## NEWFOUNDLAND REVENUES -- A CHECK LIST

By Dan Meyerson

In the first issue of *BNA Topics* published in March 1944, an ambitious program was started. I refer to the compiling of a check list of Newfoundland Revenues, Cigarette and Tobacco Stamps started at that time by Mr. Harold R. Meyers. This initial endeavor received a very favorable and encouraging response, but of late, with the exception of an occasional report of a new variety or sub-variety, very little has been mentioned.

In the hope of stimulating renewed interest in this phase of collecting, I am providing this check list of all such varieties which were noted in the original listing and in addition all those subsequently reported as well as some new varieties previously unlisted in our publication.

When noting the size of the revenue stamp, I refer to the size of the design between the frame lines and in every case the measurements will be approximate, since there is a variation of as much as 1 mm. to be found due to paper shrinkage, or wet and dry printings.

The list will necessarily be incomplete but it will serve until further information is forthcoming. Most of the listings to date have only considered the Inland Revenue Issues.

## GRATE SCOTT!

by *Click*

In his first roll of BNAPSHOTS, Click roused the ire of a few traditionalists by daring to suggest that there might conceivably be inaccuracies in the Canada Section as listed in the Scott Encyclopedia of Philately. He was violently challenged to put the finger on these alleged flaws. So—never being one to take a dare, yet recognizing that his BNAPSHOTS column is much too short to contain even a portion of the complaints deserving a whiff of air—Click makes reply in the form of a Portrait Study.

He repeats his assertion that Scott's learned tome is the spurned tomb of Canadian specialists. And to prove his point, over a period of several months he will undertake to designate some of the changes required to turn the Canada section into a catalogue listing approximating the truth.

We do not have to seek far for our first flaw. We have but to pass the heading "CANADA, N.A. (kan a. da)" before reaching our first misstatement, which reads, "*Location—Occupies the entire northern part of the North American continent with the exception of Alaska.*"

This, Brother BNAPS is what might be delicately called an "inauspicious beginning" for any catalogue of Canada. Perhaps our first move in seeking a general revision should be to mail to One West 47th Street a map of North America upon which Labrador is clearly marked in crimson?

But that is picayune stuff. Click hopes his readers will not think such tomfoolery represents the serious subject matter to which he now intends to turn his attention. In earnest of his sober intentions Click now offers his next complaint. For ready reference, in case of further dispute, it might be a good idea to number these squawks. We start with:

1. *Province of Canada.* Click believes, with an ever-growing number of Canadian specialists, that these provincial issues no more deserve to be listed in numerical sequence with the stamps of the Dominion of Canada than do the releases of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, British Columbia and Vancouver!

The "Province of Canada" was comprised of the provinces of Upper and Lower Canada or Canada West and

East . . . now Ontario and Quebec. Its stamps could not be used in any other province. Canada, as a Dominion, came into being in 1868. As a philatelic "country", then, its stamp enumeration and catalogue listing should start with the first Dominion issue—the Large Queens!

Surely the "Province of Canada" deserves listing. But it should be separated from the "Dominion of Canada" numerically, as well as by a printer's rule and a line of boldface type.

Since Click believes this, he will skip #s 1 to 20 and go on to the true issues of the Dominion of Canada. He may later discuss the inaccuracies of the provincial issues. But first things first . . . so let's get on with our survey.

2. *The Large Queens.* Seldom, if ever, have the catalogue listings of a top-ranking favorite philatelic country's issues been mangled so horribly as the Large and Small Cents issues of Canada. Complaints to the editors of Scott's catalogue elicit only the bland statement that "collectors are used to the present numbers" . . . which is offered as an excuse for maintaining a confusing misstatement of the facts regarding issues, colors, dates, and other pertinent data.

The present listing prefaces the Large Queens with the boldface heading, "Perf. 12, 11½ x 12." Ignore the fact that the so-called "perf 12" is frequently 11¾. We do not ask for miracles or for hair-splitting changes in the listings. But to imply that *all* stamps following that head appear both perf 12 and perf 11½ x 12 is quite wrong. Only three of the Large Cents, the ½c, 5c, and 15c denominations are so known . . . and they are *not* so known when serving as stamps of the Large Cent issue, but (circa) 1873-75, when they were used to supply needed denominations of the Small Cents! The Large 5c denomination, as is widely known, was issued as a stop-gap, pending the release of the small 5c.

The present listing also errs in its attempts at shade delineation. The errors fall into three classifications:

(a) Inaccurate description. *Example:* The naming of #28 as "gray", a nondescript term used loosely to describe grayed shades of blue, purple, green, and various other dull tones, or the naming of #32 as "yellow", an obvious misnomer if one accepts the term

"yellow" as an accurate description of the common 1c Small Cents #33.

(b) Overlapping varieties. *Example:* The listing of #21 "black" and #21B "thin paper", when actually the jet-black shade is a hallmark of the thin paper printing. All thin paper printings are black, while all the thicker paper printings are in shades of gray-black.

(c) Improper segregation. *Example:* The attempt to point out distinct shade varieties for the laid paper #s 30-1, when actually these stamps were printed with normal runs, but on laid revenue stock which by accident was mixed with the postage paper.

From Jarrett and other students we have a specialist's analysis of Canadian issues. We repeat, we do not expect such hyper-specialization in a world-wide catalogue. But we do expect accurate facts! And because destructive criticism is of no value whatsoever; because Click would not undertake to point the finger of scorn at Scott had he not some substitute listing to offer, he herewith proffers his suggestion for the revision of the first Canada issue, the Large Queens:

## CANADA - OFFICIALLY SEALED

By "85"

It is rather disappointing to BNA Collectors to note that once again "Scott's" do not list the officially sealed stamps of Canada (or Newfoundland), especially after the excellent article written by "84" in the August 1945 issue of BNA Topics. Perhaps by the time the "47 Catalog" is printed, "H. C." may weaken and list these hard to get stamps.

The following is my elaboration of the check-list which was shown in the August issue.

The writer has all of the above with the exception of OS2b, OS2c and OS3b. I have seen the thick paper (or light cardboard) of the 1905 issue but cannot verify the existence of the thick paper in the 1907 issue.

Were there two plates used for the 1905 and 1907 issue?

Allowing for probable paper shrinkage, the following are the sizes of the two issues:

1905	32¼mm	x 46mm	
1907	32	x 46¾	(Black)
1907	31¾	x 46½	(Grey Black)

It would therefore seem apparent that two plates were used. The 1905 imperf. on thick blue wove paper measures 32mm x 46½mm. This would lead one to believe that the imperf. is not from the plates of the 1905 issue, but a proof printed from the plate used in 1907.

All of the above data is from the writer's collection and it would be of interest to all collectors to have them submit their findings from their own collections. Perhaps Scotts will then have sufficient authentic data to list the various varieties, etc. of these issues.

With regards to the Newfoundland "Officially Sealed", I have only seen one issue, that is the black on a blue wove, thin paper, perf. 12.

## RULES FOR THE LIBRARY

1. This Department shall be maintained and shall function entirely for and in the interest of the membership of the British North America Philatelic Society. A member on written application to the Librarian accompanied by all charges, may have sent not more than two (2) volumes and shall not retain such borrowed material for more than 30 days at which time, or sooner, same borrowed material must be returned in good condition, fully insured and all charges prepaid. The member so borrowing material from the Library shall be responsible and liable to the full value of the material until same shall have been acknowledged as received by the Librarian. A member shall make such adjustment or payment for any damage or loss to material borrowed from the Library in such an amount as shall be determined and established by the Librarian.

5. There shall be a charge of 25c per week or part thereof for each item borrowed from the Library and held in excess of the 30 days. A rental of 25c or more per week may be charged for any special or rare book when so determined by the Librarian.

6. These Rules may be amended or added to as required.
