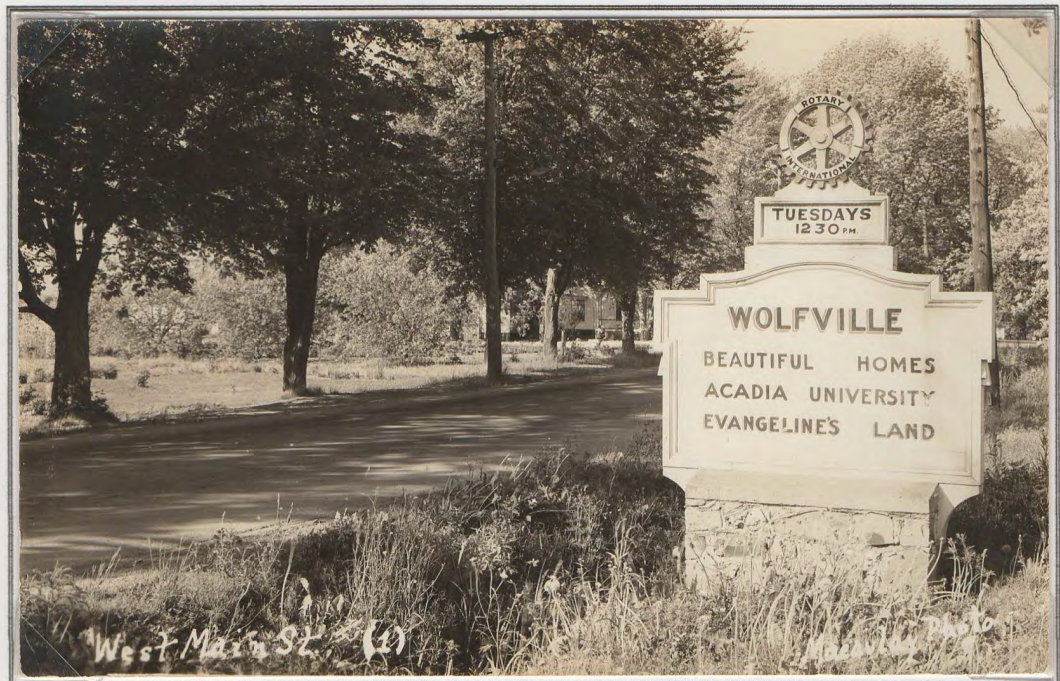


# VISITING ACADIA UNIVERSITY THROUGH THE YEARS
