This subject was very extensively covered in Issue 38, but enough new data is now available to warrant a revision, although it would be preferable that the revision be much shorter than the original. This has been accomplished in several ways, including omission of the prior considerable amount of illustrations, but also by eliminating a number of the slogans included. It is now considered probable that many of the soliciting slogans used in the province of Quebec pertained more to a variety of Catholic Church charities than to the non-denominational Community Chest type, so these have been omitted.

That is not to say that none of the Quebec province slogans qualify for inclusion, since there was an organized United Way program in the province, but its postal advertising tended to include reference to a "Federation", a term that the French seemed to prefer to the United Way English usage, so all of the slogans so referenced continue to be included, while those that only reference "Works of Charity" are omitted.

Normally, related subject slogan groups consist of different wordings used by a national sponsor over a period of years, but there is only very limited national advertising for this group, and a great majority of the slogans were proprietary in nature, sponsored by a local organization for use at one office only. However, there are numerous instances where two or more local groups selected the same wording, and these are therefore catalogued under a single number, giving the superficial appearance of a multi-office slogan used at a variety of locations.

However, the different years of usage, and the slightly different formats of the dies with the same wording, clearly indicate their proprietary nature. The most extensive of these is slogan S-2075-9196, SUPPORT YOUR COMMUNITY CHEST, used at nine offices over a 33 year period, in both two and three line formats, but since the wording was identical the cataloguer had no alternative but to list them under a single number.

In the classification that follows, the 58 offices that had proprietary use of this group of slogans are listed in alphabetic order, and if more than one wording was used at a given office, the usage is listed chronologically. Additionally, if the office additionally had use of one of the few truly multi-office related slogans, that fact is also included in the listing. This listing of proprietary use is followed by a listing of the seven differently numbered slogans that appear to have been of a multi-office nature, sponsored by a single entity of either a regional, provincial or national organization.

Of the seven multi-office usages, two have been combined. The are slogans O-270-6586, ONE GIFT WORKS MANY WONDERS THOUGH UNITED APPEAL and Y-80-10780, YOUR ONE GIFT WORKS MANY WONDERS. Both had use in 1964-66 at twelve Ontario offices in an area that can be described as "Greater Toronto", one used exclusively in 1964, the second exclusively in 1965 and both in 1966. One of these offices had no use in 1964-65, but was used in 1966 and again, as the sole using office, in 1967. In any event, these two wordings must be treated as a single usage.

The concept of "One Gift Working Wonders" was first introduced at Victoria in 1962, and then appropriated by several other sponsors from 1963 to 1970. The earliest recorded use in this related group was at Toronto in 1924, and the latest at Cornwall in 1977.

CENSUS RELATED SLOGANS

A recent article in Issue 43 discussed the Census related Canadian slogans, with use in 1966 and again in 1971. This article stated that the 1971 use of slogan J-250 - 5056 was at 105 offices, but since then ST. JOHN's, previously notable for its absence, has been recorded. The article also mentioned that a dis-proportionate number of the total using offices were in the province of Quebec, and also mentioned that a number of very major Canadian offices had no recorded use.

It seems appropriate to address this area again, with a few more statistics. A survey of the 106 using offices discloses the following.

Quebec province - 52 using offices (49% of the total), but excluding MONTREAL

Ontario province - 25 using offices (23.5% of the total), but excluding TORONTO.

B. C. Province - 17 using offices (15% of the total), but excluding VANCOUVER.

Saskatchewan province - 8 using offices (7.5% of the total), including REGINA, but excluding MOOSE JAW.

Manitoba province - 2 using offices (1% of the total). excluding WINNIPEG.

Alberta province - 1 using office only (1/2% of the total), which was CALGARY, but excluding EDMONTON.

New Brunswick province - 1 using office (1/2% of the total) which was MONCTON, but excluding ST. JOHN.

Newfoundland province - 1 using office (1/2% of the total) which was the newly recorded St. JOHN'S.

Nova Scotia province - No using office, not even HALIFAX.

P.E.I. province - No using office, not even CHARLOTTETOWN.

This is certainly one of the strangest distributions of any major slogan, and since it was government sponsored, there should have been no concern about costs, and one would have thought that under that sponsorship the provincial allotments would have been considerably more even handed. It seems as though there must have been some political reason for promoting the census so heavily in Quebec and almost not at all in the Maritimes, but that is not for a U.S. citizen to conjecture on.

This subject was classified in Issue 35, over two years ago, but is now found to have been somewhat incorrect and incomplete. Cecil Coutts, in the thematic section of his slogan catalogue, lists a considerable number of usages under the heading of Education, but he includes Student Congresses, Museums and University events. While these are no doubt appropriate to his very broad classification, the scope of this article is restricted to the slogan usage directly referencing Education, and especially the wide observance of an annual Education Week. Nevertheless, Coutts' listing did indicate that some material within this scope had been omitted, so a revision appears as well warranted for so popular a thematic group.

The earliest reference was the 1929 advertising of a National Council of Education Conference, with two very similar U dies of N-40 - 5930, NATIONAL COUNCIL OF EDUCATION 4TH TRIENNIAL CONFERENCE VICTORIA-VANCOUVER APRIL 5-13, issued to VANCOUVER and VICTORIA. It appears as possible that this National Council may have eventually sponsored the considerable quantity of multi-office slogans pertaining to Education Week that were used in the early 1960's. However, prior to the multi-office use, slogan advertising was restricted to proprietary uses by a single office, or by two offices using the same wording under different sponsorship. These local efforts were as follows, with all usage from Pitney-Bowes dies..

1948 use - one die of O-15 - 6455, OBSERVE EDUCATION WEEK, was issued at VANCOUVER, and reissued in 1950-51. This was the first of many future references to Education Week, but this observance appears to have been in November, rather than in the first week of March, as it was later observed.

1952 use - one die of E-110 - 2783, EDUCATION WEEK (dates), was issued at TORONTO, and redated in 1953 and 1956-57. This local observance was in the first week of March, as was to become the later national observance.

1955 use - one die of E-65 - 2750, EDUCATION - EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS, was issued at HAMILTON, and reissued in 1956-57 and 1959. Though not referencing Education Week, use was from late February through the first week of March.

By coincidence, a very similar die of E-70 - 2753, EDUCATION IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS, was also issued in 1955 at KENORA, and reissued in 1957-58. This also had use from late February through early March.

1956 use - one die of S-320 - 7915, SCHOOLS BUILD CANADA EDUCATION WEEK (dates), was issued at LONDON, and redated in 1957-59, again referencing Education Week, with early March use.

Also in 1956 a two line die of V-770 - 10260, VISIT YOUR SCHOOLS EDUCATION WEEK, was issued at SARNIA, and reissued in 1957 and 1959. The same wording in three lines was used at BRANTFORD in 1959-60.

1958 use - one die of E-75 - 2755, EDUCATION IS WORTH THE EFFORT, was issued at WINNIPEG, and reissued in 1959, again with use in late February through the first week in March.

Also in 1958 one die of E-140 - 2797, EDUCATION - YOUR BUSINESS, was issued at FORT WILLIAM, and reissued in 1959-60, with use in late February through the first week of March in 1958-59, but oddly used in November of 1960. This wording somewhat echos that of the earlier use at HAMILTON and KENORA.

1959 use - one die of T-150 - 9365, THE FIRST WEEK OF MARCH IS EDUCATION WEEK, was issued at SUDBURY, and reissued in 1963.

Also in 1959 BRANTFORD was issued a three line die of V-770 - 10260, the same wording as used at SARNIA from 1956, and it was reissued in 1960.

1960 use - one die of B-600 - 780, BUILD TODAY FOR THE CITIZENS OF TOMORROW, was issued at WINNIPEG. The wording does not include the term Education, but use was in late Feb.-early March, so it is assumed as Education related, as WINNIPEG did not use any other Education related slogan in 1960.. The same wording is reported in late May-early June, 1957 at VANCOUVER, but it has not been seen and may not have had the same purpose, so only the WINNIPEG 1960 use is illustrated

Also in 1960 one die of E-80 - 2757, EDUCATION KEY TO THE FUTURE, was issued at PORT ARTHUR, but with use in early November.

Also in 1960, one die of E-85 - 2758, EDUCATION KEY TO THE FUTURE NOV. 6-12, was issued at LONDON, the same wording as the PORT ARTHUR use, except for the dates, and also indicating November observance.

Also in 1960, two dies of O-420 - 6725, ONTARIO EDUCATION CENTENARY TORONTO EASTER WEEK, were issued, one at OTTAWA and one at TORONTO. Although not referencing Education Week, they were certainly Education related. In 1962-63 TORONTO used E-95 - 2765, EDUCATION THROUGH PHILATELY, but this is deemed to be more philatelically oriented than educationally, and is therefore omitted.

In 1964 Courtts lists use of S-1580 - 8835, SUPPORT ADULT EDUCATION ATTEND NIGHT SCHOOL, at CAMPBELL RIVER. Its inclusion in this listing is somewhat tenuous, and as it has not been seen, it cannot be illustrated.

In addition to the several proprietary English slogans initiated in 1960, that year also saw the introduction of the first bilingual usage, exclusively in the province of Quebec, and probably sponsored by a local provincial group. This consisted of three dies of slogan E-120 - 2788, EDUCATION WEEK (dates) SEMAINE DE L'EDUCATION, issued to CITE DE JACQUES CARTIER, LACHINE and MONTREAL. They were redated in 1961, but not beyond with one exception. Since the dates coincided in 1967, one of the retained 1961 dies was reissued to MONTREAL in that year.

Also in 1960, a provincial group in British Columbia sponsored E-90 - 2760, EDUCATION SHAPES CANADA'S FUTURE, but use in that year was restricted to one die issued at VANCOUVER, with a second die added in 1961, and the two used at DAWSON CREEK and VICTORIA. One of these two dies was used again at DAWSON CREEK in 1962, but use of this slogan ceased thereafter.

This same group sponsored a second wording, E-100 - 3777 EDUCATION WEEK FIRST WEEK IN MARCH, starting in 1961. The first year of use was again restricted to VANCOUVER, but two more dies were added in 1962, for use at VICTORIA and NEW WESTMINSTER, and somewhat oddly, a die with the same wording was also issued at TORONTO in 1962 only. From 1963 use was in B.C. only, with two more dies added for use at DAWSON CREEK and PRINCE GEORGE, making a total of five dies. These were variously reissued to an eventual total of seven B.C. offices (see Appendix A for details). By 1965 one die was probably unserviceable, and a second in 1966, as only three offices had 1967 use, and final 1968 use was at NANAIMO only.

However, the major Education related event of 1961 was the issue of the first multi-office slogan sponsored by a national group, with use of eleven English dies in nine of the ten provinces (see Appendix A for details). The exception was British Columbia, where use of Educational slogans had begun in 1960, and continued until 1968. This national English slogan was O-20 - 6460, OBSERVE EDUCATION WEEK MARCH 5-11 STAY IN SCHOOL. .

It can be noted that the local Quebec province sponsors of E-12 - 2788 did not include the city of Quebec in their 1960-61 issue, nor in their subsequent 1962-67 usage. It therefore appears probable that the national group, in addition to providing an English die of O-20 - 6460 to MONTREAL, also sponsored a French only related slogan for use at MONTREAL and QUEBEC. This would account for the 1961 issued of L-130 - 5300, L'EDUCATION GARANTIE L'AVENIR, (Education Guarantees the Future), and its reissue in 1962. MONTREAL therefor used three related slogans in 1961, one English and one French sponsored by the national group and one bilingual sponsored by the provincial group.

In 1962 the Quebec provincial group replaced E-120 - 2788 with S-575 - 8134, SEMAINE DE L'EDUCATION (dates) EDUCATION WEEK, the same wording as before, but in French-over-English, used at the same three offices, and redated in 1963.

Also in 1962 the national group issued an expanded number of English dies to 17 offices, (see Appendix A for details) omitting MONTREAL, but including VANCOUVER, even though VANCOUVER also used its provincially sponsored die of E-100. This was E-105 - 2779, EDUCATION WEEK MARCH 4-10 ACCENT ON EXCELLENCE. Their French slogan L-130 was reissued at MONTREAL and QUEBEC.

In 1963 the national group issued a new slogan to the same 17 offices, E-125 - 2790, EDUCATION WEEK MARCH 3-9 MEASURE OF A NATION, and new dies of a French slogan S-585 - 8133, SEMAINE DE L'EDUCATION 3 AU 9 MARS were issued to MONTREAL and QUEBEC. In 1963 the Quebec provincial group reissued the redated S-575 to its three offices..

The 1964 English use was similar to the 1963, with dies issued to the same 17 offices, but instead of the usual practice of issuing new dies with a different theme phrase, the 1963 dies were reissued with the 1963 dates removed, creating E-130 - 2792, EDUCATION WEEK MEASURE OF A NATION, without any dates. One of the 1963 dies must have been unserviceable, since the die used in 1964 by NIAGRA FALLS was a new die, with the same wording, but the lettering position differs.

In the case of the national group's issue of dies in Quebec, the MONTREAL die was the 1963 die of slogan S-585 - 8133 with the dates removed, creating S-590 - 8130, SEMAINE DE L'EDUCATION, without dates, but the QUEBEC use was from a new die, the same wording, without dates, but the lettering position differing. This suggests that one of the two 1963 dies was unserviceable, and had to be replaced

The Quebec group's use was normally of three dies, but in 1964 they took advantage of the example presented by the national group of reissuing dies with the dates removed. They therefore expanded to four dies by using the two remaining serviceable 1963 dies of S-575, with dates removed,, creating S-595 -8131, SEMAINE DE L'EDUCATION EDUCATION WEEK, at CITE DE JACQUES CARTIER and LACHINE. They also used two of their 1961 use of E-120, with dates removed, creating E-135- 2795, EDUCATION WEEK SEMAINE DE L'EDUCATION, one of which was used at MONTREAL and the fourth die at a new office, DORION-VAUDREUIL.

Also in 1964, Canada hosted a Commonwealth Education Conference at Ottawa, advertised by T-280 - 9515, 3rd COMMONWEALTH EDUC. CONFERENCE OTTAWA AUG.21-SEPT.4 in English and T-285 - 9525, 3e CONFERENCE SUR L'EDUCATION DANS LE COMMONWEALTH OTTAWA 21 AOUT-4 SEPT. in French., with use of both at MONTREAL as well as at OTTAWA. While the dates did not coincide with those of the Canadian Education Week, as the host country, Canada could not dictate the timing to coincide with its own Education Week.

In 1965 the national group appears to have ceased slogan use, leaving all use to the Quebec provincial group, and a new Saskatchewan provincial group. The Saskatchewan group introduced three dies of E-115 - 2785, EDUCATION WEEK (dates) GATEWAY TO PROGRESS, issued to MOOSE JAW, REGINA and SASKATOON in 1965 and redated in 1966.

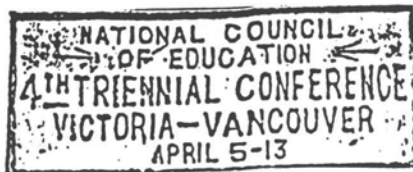
Also in 1965, the Quebec group use remained at four offices, although one die of S-595 had become unserviceable. The only serviceable remaining die of S-595 was reissued to MONTREAL, but oddly, three dies of E-135 have been seen, used at LAVAL-DES-RAPIDES, LACHINE, and CITE DE JACQUES CARTIER.

This is peculiar, because only two dies of E-135 were used in 1964, and it seems somewhat impossible that a third die should become available in 1965. E-135 was created by removing the dates of E-120, but since one die of E-120, with its 1961 dates, has been seen used at MONTREAL in 1967, there should have been only two dies of E-135 available in 1965, as there were in 1964. No reasonable explanation has as yet been found for this 1965 addition of a die of E-135, but it is confirmed by seen usage..

The 1966-67 bilingual use was restricted to the three remaining dies of E-135, as the last die of S-595 was unserviceable after 1965 use. The 1966 use was at CITE DE JACQUES CARTIER, LACHINE and MONTREAL and the 1967 use at CITE DE JACQUES CARTIER and LACHINE, with MONTREAL using the reissued E-120 with its coinciding 1961 dates.

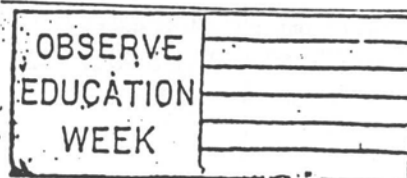
All of the earlier bilingual dies were either withdrawn or unserviceable by 1968, but the Quebec provincial group was probably the sponsor of two new dies in 1968 only, each with five dies used at CITE DE JACQUES CARTIER, LACHINE, MONTREAL, QUEBEC and SHERBROOKE. One was the bilingual L-135 - 5305, L'EDUCATION SANS VOUS? EDUCATION WITHOUT YOU?, and the other the bilingual S-600, 8133-A, SEMAINE DE L'EDUCATION DU 3 AU 9 MARS EDUCATION WEEK.

The usage of these two is somewhat odd, since S-600 was issued in mid-February, for use to just before the beginning of Education Week on March 3rd, after which it was withdrawn, and replaced by five dies of L-135, which remained in use for only the short period of Education Week.. Just why they were never reissued is unclear.



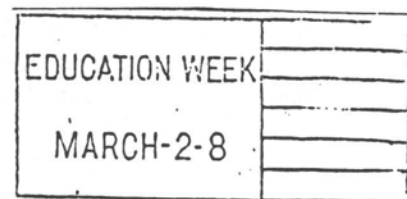
