CRIPPLED CHILDREN EASTER SEALS RELATED SLOGANS

THIRTEEN DIFFERENTLY WORDED SLOGANS


This subject was extensively treated in prior issues 33 and 34, more than four years ago, so a brief revision based on new data is appropriate. It is now clear from the 1947-55 P. O. documentation available that all of the differently worded slogans had various related sponsors, but this early documentation gives no indication that their issue was consolidated under one national organization prior to 1955. However, the reissue of previously proprietary dies at offices other than those of the original sponsor, from 1961 on, suggests that all related dies were pooled at that time or somewhat earlier and issued under the sponsorship of a national organization. Nevertheless, there are some instances of proprietary sponsorship after the pooling, suggesting that some areas, notably Alberta, were still not affiliated with the national group after 1961. The initial use was sponsored by the Ontario Society for Crippled Children, but was later joined by other regional organizations and to a considerable degree by local Rotary Clubs.

In addition to 13 different wordings, some wordings appeared in several formats as replacement or added dies. The earlier articles attempted to separate the usage by format and by separable pre-1955 dies, but repeating this data would be very lengthy and probably of interest to only a few members and source of confusion to others.

Accordingly, this revision is much simplified into a listing of all usage at 93 recorded offices, by year and by slogan, if the use has been seen or reliably reported by slogan. When this is not the case, but the usage patterns strongly suggest use at an office in a given year, this use is designated as "Probable", rather than by slogan number. For ease of reference, the earliest format of each of the 13 wordings is illustrated if available, with a brief description of their origins and periods of recorded use.


Slogan B-655-820 - BUY AND USE "CRIPPLED CHILDREN" EASTER SEALS. The earliest use of this related group was of four PB and two P dies, with quotation marks, sponsored in 1947 by the Ontario Society for Crippled Children. There was subsequent use of numerous replacements and additions in various formats without the quotation marks, averaging about 10 dies used in each year, but diminishing to use of only three dies in the final 1967-68 years.

Slogan B-740-865 - BUY EASTER SEALS HELP CRIPPLED CHILDREN. Originated by the Rotary Clubs of Saskatchewan in 1951, with use of two dies at REGINA and SASKATOON, but the wording was later adopted by many other groups, probably including the national group from 1961, and was eventually by far the largest used, averaging 30-35 dies in 1958-68 before it began to decrease in 1969-70, with three dies recorded in 1971. A 1959-65 proprietary use at KAPUSKASING is from a die with quotation marks around the entire wording.

Slogan B-665-825 - BUY AND USE EASTER SEALS. Originated as a single proprietary Perfect die used at HALIFAX from 1952 to 1956, but additional dies with the same wording were requested by an Alberta group in 1954 for use at CALGARY, EDMONTON, LETHBRIDGE, MEDICINE HAT and RED DEER, with most used through 1956. There is no recorded 1957-63 use, but the wording is later recorded at DUNNVILLE and SUDBURY in 1964.





Slogan B-750-866 - BUY EASTER SEALS TO HELP CRIPPLED CHILDREN. Originated as a proprietary die used at WINNIPEG in 1952. A B.C. group sponsored two dies with the same wording in 1953 for use at VANCOUVER and VICTORIA. The VICTORIA die was reissued in 1954 and the VANCOUVER die in 1955 only. A die with the same wording was issued at OSHAWA in 1956 only. There was no recorded 1957 use, but in 1958 this

wording had use at PRINCE ALBERT, SAULT STE. MARIE and WINNIPEG. The WINNIPEG use was a reissue of the 1952 die, but the other two offices had individually new sponsored use. No recorded use in 1959-60, but the wording was used at KINGSTON in 1961 and at WINNIPEG in 1962, a further reissue of the 1952 and 1958 die.

CRIPPLED CHILDREN EASTER SEALS RELATED SLOGANS

Slogan S-1675-8880 - SUPPORT EASTER SEAL CAMPAIGN. This slogan was omitted from prior articles, but a review of the documentation now shows that it was requested in 1953 by the Rotary Club at WALLACEBURG. The Club suggested the wording SUPPORT ROTARY EASTER SEAL CAMPAIGN, but were told that a sponsor's name could not be used in the wording. The only illustration available is a somewhat enlarged receipt impression.






Slogan E-05-2690 - EASTER SEALS HELP CRIPPLED CHILDREN. Originated with proprietary use at WINNIPEG in 1957 only. A similar wording had proprietary use at SUDBURY in 1958 only. The SUDBURY die was reissued in 1964 to PRESTON and rotated to four other offices in 1964-68.

Slogan B-745-865-A - BUY EASTER SEALS ACHETEZ DES TIMBRES DE PAQUE - Originated as two identical proprietary dies used at NORANDA and ROUYN in 1960, reissued in 1961. The Editor does not have impressions of either use, so it cannot be illustrated. There does not appear to have been any provincial Easter Seal organization in Quebec province or even a local group in any of the larger Quebec offices, so this slogan is the only Quebec bilingual Easter Seal postal advertising used.

Slogan U-145-9822 - USE EASTER SEALS HELP CRIPPLED CHILDREN. Originated as a single proprietary die issued to LUNENBURG in 1961, reissued in 1962-63, not recorded thereafter.





Slogan U-140-9820 - USE EASTER SEALS - Originated as a single proprietary two line die issued to VANCOUVER in 1964, reissued in 1965 and possibly in 1966. By 1967 it had been replaced by a three line die, reissued in 1968, but not recorded thereafter. This is quite late for a proprietary Easter Seal slogan to have been sponsored, but VANCOUVER does not appear to have had any Easter Seal postal advertising since much earlier proprietary use in 1955, and therefore was not part of any national advertising in the 1961-63 period.


Slogan B-660-821 - BUY AND USE CRIPPLED CHILDREN'S EASTER SEALS - This was probably a set of replacement dies for B-655, but CHILDREN was inadvertently rendered possessive by the inclusion of the 'S. It appears to have been originated with four dies used at BRANTFORD, GUELPH, TORONTO and WOODSTOCK in 1964, then randomly reissued to the extent still serviceable in 1965-70





Slogan T-365-9615 - TIME TO BUY AND USE EATER SEALS Originated as a single proprietary die at CALGARY in 1966, reissued in 1967 only. As with VANCOUVER's proprietary use of U-140, this is quite late for a proprietary die to have been sponsored, but CALGARY also does not appear to have had any Easter Seal postal advertising since much earlier proprietary use in 1954-56, and was not a part of any national advertising in 1961-65.


Slogan H-295-4335 - HELP EASTER SEALS HELP CRIPPLED CHILDREN - Originated by an Alberta group sponsoring use of four non separable dies issued in 1968 to four Alberta offices, CALGARY, EDMONTON, LETHBRIDGE and RED DEER., Three additional dies must have been issued in 1969 to permit use at the original four offices plus CAMROSE and GRANDE PRAIRIE in Alberta and DAWSON CREEK in B.C.

CRIPPLED CHILDREN EASTER SEALS RELATED SLOGANS

Slogan E-06-2690 - EASTER SEALS HELP CRIPPLED CHILDREN UTILISEZ LES TIMBRES DE PAQUES -P. O. regulations required that new or replacement dies issued from 1970 on be bilingual, so dies with this wording were a bilingual version of slogan E-05. Still serviceable English dies could continue to be used in 1970-71, but had to be withdrawn in 1972. Four non separable dies of E-06 appear to have been issued in 1970 and thereafter randomly reissued, but the usage of 15 dies in 1975 indicates that a considerable number of additional replacement dies were put into use. The recorded number of using offices begins to decrease from 1976, suggesting that additional replacements were not being undertaken, and only two dies are recorded in 1979 at COCHRANE and SUDBURY, but only one die is recorded thereafter at COCHRANE in 1980-84. This is the final usage of the related group.

> BUY AND USE "CRIPPLED CHILDREN" EASTER SEALS.

In reply I would advise that arrangements could be made for the operation of these dies at offices mentioned in your letter, as follows:

1 - Universal die at Toronto - for thirty days prior to April 6th. dies at London 3 -Hamilton Kingston Ottawa St.Catharines Chatham - for two weeks, each, during above period. (Peterboro, also included in your list, is equipped with a Universal machine, and could be substituted for Chatham, St.Catharines, etc., if desired). 2 - Perfect dies at Windsor Stratford Brockville North Bay - for two weeks, each, during above period. Pending receipt of reply from you, ordering of the dies is withheld.

OBJECTIONABLE ENDORSEMENTS ON COVERS OF MAIL CONTROVERSIAL SLOGANS - POSTAL CANCELLING MACHINES CONTROVERSIAL ADVERTISING PLATES - POSTAGE METER MACHINES

1. Cbjectionable Endorsements on Covers of Mail

(a) General Policy

We prohibit the placement on covers of mail matter of any endorsement, stamp, label, or other device of a political, controversial, objectionable or misleading nature or which would "tend to injuriously affect the commercial or social standing of the person addressed". The clause "tend to injuriously affect the commercial or social standing of the person addressed" applies to words or devices of a dunning character.

Additionally, as outlined in Section 1102.6 of the Postal Guide, we restrict non-postal stamps likely to be mistaken for postage stamps to the reverse side of mail. Other non-postal stamps or stickers may be affixed to the address side provided they are not placed in the upper right-hand corner, the space reserved for postage stamps.

 - (i) "In Baltic States Human Rights Are Killed by Communism"
 - (1) "Danger Dictatorship. Stay Away From Greece in 1968"
 - (iii) "Communiem is Jewish"

During 1966 the Latvian Relief Society of Canada posted mail bearing the first listed imprint.

Again in 1968, advice was received from the International Postal Union that mail, originating in Canada, was being received in Greece with stickers worded as in (ii) above.

In both cases we ruled that such mail was non-transmissible and arranged for its return to senders.

Our decision was influenced by the opinion respecting scurrility rendered by the Board of Review headed by Mr. Justice Wells in the case involving the National States Rights Party of the United States who were using the Canadian Mails for the dissemination of scurrilous matter particularly pertaining to persons of Jewish or Negroid origin.

Secondly, in support of this decision was the resolution adopted by the 1957 Ottawa U.P.U. Congress. In essence, this resolution was intended to foster better relations between member countries of the U.P.U. and through its adoption the member countries had pledged to avoid anything in the motif of their postage stamps or in postal slogans appearing on the outside of mail matter which could cause offence to the philosophy of life of other countries.

(c) Examples of Endorsements - Restricted

"Quebec Libre R.I.N." "Quebec Cui - Ottawa Non" "100 ans d'Injustice - 1867-1967"

Since 1964 there have been spasmodic flurries of mail posted in Quebec bearing stickers or rubber stamped impressions of the above wordings on the address side of mail.

Legal opinion was to the effect that no offence was being committed by such endorsements. We have ruled, therefore, that mail so endorsed is transmissible providing the endorsements are not placed in the space reserved for postage stamps and cancellations.

(d) Recommendation

We continue present policy.

2. Controversial Slogans - Postal Cancelling Machines

(a) General Policy

Generally, cancelling die slogans are restricted to those advertising charitable campaigns of National, Provincial or at least City-wide importance, e.g., special events such as Centennial celebrations. Messages of a sectarian, commercial or controversial nature are not acceptable. Public Affairs Branch are responsible for the production of these dies.

- 3. Controversial Advertising Plates Postage Meter Machines
 - (a) General Folicy

As outlined in Section 4310.9 of the Canada Postal Guide, slogans of a political or controversial nature are not allowed.

We have a standing agreement with Pitney-Bowes of Canada Ltd. that they are to decide whether or not the slogans are acceptable. When in doubt they are to refer the matter to us for decision.

The matter of having the same restrictions on postage meter plates as are in effect for postal cancelling dies has been discussed with officials of Pitney-Bowes who strongly recommended against this for these reasons:

- 1. They have 55,000 meters in service in Canada, 80% of which have advertising plates.
- 2. An average of 1000 applications for plates are received monthly.
- 3. 95.5% have acceptable wordings (only 7 rejections in past 3 months).
- 4. If further restrictions were placed on the wordings: e.g. similar to those in effect for postal cancelling dies, this would necessitate withdrawal of a substantial number of the estimated 40,000 advertising plates currently in service with consequent strong protest from the companies that have been using them for many years.

(c) Solution

A possible solution to the problem, as suggested by the management of Pitney-Bowes Canada Ltd., is to require that all postage meter advertising plates with messages which might remotely offend someone, bear the additional wording "Mailer Advertisement". This would let the recipients of the mail know that neither the meter supplier nor the Government was supporting the message.

It is understood that the foregoing requirement is Pitney-Bowes Company policy in the United States.

As a further precaution, Pitney-Bowes Canada Ltd. are willing to establish as general policy a "Withdrawal" condition in purchase agreements. This would stipulate that the company reserves the right, at the request of the Canada Post Office, to withdraw, at any time, an advertising plate found not to meet postal requirements.

(d) Recommendation

We must continue to exercise controls on postage meter slogans for the reasons indicated above. However, it is recommended that, apart from the two modifications in policy outlined in (c) above, we refrain from any further restrictive action.

POLICY GOVERNING METER ADVERTISING PLATE ISSUANCE

<u>Background</u> -- For many years the Post Office Department in this country, as well as postal services in many other countries, has used stamp cancellations to carry messages in the broad public interest. As a matter of sound policy these cancellations are never used for political propaganda or other highly controversial matters. Long experience has shown that anything of this nature is considered by the public as highly improper.

The same impropriety obviously would apply to political or other highly controversial matter printed by meter advertising plates used in postage meters authorized by the Government. Moreover, where some matter printed is not directly related to the commercial product or service of the mailer, there may be some possibility of confusion in the minds of the public as to sponsorship or authorship. Therefore, the following policy is established.

<u>Policy</u> -- We cannot furnish any meter advertising plate: (1) which supports or opposes, or carries the name, design, message, or slogan of any political party, candidate, pending or proposed legislation; or which supports or opposes any organization or individual whose activity is to influence elections, legislation or government action on behalf of any particular group of people or organization; (2) which might be considered defamatory, subversive or inflammatory, or which might be offensive to the public, as defined generally in the categories of unmailable matter (Postal Manual, Part 124); (3) which might be confused with the postage or postmark; (4) which includes reproductions of any national or state flag, or which might be offensive to any nation with whom we are not at war.

Any institutional or individual message of an exhortative, editorial, or ideological nature, which might be construed as indirectly relating to any political or governmental subject not established as a national policy, must clearly indicate the mailer's sponsorship or authorship by having the mailer's name printed directly above the message and separated from it by a line, or by the similar use of the words "Mailer's Advertisement".

<u>Withdrawals</u> -- Because in the great volume of meter advertising and artwork which must be reviewed and processed, we may furnish a plate in error, and because public developments may change the aspects of a plate properly furnished originally, the company reserves the right, at the request of the Canada Post Office, to withdraw, at any time, a plate later found not to meet the requirements, and reimburse the meter user for all direct costs involved, including original artwork.

<u>Acceptance of Orders</u> -- All branch managers should see that all salesmen, servicemen, and other personnel concerned are thoroughly conversant with company policy on this matter in order that it may be adequately explained in advance to customers who desire to place orders for meter advertisements of this noncommercial type. It is obviously far better not to take an order which cannot be filled than to accept it, have the customer count on getting it, and then finally have the Head Office reject it after consultation with the Canada Post Office.

d Office Approval of Meter Advertising -- The Meter Advertising Department has the responsibility of reviewing and screening all orders for meter advertisements, and will submit to the Manager of Sales Administration all editorial ads, including "borderline" cases, for consultation with the Canada Post Office.

Quantity Discount -- The Company will grant a discount on all firm orders for meter ad plates in accordance with the following table, provided the order covers exactly the same copy in exactly the same size, all ordered at one time, all billed under one invoice, and shipped to one address. All customers complying with these requirements are to be quoted these discounts:
