

## Bill Walton – Biography

In addition to his philatelic activities, mentioned below, Bill has made, and continues to make, many contributions to BNAPS itself. He serves as chairman of the Ethics Committee and chairman of the Nominations Committee and has been so for more than 20 years. He has also served on the jury of countless BNAPS exhibition juries, chairing many of them. Bill is also Chair of the OTB (Order of the Beaver), the honor society of BNAPS.



I became a stamp collector unintentionally. My father collected, working away on a table full of stamps, albums, and catalogues - and at eight or nine years old I saw it as even more boring than listening to my little sister.

One day in 1951 I went to the hobby shop down Buffalo's Fillmore Avenue with enough money to buy the model airplane I'd saved for. A woman was there, trying to pick a gift for someone else's kid, and fully occupying the owner with questions. Killing time, I looked over the only thing on the counter – a swivel display of various size packages of H. E. Harris stamps. The largest was the only one that was even worth a look – stamps of the world, picturing exotic animals, landscapes, architecture – and I removed it to look, passing time until the airplane kit was mine.

It was the country names and postmarks that did it. Kuala Lumpur? Addis Ababa? Lahore? Sandakan? Dakar? Brunei? These were places even more distant and exotic than Harrisburg, where some of my family originated a

couple of generations ago. I was hooked, and when my turn finally came, I'd forgotten about the plane and bought the stamp package.

I never looked back. There was that brief hiatus (common to boys in their teens) caused by fumes – car fumes and perfumes – but I plowed ahead, encouraged from age 21 on by a wife who thought it was interesting and took up the hobby herself.

My country collections began with stamps from countries I could find and soak from mail most often – the U.S. of course, Great Britain and Germany in those post-war years – and Canada, right across the river. One of many family excursions on the Crystal Beach steamer from the Buffalo pier to the amusement park in Ontario found me (still age nine) putting a coin in a coil stamp vending machine and looking closely at a stamp that had a picture of a living king, not a dead president, and words in two languages. Hooked again – the exotic was only a steamboat ride away.

In my 20s, I became interested in postal stationery, and began to build extensive collections of many countries – including, of course, Canada and Newfoundland. I got to know Alex Gage and Ed Fladung, and at their request wrote the Canada section of the Higgins and Gage second C edition. I began a friendship with Jim Webb, and began providing some input for his second and later catalogue editions. He recommended me to Jim Kramer to assist in the Postal Museum's efforts to describe their postal stationery holdings – an effort carried forward by Earle Covert, who mounted the material for the Museum's display. Earle and I had gotten to know each other through Jim Webb, and became good friends and later co-editors of the Webb catalogue which Jim had sold to us. And Jim Kramer – who used me to vet letters to the Museum regarding stationery – had made me aware of Robert Lemire. Robert began the Postal Stationery Study Group and Newsletter a lifetime ago and has remained a close friend.

My ongoing learning about Large and Small Queen production matched what I was finding about British American Bank Note's production of federal and provincial revenue stamps and tobacco taxpaids across the same time period.

Many of my postal history interests – NWT and Labrador, coastal and inland water route markings, railway post offices - and most of my revenues have gone by the wayside. My BNA focusses today are Canadian postal stationery, tobacco stamps, British American Bank Note printings, named branch post offices of Toronto and Montreal, and Canadian paquebot offices.

Halifax in 1971 was my first BNAPEX convention, and I've attended them all since. I told Bill Rockett shortly before he died that no one would ever match his BNAPEX uninterrupted attendance record. Easy, he told me – just stay alive and keep going. He turned out to be right.

I've been in many stamp societies, but BNAPS is unmatched for camaraderie and shared specialist knowledge. With the exception of Charlie Livermore - a friend since 1958 and not even a collector then - my closest friends have come through the Society. I'm grateful for so many good memories of old friends now gone, like Art Klass, Bill Rockett, Horace Harrison, Alan Steinhart, Jim Webb, Bob Lee, and Ken Lemke. And for the ongoing fellowship and communication with so many BNAPSERs today, helping me maintain the illusion that all this is perfectly normal.

INSTITUTE FOR ANALYTICAL PHILATELY SCHEDULES FIFTH INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM The Institute for Analytical Philately (IAP) announces that its fifth symposium will convene virtually on October 10 and October 17.

While originally planning to host the symposium in person, the IAP decided to follow the format of its 2020 symposium and have all speakers deliver their papers online. This will allow us to admit more participants than if we held the meetings in person.

The symposium's first session will begin at 10 AM EDT on Tuesday, October 10, 2023. Five speakers will address attendees throughout the day, ending at about 3 PM. The second session will start at 10 AM a week later, October 17. Five speakers will present papers that day.

Most presentations will address aspects of color in philately. Topics will include the use of Raman micro spectrometry, color analyses of various stamps, results from video spectral comparator (VSC) analyses and more. While several presentations are technical in nature, most of them should be understandable by non-scientists.

The IAP will publish the papers prior to the symposium and make them available to institute members and symposium attendees. Cost of the publication is \$20 to United States addresses, \$30 to foreign addresses, payable through PayPal or by check. 
