more about her. "My parents were post masters in the 50s before the days of Rural Routes. As a child I watched my mother sort and cancel mail with the Waterloo NS postmark. Thus began my stamp collecting. College, teaching and raising a family as a young widow put



collecting on the back burner. In retirement I volunteered with the Red Cross and started collecting Red Cross stamps worldwide. I also collect the Royal Tour of 1939 where my parents met in Halifax, June 15th 1939. I also collect Cinderellas of Kaulbach Island, closed post offices of Lunenburg and Queens County, Patriotic Covers of Canada, pre-cancels, flag cancels, etc. I serve as secretary and newsletter editor for South Shore Stamp Club (SSSC). My greatest pleasure was to present my Queens County Postal Collection to the Queens Museum in Liverpool NS;



and, to be a guest on QCCR Liverpool to talk about the history of Queens County. Another achievement was working with the SSSC to acquire a pictorial postmark for Bridgewater."
