Post-Confederation Use of Nova Scotia's Temporary-Emergency Marking

In 1843 Nova Scotia Deputy Postmaster General Arthur Woodgate ordered a 35 mm circle datestamp with movable type that could be used for any post office name. The intention was to send the marking to a newly opened post office for temporary use if the regular datestamp was not yet available. It could also be put into service after an emergency, such as a post office fire. Before Confederation it was used in at least 12 post offices. Some of these uses are known from records only, as no strikes have been found.

When J.J. MacDonald published *The Nova Scotia Post: Its Offices, Masters and Marks* 1700 – 1867 in 1985, he was aware of the marking being used twice after Confederation, at Dartmouth and Oxford. Usage at Stellarton was discovered soon after. It is now known to have been used in at least 8 post offices after Confederation.

With a typical usage period of only a few weeks (1 - 3 months), the survival rate of Temporary – Emergency markings is low, and most of the markings are known by a single strike only. Also, many strikes are light or partial ones, which makes getting an accurate, complete illustration difficult. For the post-Confederation uses, multiple strikes are known for Dartmouth, Oxford, and Stellarton. For the others – Economy, Granville Ferry, Sheet Harbour, Londonderry Station, and Wentworth Station – only one strike has been discovered. There are no records indicating where the marking was sent after 1867 and the discovery of the Temporary-Emergency marking used at additional post offices is very possible.

STELLARTON (Figure 4)

Date of post office name change from Albion Mines to Stellarton: March 1, 1871

Known dates of use of the T-E marking: MR 4 – AP 4, 1871

Until at least March 25, the "S" was placed sideways. Strikes of April 4 show the "S" upright.

OXFORD (Fig. 5)

Conversion date from a way office to a post office: January 1, 1873

Known dates of use of the T-E marking: MR 6 $-\,\text{AP}$ 1, 1873

Known date of T-E marking use: JU 13, 1873 1874

Known date of T-E marking use: MY 27, 1874

WENTWORTH STATION (Fig. 8)

Conversion date from a way office to a post office: July 1, 1874

Known date of T-E marking use: NO 2 (4), 1874

MacDonald indicated that in 1843 when the **Temporary-Emergency** proofs of the instrument were made, a notation stated that "Two there were shifting stamps with complete alphabets, one extra set of vowels sets of figures" (p. and double 157). MacDonald observes, "Apparently.". there were two of these instruments, but . . . there is no record of an overlapping period of use by two offices, hence it is unknown if both were ever sent to Nova Scotia." The discovery of overlapping periods of use in the post-Confederation era at Dartmouth and Granville Ferry in November 1870 appears to confirm the presence of two Temporary-Emergency instruments.

Morin's Bibliography on Canadian Philately Now Available

The British North America Philatelic Society (BNAPS) is pleased to announce that Cimon Morin's *Canadian Philately: Bibliography and Index* is now available online. This bibliography, published by the National Library of Canada (1979, 1983) and Saskatoon Stamp Center (1998), includes more than 12,600 bibliographic references on stamps, postal stationery, postal history and postal markings of Canada and British North America. It contains references to documents such as monographs, brochures, specialized catalogues, auction catalogues, as well as articles published in periodicals, exhibition catalogues and more general works. The bibliography includes both English and French documents. It indexes documents published between 1864 and 2006.

The bibliography is an importar contribution to the philately c British Nort America and a essential tool for researchers. website. The Society discussed the project with Cimon Morin. He was enthusiastic about the launch of his bibliography online, and volunteered to provide the bibliographic data he had compiled. BNAPS then approached Library and Archives Canada and John Jamieson of Saskatoon Stamp Centre. Both gave their support to the project.

The database hosted on the BNAPS web server contains all the bibliographic data compiled by Cimon Morin. The database's web interface, which includes the administration, search and results web pages, was developed by BNAPS.

In addition to providing a survey of Canadian philately, this bibliography brings to the fore the authors who have shared their knowledge within the philatelic community. It gives philatelists an overview of the subjects that have been explored over the years, and reveals facets of philately that still await in-depth research.


FLOOR PLAN Exhibit Layout and Dealer Location

Doug Lingard (Chief Judge) started collecting again in 1972 with a focus on BNA mint stamps. By the late 1970's, his interests had mainly switched to Canadian postal history. Over the years, Doug formed some better collections of Canadian military mail, Northumberland county (Ontario), Canadian and Newfoundland WWII censor tapes, Canadian private perfins, Canadian flag cancels, 1939 Royal Train/Royal Visit material, etc. His exhibit of Canadian flag cancels won an ORAPEX national level grand award, and his Royal Train exhibit won a BNAPEX reserve grand award.



Doug has been a BNAPS judge since 1996 and a RPSC National Level judge since about 1994. Doug self published a book based on his 1896-1919 Canadian flag cancel exhibit, was the initial editor of *The Flag Pole*, the newsletter of the old BNAPS Flag Cancel Study Group, and has written a number of articles for various philatelic journals and newsletters. He was VP Study Groups in BNAPS from 1996 to 2004 and was Chair of ORAPEX, Ottawa's National Level stamp show from 1998 to 2013.



Earle Covert's mother gave him a stamp album for Christmas in 1947 and everything started.

He has exhibited many different phases of Canadian Postal History, Postal Stationery and Rev enue Stamps. He together with Bill Walton have edited 4 editions of *Webb Catalogue of Postal Stationery of Canada and Newfoundland*. He has written 24 articles in *Topics* including the *Postal Potpourri* series. and published 6 books. In addition he has authoured on the **bnaps.org** website topics including *Webbs* Special Services Postal Stationery, Illus-

trated Permits and Non-prepaid Priority Courier and Xpresspost Envelopes. He hopes to keep exhibiting and publishing.





Victor L. Willson OTB has a PhD in Statistical Methods and retired as Department Head of Educational Psychology at Texas A&M University in 2016. He and wife Carol split their time between College Station TX and Mt Crested Butte Colorado.

In BNAPS he has served as President of the Society and as a Board of Directors member and Chair. He chaired the 1998 BNAPEX in Orlando. He was editor of *BNA TOPICS* and *BNA Portraits*. He has served on several BNAPEX exhibit juries. His collecting interests are wide-

ranging, from Large Queens to 19th century postal history and tobacco stamps. He has won the BNAPEX grand award three time as well as McNaught Single Frame award. Vic publishes regularly in *TOP-ICS*. He currently serves as Chair of the Judging Committee for BNAPS.



Jeffrey S. Arndt began collecting stamps at age 10. His current collecting and research areas include the 1954 Wilding Issue, Forgeries, and phosphorescence on Canadian stamps. His first exhibit was a one page thematic that earned an "A" in eighth grade. At BNAPEX 2014 BALPEX he received Vermeil and the John D. Arn White Queen Award for a single frame exhibit of the Canadian Wilding QEII Issue. At BNAPEX 2016 Fredericton he received a Gold award for a multi-frame exhibit of the Canadian Wilding QEII Issue. After several

years assisting with its preparation, in 2013 he became Co-Editor of BNA Topics. Jeff is a mathematician working in Northern Virginia.
