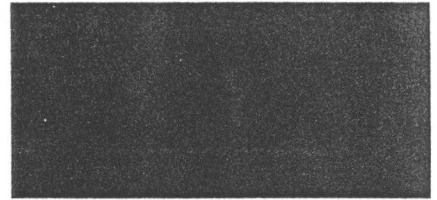

DANIEL G. ROSENBLAT

1921-1999

After a short illness, our editor, Daniel Rosenblat died on October 27th 1999 at age 78. Daniel Rosenblat was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba moving with his family in his early years to Vancouver, British Columbia. At age fourteen the Rosenblat family moved to San Francisco, California. Daniel Rosenblat attended Lowell High School and City College in San Francisco.

Daniel served in the United States Army during World War II and saw action on Okinawa, Ryukyu Islands, Japan. Daniel was severely wounded during action, causing him difficulty during the rest of his life. He was awarded the U.S. Army's Purple Heart and two Bronze Stars. After the War Daniel worked in the family business and then obtained a seat on the Pacific Coast stock Exchange.

In addition to being the Editor, leader and moving force behind the Slogan Box (winner of the BNAPS John S. Siverts Award for best edited Study Group Newsletter of 1989) and the BNAPS Slogan Study Group from 1988 till the present, Daniel Rosenblat authored many articles and books. He co-authored, with Stanley Cohen, "The Squared Circle Postmarks of the London Suburban District Offices", "London Fancy Geometric Postmarks", and with Stanley Cohen and Maurice Barette "Collecting British Squared Circle Postmarks" which was published in 1987 and won the prestigious "Philatelic Book of the Year" award for 1988. The following works on slogan cancels were written/edited by Daniel:

"Slogan Postal Markings of Canada in the Classic Early Period from 1912 to 1919" (1989)

"Slogan Postal Markings of Canada in the Period from 1920 to 1930" (1990?)

"Slogan Postal Markings of Canada in the Period from 1931 to 1940" (1991)

"Slogan Postal Markings of Canada in the 1941 - 1953 Period" (1992)

"Slogan Postal Markings of Canada, In the 1912-1953 Period" (1993)

"A Handbook of the Airmail Slogans of Canada" (1990) and "The Handbook of Airmail Slogan Cancels of Canada (second edition) with Cecil Coutts (1999)

Daniel wrote the introduction to the "Catalogue & Guidebook Slogan Postmarks of Canada" by Cecil Coutts. Daniel wrote about 90% of the articles in the Slogan Box and articles in the Journal of the Postal History Society of Canada and in BNAPS Topics.

Daniel Rosenblat will be sorely missed by members of the Slogan Study Group and by other philatelists.

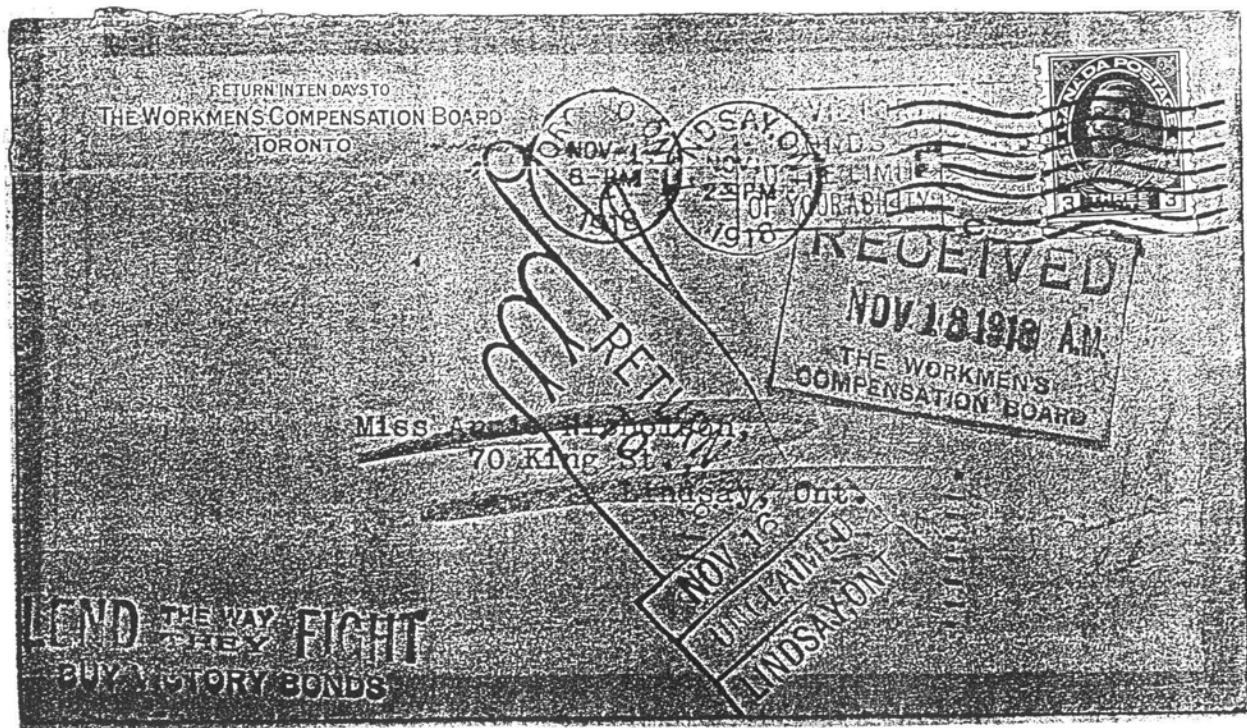

Members are requested to submit their articles to Cecil Coutts (34820 McLeod Avenue, Abbotsford, B.C. V3G 1G9 for review.

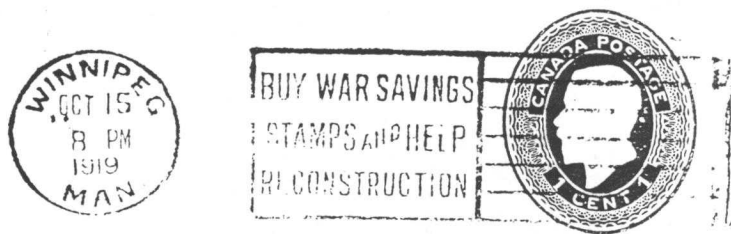
New Toronto Handstamp Find



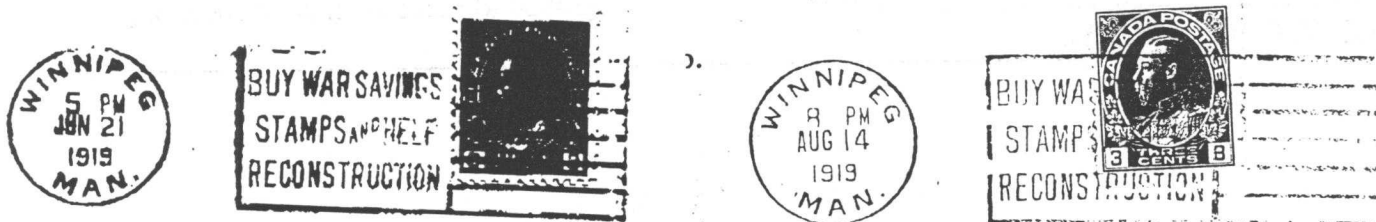

BUY WAR SAVINGS STAMPS AND HELP RECONSTRUCTION

Numerous articles have appeared in the Slogan Box regarding the "BUY WAR SAVINGS STAMPS AND HELP RECONSTRUCTION" slogan of 1919 and later. It has only recently come to the attention of the current author that the Universal Winnipeg dies exist in two states, both with file marks on the left edge of the slogan box and with the left edge slogan box complete. The earliest date I have seen for a Winnipeg Universal die with the edge file marks is July 8th. Sometime prior to this date, the dies received file marks; conversely the dies appeared without file marks during early use of the slogan. It is unclear as to whether all four of the dies occur in both states. Could it be that the International dies also exist in two states? The current author would appreciate photocopies of Winnipeg dies to try to pin down the date when the file marks were made and to attempt to determine whether the International dies also exist in both states.

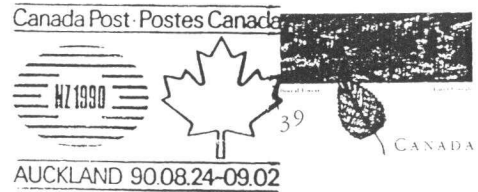
