An Interesting Cross Border Cover - Malcolm Back

I have found this interesting cover in my father's collection. He is now in Long Term Care and I am the custodian of his collection. By the way, he reaches a milestone 100 years old in February.

The cover has a historical connection to our family. My Grandparents leased farmland from the Treffry's in the early 1900's near Hawtrey, Ontario before returning to England in 1925. Dad was 3 years old at the time.

The letter appears to be stampless. There is no indication of a removed stamp. The manuscript 10 is a bit of a mystery. It almost appears to be a felt pen, but on close examination I think it is ink of the period. Has anyone seen a marking like this?

CAPEX22 News

BNAPS Matching Funds Program

As of December 20, 2021, the BNAPS Matching Funds Program for CAPEX 22 has reached 91% of its goal with the donations received in December from BNAPS members Mark Berner, Fred Feddema, and Garfield Portch and additional contributions from earlier donors . Thank you to all of the current and past donors.

CAPEX 22 One-Frame Exhibit Applications

Early in the development of CAPEX 22 an ambitious goal of 400 one-frame exhibits was set for the exhibition. No exhibition had ever achieved that level of one frame exhibits either nationally or internationally. Several countries had organized one-frame national exhibitions with 50-90 exhibits and internationally the largest number of one-frame exhibits was at New York 2016 with 100 frames.

The arrival of Covid-19 in March 2020 quickly scuttled exhibitors' plans to qualify at National level shows in Canada and the USA in 2020 and 2021 as physical exhibitions were canceled and replaced by virtual exhibitions. In 2020 Canadian exhibitors sought out opportunities to exhibit at virtual national shows in the USA, South Africa, Mexico and Argentina and in late 2020 their efforts were rewarded with a ruling from the Fédération Internationale de Philatélie (FIP) that Vermeil awards at national level virtual shows in 2020 and 2021 would be accepted for entry to international exhibitions in 2021 and 2022.

In April 2021 CANPEX organized a national level one-frame virtual exhibition with 65 frames and in October 2021 CANPEX again stepped forward to host the virtual Royal 2021 Royale including about 50 one-frame exhibits. Thanks to John Sheffield, Steve Johnson and the CANPEX team, and the judging teams for providing these two qualification opportunities for Canadian exhibitors. With existing qualified exhibits and the opportunities provided by the CANPEX exhibitions we set a goal of 100 exhibit entries from Canadian exhibitors.

At the one-frame exhibit entry close at November 30th CAPEX 22 was oversubscribed at 450 one-frame exhibit entries in total, including 110 entries from Canadian exhibitors. Thank you to all the BNAPS members from Canada, USA and abroad who entered their one-frame exhibits. The acceptance list will be issued shortly. BNAPS member exhibitors will be recognized in next month's newsletter.

Entries for Print and Digital Literature (including websites) exhibits will remain open for applications until mid-January.

Call for BNAPS Volunteers

Although CAPX22 seems to be a long way off, we have been planning on having a strong presence at this oncein-a-lifetime international show. BNAPS will have a "well positioned" table close to both the bourse and the exhibit. We are going to need some volunteers to staff the table during show hours. If possible, those of you attending CAPEX22 could donate an hour or two of your time to help out, it would truly be appreciated. Duties will include interacting with members and visitors, handing out free copies of Society publications, directing visitors to Canadian-oriented seminars and exhibits, and giving information on the benefits of collecting Canadian/BNA philately. A table booklet will be available with information (frequently asked questions) that might be asked by visitors. Staffing the table will be a good way to rest your weary feet after stomping through the thousands of square feet of this extraordinary stamp show. Dr. Mark Berner (drmberner@videotron.ca), Chairman of the BNAPS Board, will be organizing this portion of the BNAPS CAPEX22 activity. He will begin his recruitment program about when the next issue of *BNA Topics* will be arriving at your mailbox. Signup for a time slot will be quite easy using the "Signup Genius" on-line application. Details will follow in the February, 2022 issue of *eLetter* for further details.

Amoz Chernoff, one of our emeritus members, will soon reach the age of 100 and has asked that I pass the following information on:



Ration Administration Post Cards




