

Morin's bibliography on Canadian philately coming this month



The British North America Philatelic Society (BNAPS) is pleased to announce that it will be hosting Cimon Morin's *Canadian Philately: Bibliography and Index* in English and French on its website come September. This bibliography, published by the National Library of Canada (1979, 1983) and Saskatoon Stamp Center (1998), includes more than 12,600 bibliographic references on stamps, postal stationery, postal history and postal markings of Canada and British North America. It contains references to documents such as monographs, brochures, specialized catalogues, auction catalogues, as well as articles published in periodicals, exhibition catalogues and more general works. The bibliography includes both English and French documents. It indexes documents published between 1864 and 2006.

The bibliography is an important contribution to the philately of British North America and an essential tool for researchers. As part of its mission to publish and disseminate information on Canadian philately to the collecting community, BNAPS began exploring the possibility of hosting the bibliography on its website. The Society discussed the project with Cimon Morin. He was enthusiastic about the launch of his bibliography online and volunteered to provide the bibliographic data he had compiled. BNAPS then approached Library and Archives Canada and John Jamieson of Saskatoon Stamp Centre. Both gave their support to the project.


The database hosted on the BNAPS web server contains all the bibliographic data compiled by Cimon Morin. The database's web interface, which includes the administration, search and results web pages, was developed by BNAPS.

In addition to providing a survey of Canadian philately, this bibliography brings to the fore the authors who have shared their knowledge within the philatelic community. It gives philatelists an overview of the subjects that have been explored over the years and reveals facets of philately that still await indepth research.


BNAPS Regional Groups

Regional groups perform an important function for BNAPS. They allow our members to meet on a more local level. True, some of the regions are fairly large and require a longer distance of travel but, fortunately, many of our regional groups hold Zoom meetings, which allows more distant members to attend.

The maps to the left and below show the distribution of members in both Canada and the United States. These maps were created using Google maps and the postal codes of our members. On the map immediately below, you will notice two circles. They show overlaps between the St. Lawrence Seaway group and the Bas Canada groups in Canada and the Northeastern and Mid-Atlantic groups in the United States.



As you will notice, sorting by postal codes to define regional groups is a less than perfect system and to some extent is up to the individual regional groups to sort some of these anomalies.

A Possible Changeling Question

"Some years ago when soaking and sorting stamps I came across this unusual colour in a Canada number 1375, the \$1.00 Yorkton Courthouse definitive from 1994. It is perforated 14.6 x 14 so is a 1375; the central panel shows yellowish under fluorescent light like a normal 1375. I have assumed that it must be a freak, but it has always bothered me. My first thought was that it may have faded. But I was a picture framer for many years, and saw dozens of faded prints in that time. It was always the blue that held on until the end, after other colours had changed. In this stamp, based on my limited understanding of how stamps are printed, it seems that it is the blue that is reduced or missing. I have wondered if it is a changeling, the result of exposure to heat or chemical fumes but this is beyond my experience. If memory serves, it came off a large brown envelope but the back of the stamp is as white as other examples. I am interested to know if any members have seen another like it, or can offer an explanation as to how it came to be this way.


