Railway Post Office Marks on the Map Stamp -



At the 2022 BNAPS convention in Calgary, Phil had the good fortune to sit in on Leo Beaudet's *Meet the Webmaster* session. Leo highlighted a number of the wonderful resources to be found on the website. In forthcoming issues of the BNAPS eLetter various portions of the *Online Resources and Exhibits* section of the BNAPS website will be featured.

The first in this series is: **Railway Post Office** (**RPO**)**Postmarks of Canada on the 1898 Canadian 2¢** Imperial Penny Postage Issue (The 'Map Stamp'): A

Cover Census and a Roster of Off-Cover Cancellations by Rick Friesen. Below is the table of contents and an introduction:

"Winmill1 (1982) and Ludlow2 (1987) published rosters of Railway Post Office (RPO) postmarks on the Canadian 2¢ Imperial Penny Postage Issue of 1898, the 'Map stamp'. In these reports, no distinction was made between off-cover Map stamp strikes and Map stamp covers, and no population data was presented. I started compiling a database of RPO hammer strikes on offcover Map stamps and Map stamp covers in 2015 when it became clear to me that no such censuses had been published. At that time, I made a request to the

members of the BNAPS RPO Study Group3 and other Map stamp collectors for lists of such postmarks from their collections. While the response was encouraging, ultimately the number of reports that I received back were not sufficient that I could be confident about deriving a population census of off-cover strikes when combined with postmarks from my own collection. Therefore, the result of this undertaking is (1) a census (hereafter referred to as the 'Census') of Map stamp covers postmarked with RPO hammer strikes (Section 2), and (2) an update of the Ludlow roster of documented RPO cancellations on off-cover Map stamps (Section 3)" Link to the publication: RPO Cancellations on Maps - Publication (bnaps.org)
