BNAPS Virtual Convention 2025

Hopefully, you received our initial announcement for the upcoming Virtual convention on our website. Many of you will remember our Virtual Convention during the pandemic in 2021, and we will attempt a shorter version in 2025. The details are below:

Date: Saturday, 1 March 2025 **Time**: 10 am - 5:30 pm Eastern time **Where**: Virtually on your computer through the website and Zoom

Cost: Free

What: Exhibits can be placed on the website and will be judged. Rules are the same as for BNAPEX. Exhibits can have a max of 8 frames. However, a 10-frame exhibit can be entered by doing Part 1 and Part 2 with 5 frames each (or some combination). ALL exhibitors must SCAN their exhibits and submit them through the website as JPG or PDF files. Everyone can view the exhibits on the website. Exhibits entries must be submitted to the website by 16 February with the images loaded by 20 February. As this is a no-cost exhibition, there are no special Grand or Reserve Grand prizes or other special awards. A thank you cover will be made for Exhibitors. Special awards will be awarded only for exhibits at BNAPEX in Vernon.

There will be up to 12 one-hour meeting/presentation slots to be used by Study Groups for meetings, or individual presentations can be done in these one-hour time slots. Meeting priorities go to the Study Groups, but send your requests to Ron Smith, who will assist you. Access to these meetings will be on 2 Zoom streams we will run using links off the website when you are connected to the website. The last hour will be used to wrap up and provide commentary on the exhibits by the judges.

Please look at both the website and the February eLetter for further information. If you are an exhibitor, or want to have a meeting or presentation, now is the time to start thinking about what you want to do. The website should be ready by mid-January for Exhibit submission.

BNAPS Book Release Notes

Two new books of note:

Shortly before his passing in July 2024, the late Donald J. Leblanc completed the third and final volume of his series on Canadian First Day Covers, *First Day Covers of the 1946 Canada King George VI Peace Issue*. December 2024, Spiral bound, 222 pages, 8.5 ×11, colour. ISBN: 978-1-989280-48-5. Stock # B4h126-1. Price: C\$53.00

Celebrating the end of World War II, in September 1946 Canada released a new set of high-value definitive stamps to replace the same values of the King George VI War Issue set. The new stamps showed different aspects of life in peacetime Canada.

Because of the large number of cachets, it would be difficult for a collector to search for and identify a particular FDC in his or her collection, so the author grouped a significant number of cachets under a dominant theme. Sections of *First Day Covers of the 1946 Canada King George VI Peace Issue*



cover Peace and/or Victory themes, followed by Re-conversion and/or Reconstruction themes, the Canadian Coat of Arms, text indicators of FDC status, left-over War Issue covers, hand-drawn or hand-painted, Air Mail envelopes, plus General-purpose and Business Corner Cards.

Mike Street, Coordinator of the BNAPS Book Department, believes that of the over 300 book titles BNAPS has published to date, *The Philatelic History of Kingston, Ontario, from 1673 to the Present Day*, is the most colourful. Almost all normal competitive exhibits are focused on a particular type of material and tend to be similar in many aspects, such as colour and shape. The pages of the Kingston exhibit come from 40+ contributors. The diversity of contributors and their contributions almost guarantees that the material on display will differ from page to page, and this is the case with this volume.

The incredible variety of items brought together under one philatelic roof include a Wampum belt used to convey an agreement between two



Indigenous tribes, the earliest known letter addressed to Fort Frontenac in 1686, and many variations of postal markings from straight line "Kingston" postmarks of the late 16th century and later, through the "Ruggles" postmark and Berri duplex postmarks of the 1860s, to the "Blue Barrel" cancellations of 1955-1962.

Among the many other subjects covered in the book are:

- ► Kingston designated as capital of the Province of Canada in 1840
- ▶ Mid-19th century Canada to United States Cross Border Mail through Kingston (and vice versa)
- ► St. Lawrence River Steamboat mail
- ► An 1851 Soldiers' Letter to England from a member of the 1851 British Garrison
- ▶ Fort Henry as an 1820s Great Lakes defence installation, and later as a World War II Prisoner of War Camp
- ► Queen's University
- ► Royal Military College Centenary stamp issue
- ► 1976 Olympic Games sailboat venue
- ► Postcard Factory Prepaid Postcards
- ► Wolfe Island and MV Wolfe Islander II, III and IV


