BNAPS Election – Bylaws change

Please note the following change (indicated in blue) to the BNAPS election process. This change was passed unanimously by the Board of Directors at their meeting in Halifax/Dartmouth. The rationale for this change is indicated in the italicize paragraph following "Article VII – Election of Officers and Directors". Any Group wishing to submit individuals as nominees for any office must submit these names 100 days in advance of the Annual General meeting. For the 2024 election that date is May 18, 2024, midnight Eastern time. Nominations received after midnight May 18, 2024, may not be accepted.

ARTICLE VII - ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS

3.3 A Regional Group of the Society or any group of five members of the Society in good standing may also nominate a person to any office (excepting the Presidency), or directorship which is available to be filled in the election, by filing the name or names of such nominees with the Secretary not less than 110 days before the Annual Meeting of the Society in an election year.

[The rationale for this change is to ensure that the first Vice President, who will have been expected to work closely with the President during the President's term, can carry this experience into their term as President. In essence this means that election to the position of first Vice President is an election to a four-year term. Two as first Vice President and two as President.]



Member Query re: the 8.5 cent Nova Scotia stamp

A Problem: I have found quite a few new constant plate varieties (CPVs) for the 8.5 Cent Nova Scotia. Most of my findings have been reported in *Dots and Scratches* (2022 and 2023), the newsletter put out by a BNAPS study group. I wonder if anyone can shed some light on a significant "line" that is not constant. Stamp positions 45 and 46 show the line in most cases. A plate proof sheet and three of my five full sheets show a line going from 45H3 to 46H5 (Thirkell Position Finder). I have also seen this line on other multiples. I have not seen multiples without the line. The line is not parallel to the guidelines but is similar in width. The image attached shows the line outlined in black and a guideline outlined in yellow. The second image is from one of the sheets without the line. The existence of the line on the proof sheet suggests it was there from the beginning. The sheets with the missing line show all the CPVs I have mentioned so far and show the CPVs Argenti reported.

Therefore, I do not think a second plate exists. I know there were two printings but the sheets with the missing line show no evidence of a groove being repaired on the printing plate. I'm not yet sure what the answer is. Any insight or thoughts would be appreciated. John Breukelaar jbreuk3@gmail.com

Set of 10 stamps on a Vario sheet with two-page insert in a folder: \$30 per set.




Set of 10 cachet covers with pictorial postmarks: \$40 per set.




