BNAPS Meetings

This is a BNAPS election year and, by now, you should have received your election packet. Because of COVID there is a delay in post office deliveries. Printed ballots need to be in the hands of the election committee by August 15. Insure your vote counts - vote electronically at BNAPS.ORG. There is a link on the home page to the election.

Why 10 Centimes? (from last month)

Both Richard Johnson and Mike Street had answers as to why this envelope had a rate of 10 centimes. Here's one of the answers. "The answer to Malcolm Back's query about the taxed letter to the UK is that on 1 April 1954 the surface rate from Canada to the UK was increased from 4¢ to 5¢ for the first oz., so almost two months later this letter was underpaid by 1¢. The postage due charge was double the deficiency, so a postal clerk wrote "Tax 2¢". When the letter arrived at the international dispatch office in Montreal the 2¢Cdn was converted to the Universal Postal Union standard of centimes, at the then current rate of 1¢Cdn = 5 centimes, and the T/10 CENTIMES handstamp was applied. Once in England Royal Mail converted the 10 centimes to 2d sterling and the 2d British postage due stamp was added. A nice modern piece of postal history with a good story." *Editor's note – My apologies to Malcolm Back – I attributed his query to Malcolm Black.*

For August Swimmers

Sharks and summer seem to go together. I was rummaging through some of my stamp piles and came across the following.

In 1975, the movie *Jaws* kept a lot of people out of the Water. At Pacific '97 philately didn't suffer the same fate when Canada Post issued a stamp with the Great White Shark. Here's an unposted, unaddressed first day cover from that San Francisco show. Envelope is 14 inches by 7 inches (350mm x 177mm).



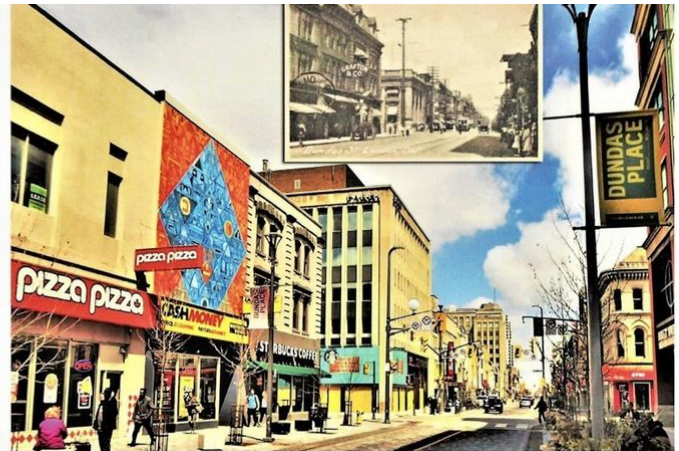
Removing the shark from the envelope, it unfolds to reveal an invitation to the unveiling of the four ocean fish (#1641-1644) and the stamps themselves. My recollection is that Canada Post gave these away as invitations but you had to buy and apply the stamps yourself.



Corona Philately

On this card is a photo I took May 1, at the main corner Dundas Street and Richmond Street downtown London, the busiest corner on a normal Friday as shown on the inserted view card from 1919. But the photo shows a very quiet scene because of the virus all stores were closed at that time.

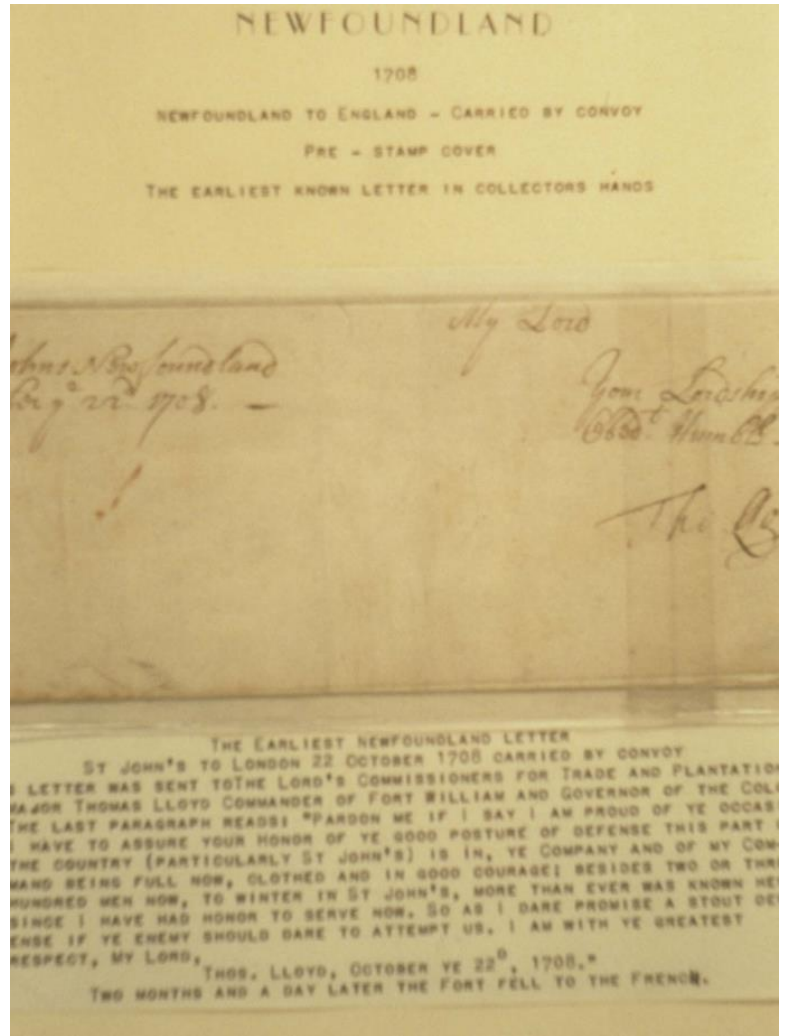
This eLetter is highlighting the [Slides of the Robert H. Pratt Newfoundland collection](#) –

Pratt photographed over 4,000 items in his collection for insurance purposes - not for archival purposes. Thus, the quality of some of the illustrations is wanting. That said the collection provides an incredible wealth of information for the Newfoundland collector.

The original slides of the Pratt Newfoundland collection are owned by the Collectors Club of Chicago and were digitized by BNAPS and assembled by subject matter and stamp issue into approximately 30 pdf files by John M. Walsh and posted on his website.

There are two files of Canadian material covering the early issues and revenue stamps.

It should be noted that John was also responsible for scanning all of the early issues of **BNATopics** that are on our website
