BNAPS Study Group Newsletters are Searchable

BNAPS has a wealth of information in the Study Group newsletters available on its website. Unfortunately, not all of the newsletters have an index to help you search for the information you are seeking. However, at the last two BNAPEX conventions Leo Beaudet, our webmaster, demonstrated how to use Google to search for information in our newsletters. It is not a perfect search tool, but it may help you to find the information you need.

Using the Elizabeth II newsletter as an example, here is a screenshot of how I searched articles mentioning the *year of the fox* stamps. Note the quotation marks around the phrase "year of the ox". Searching with quotation marks around the words *year of the fox* returned eight results. Removing the quotation marks from the phrase returned 47 results, many of which had nothing to do with the subject being searched.



The key to these searches is to copy the phrase starting with the word **site:** on the line below the Study Group newsletter you wish to search. The phrase for the Elizabeth II newsletter is

site:https://adminware.ca/esg/corgitimes Paste it into the Google search box followed by the phrases or words you wish to search. In some cases your search terms will be highlighted in the newsletter, but in others it won't be. However, on a Windows machine, you can use the Ctrl F feature and on a Mac machine it is the Command F feature to search through a specific newsletter to find the key term you are searching. Again, this does not work in all newsletters. You will likely find it is not a perfect solution, but I think you will also find that it is better than having no search capability at all. Select the link you want to use, paste it in the Google search box, leave a space and enter your search terms, words, and/or phrases. It's worth a try.



1796 Earliest Kingston Postmark

The Kingston Post Office opened in 1789. Until 1830 "straight line" postmarks were likely supplied in a block by a local printer. "KINGSTON" and changeable dates were in lead type.

IN This Majestup Savie Single that David William Smith Esquire acting Surveyor General By hup -S

- folded document addressed to "David William Smith, Acting Surveyor General, Niagara"
- sent "His Majesty's Service" (George III), "Single Sheet" yet rated "1N" in red (! shilling prepaid); not an official rate
- directed "per the Winter Express" Lake Ontario water route was closed
- contents pertain to the acreage of various Midland District townships



- backstanped "KINSTON 9 Feby"
- **1796** confirmed by docketing
- next earliest "KINGSTON" postmark: 1803

Why was the "G" missing from "KINGSTON"?

As the postmark was set in a single line the "G" may have fallen out when the date was being changed. Later typeset postmarks were all set in two lines. The date on the second line could thus be changed without loosening "KINGSTON" in the first line.

New Youth award named in honor of Ken Lemke



In memory of Ken Lemke, in 2024 the RPSC Philatelic Research Foundation will launch awards at all National Level Stamp shows in Canada for Youth Exhibiting.

The Emma Award, named for Ken's faithful springer spaniel, will be offered at each age level (<12; 12&13; 14&15; 16-18; 19-21) at the discretion of the Jury. Single frame and multi-frames exhibits in any class will be eligible. The award criteria specifies that it does not have to be awarded to the "best" exhibit but may recognize an exhibit which shows extra effort being made in the areas of creativity, treatment, knowledge or research. Exhibitors may only win the award once at each age level A cash prize of \$250 and a medal shall be awarded to winners.

The purpose of the RPSC Foundation is to encourage youth involvement in philately as means to learn about history, geography, art, sociology and other related subjects.

The RPSC Philatelic Research Foundation accepts donations of money and philatelic material for a charitable donation receipt, for income tax purposes, equal to the cash donation or the appraised fair market value of the material. The minimum amount for a charitable receipt to be issued is \$100.00. Donors should contact the Foundation by e-mail at info@rpscfoundation.ca

Geldert Medal is awarded to BNAPS member Andrew Chung.

The Geldert Medal may be awarded annually for the best article published in The Canadian Philatelist. The RPSC is pleased to advise that Andrew Chung FRPSC is the recipient of the 2023 Geldert Medal for his article entitled "The Floral Emblems and Coats of Arms of the Provinces and Territories Canada 1964 to 1966." The Canadian Philatelist. Volume 74, Number 6 (November/December). Pages 258-279. Congratulations Andrew!

The Geldert Committee of The RPSC determined that the article provides details of this important Elizabethan series of Canadian stamps with thorough coverage of production and promotional material, presentation items, first day covers, varieties and usages. Irregularities such as creases, colour varieties and postage rates were often noted and illustrated. Missing dots were indicated, posters shown and the names of helpful colleagues were shared. The whole article was bound together by a balanced



use of space despite the quantity of material. This article will undoubtedly become a standard reference for this issue. The Geldert Medal will be awarded to Andrew Chung at the 2024 AGM of The RPSC. The Geldert Committee also passed along its compliments to the editor of The Canadian Philatelist, Robin Harris FRPSC for his continuing dedication and fine work to maintain the quality of the journal.
