not only in the types of the machines, but also in the number of offices having machines. Seven offices, including two MONTREAL sub-offices and EDMONTON's STRATHCONA sub-office, were issued machines for the first time, four with Universals and three with Columbias, bringing the number of machine equipped offices to 71, if the two MONTREAL and one EDMONTON sub-offices are considered as separate, otherwise the total was 68.

Forty-three I machine offices converted to U's, eight converted to C's and four retained their I's. Six of nine offices with U machines are known to have converted to newer U machines, but OTTAWA appears to have retained its original U machine while giving up the I machine. For the other two offices with early U machines, it cannot be determined if they were retained or replaced by newer models. Thus, by mid-1919 there were 71 offices or sub-offices with machines, 55 with U's, 12 C's and four still with I's.

This conversion had a major impact on the late 1919 use of the BWS slogan, which continued to be the major slogan employed at the time. Due to the additional offices with machines, use increased from 49 offices using English dies to 54 offices, with TROIS RIVIERES again using a French only version. Also, the number of machine equipped offices not using this slogan was reduced from 17 to 16, but still excluded the major offices that had been omitted in early 1919.

Since postally advertised local events tended to increase in the fall over those in the spring, use of the BWS dies was somewhat disrupted by these in the later part of the year, to the following extent. CALGARY's single U machine used the VICTORY STAMPEDE from mid-July to the end of August and the ALBERTA WINTER FAIR in late Nov.-early Dec., COBOURG's single I machine used the HORSE SHOW in July-Aug., FORT WILLIAM's FALL FAIR had early September use, KINGSTON's single U machine used the INDUSTRIAL EXHIBITION in Aug.-Sept., LONDON's single U machine used the WESTERN FAIR from late July to mid-Sept., possibly delaying the introduction of the BWS slogan until late Sept., NEW WESTMINSTER's single U machine used the PROVINCIAL EXHIBITION in late Sept.-early Oct., use of the replacement C die of PRINCE ALBERT's EXHIBITION in its single C machine throughout July probably delayed use of its BWS C die until August, REGINA's single U machine used the PROVINCIAL EXHIBITION in early August,

Although TORONTO normally devoted its five U machines for BWS use, this use must have been entirely eliminated during the Aug. 9-Sep 6 period, when all five machines advertised the CNE, and no BWS use in that period has been seen. TROIS RIVIERES use of the all-French U version of BWS must have been interrupted by advertising for the ST. LAURENT EXPOSITION in the July 11-Aug. 23 period, though impressions of the French version are so scarce that Sep. 18 is the only date recorded.

VANCOUVER's three U machines normally used two for BWS, but as two dies are recorded for a VANCOUVER FAIR in July-Sep, at least one BWS die was withdrawn in that period. VICTORIA's single U machine advertised a HOME PRODUCTS FAIR in Aug. 28-Sept. 27, and no BWS use is recorded in that period.

In addition to disruption of BWS use by proprietary slogans, there was also use of a multi office slogan C-1130 -1744, CLEAN UP! FIRE PREVENTION DAY, in early October at nine offices, but they all had more than one machine except CALGARY, CHARLOTTETOWN, HALIFAX and REGINA. Since CHARLOTTETOWN did not use BWS, the disruption would have been only briefly at three offices.

There are three interesting instances of the occasional use of replaced daters and dies after the conversion to U machines. It has to be assumed that in two cases the new U machine malfunctioned for short periods, and that the replaced I machine had not yet been actually returned to the leasing company, so the I machine still on hand was pressed into service until repairs to the U machine had been effected. These instances are the following. ST. THOMAS I use has been seen on July 31, 1919, 28 days after the earliest recorded U use of July 3 at that office. STRATFORD I use has been seen on August 8 and again on August 16, 1919, a month after the earliest recorded U use of July 6 at that office. The third instance, at KINGSTON, is discussed below.

In the Oct. 15-Nov. 15 period, there was revived postal advertising for Victory Bonds, originated with the 1918 Flags, and these obviously had unqualified priority over any conflicting use of BWS for this one month period. Oddly, a single Victory Bond wording was not employed, but rather the use was divided into five different English wordings, plus five different all-French wordings, the latter used only at three offices in the province of Quebec, although other Quebec offices used the English versions.

There are some unclear Victory Bonds proofs in the Pritchard & Andrews proof material, which give no indication of the eventual issue, and there are no receipt impressions, so the only official documentation are the Distribution Lists, which give some indication of issue, although they were maintained in a rather slovenly fashion in this period. Relatively unreliable sources are the Proulx Catalogue, a January 1920 report by the International Postmark Society, illustrated in Issue 36, which is clearly incomplete, and the reports of the Slogan Study Group of CPSGB, which have been found to be at times very misleading. The only truly reliable source is the listing of material seen, based on John Robertson's article in Issue 36.

Based largely on these sources, a rather massive usage pattern evolved, predicated on the concept that the many single machine offices, reported by unreliable sources as having used two or more of the five English versions, must have alternated use of dies during the one month period. The Editor accepted this premise in his various published works, and Cecil Coutts accepted it in his new Catalogue, so it has had general credence for some time. However, the seeds for the earliest doubts of its validity were sowed in John Robertson's article, which indicated that there were at least 29 offices, reported as using more than one English version, but where dates have been recorded for one slogan only, or for neither of the two reported.

The Editor had pointed this out to Robertson in late 1994, thought it to be very strange, but did not follow up on it. However, he recently remounted his Victory Bonds holdings, and was shocked by the number of blank spaces, left for missing items, in what he thought was a fairly comprehensive collection. There is no point in detailing the rather complex process of reasoning and research of all the various sources mentioned above that followed, but the results are positive and somewhat dramatic.

It can now be definitively established that no one-machine office used more than one version, so there was no alternating use by these offices, and the number of actual usages of the English versions has been reduced from 108 to 74, used at 67 offices. This was 13 more than the 54 offices that had been using the BWS slogan in early October, and actually represented all the machine equipped offices at the time, with the exception of the four minor offices had still had I machines. This suggests that these Victory Bonds slogans were considered so important that they approached a saturation of the postal advertising capability.

Additionally, it can now be established that only six offices, all with multiple machines, used more than one of the versions. EDMONTON used two, one at the Strathcona sub-office, VANCOUVER used two, OTTAWA used three, WINNIPEG and TORONTO each used four. The MONTREAL Head Office used four of the five French versions (QUEBEC using the other) and three of the English, while the MONTREAL sub-office B used a French version and the C used an English version.

It can be noted that the Distribution Lists, while suspect in many ways, at least were correct in that they never indicated issue of two versions to a single machine office, but on occasion listed the wrong version.

The real culprit for the original overstated usage appears to have been, with apologies to our current valued member, Len Harris, his Slogan Study Group of CPSGB. Harris has informed the Editor that when he was compiling these reports from the sixteen members of the Study Group, he did not consider himself expert enough to question any report, so each was included in the published material without any attempt at verification. Under these circumstances, it is understandable that single reports were given as much stature as multiple reports, so considerable error could be expected. There is good reason to believe that Proulx copied these grossly exaggerated Victory Bonds reports, and therefore his Catalogue gave credence to what became an unfortunately incorrect legend.

There is now only one French version that had not been seen or reliably reported, the MONTREAL Head Office use of L-125 - 5295, and three of the English versions, MONTREAL STA. C use of B-775 - 893, the ST. HYACINTHE use of V-110 - 9966 and WINNIPEG use of L-230 - 5430.. In the case of WINNIPEG, which had four machines, one of these using Victory Bonds must have been withdrawn in early November to accommodate use of the FIRE PREVENTION WEEK slogan, and this may account for the scarcity of the L-230 - 5430 use. In any event, the rarity factor of these Victory Bonds usages will require revision.

As to the one single machine office that has been reported as using two VB slogans, KITCHENER is confirmed as using B-775 - 893, but there is only one report indicating use of B-770 - 892 on Oct. 18. It seems certain that this report is an error.

It can be noted that almost all of the offices which had been using BWS in early October were issued the priority Victory Bonds slogans for use beginning Oct. 15, so they had to retire their BWS dies for a month while using the Victory Bonds dies. The exceptions were COBOURG and GANANOQUE, which still retained I machines, for which there were no Victory Bonds dies. Therefore, there is no BWS usage recorded between Oct. 15 and Nov. 15, except from these two offices and one more.

A BWS impression has been recorded at KINGSTON on Oct. 20, but it is overlapping revived usage of KINGSTON's early 1919 U machine, which had been replaced by a new U machine in mid year. It can therefore be assumed that KINGSTON's new U machine was using B-775 - 893 in late October, but since the old U machine was still at hand, the Postmaster resourcefully decided not to give up BWS use, but rather to continue it with the early 1919 U machine and die.

An interesting question pertains to the use of these slogans at TRURO, which converted from I to C use in mid-1919. The office had used an I die of BWS in early 1919, replaced by a C die. In mid-Oct. The office was issued a C die of slogan B-775 - 893 to replace its BWS use until mid Nov., and this has been recorded on Oct. 27 and Nov. 11. However, TRURO is known to have had 1919 use of the earliest Poppy Day slogan, W-45 - 10350, WEAR A FLANDERS POPPY ON ARMISTICE DAY, one of only a very few Columbia proprietary dies ever issued. While its period of use is not clearly established, something in the area of Nov. 1-10 would appear as reasonable, but this would have briefly eliminated the VB use, until actually recorded on Nov. 11.

Possibly the Canadian Legion already had enough influence at this early date to convince the Postal Authorities that a Poppy Day slogan could briefly take priority over the VB slogans, and its use was permitted from early November to Nov. 10, with the VB slogan use resumed on Nov. 11.

Since it is now clear that the late 1919 usage of the BWS slogans was frequently interrupted for considerable periods, this factor should be considered in any attempt to determine a rarity or monetary factor concerning their use.

Detailed revised reports of the BWS and the Victory Bonds slogans follow.

Editor's note: Since completing this article, Bob Thorne has kindly forwarded photos of non slogan machine use in 1915-17 by three offices not previously known to have had machines in 1919, FORT FRANCES in 1915, PICTON in 1916 and YORKTON in 1917. All three have the province at the bottom of the dater, and therefore appear to have been Universal machines. This alters some of the statistical data in the article regarding the number of machine equipped offices in 1919, but oddly none of the three appear to have used either BWS or the Victory Bonds slogans, so that portion of the data relating to slogan use is still correct.

It is somewhat surprising that the number of experimental U machines operating prior to mid-1919 now appears to have been at least 12, and it is also surprising that experimental use should have been undertaken in so many smaller offices. However, it does suggest that the P.O. had been dissatisfied with the International machines for some time before they were eliminated in mid-1919.

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# BRITISH COLUMBIA SPRAY-ON SLOGANS

The introduction in 1993 of jet spray printing equipment to Optical Character Readers has given an entirely new look to slogans. At a time when slogans were slowly disappearing, new life has been injected into this specialized collecting field.

It is not necessary to go into great detail on the mechanics of the printers. Suffice to say that each printer has four or five heads located at fixed distances upwards from the base, to accommodate envelopes of various sizes. Each head will normally spray one or two lines of text. (See catalogue number C-1737 for a three line format.) Not all heads are necessarily programmed at the same time, and varieties will occur.

Well-known postal history buffs Bill Topping and Ken Barlow of the British Columbia Postal History Study Group have given jet spray cancels close attention since the first days of introduction at the Vancouver and Victoria Mail Processing Plants. Their efforts should be made available to slogan collectors and accordingly, List #1 is presented.
