BNAPEX Vernon Convention 19-21 September 2025

Mark Oakley of the Pacific Northwest Regional Group, VP Regional Groups and 2025 Convention Chairman has prepared a great convention for you and you won't want to miss it. The important events are the night out at the beautiful Gray Monk Winery on the Friday evening and the Banquet on Saturday evening providing the opportunity for all exhibitors and dealers an opportunity to attend the banquet while the convention is on.

Hotel – the convention hotel is **Sold Out**. If you have not booked, phone and check for cancellations at 250-545-3385 and use code **BNAPS** to get our group rates. You can cancel your reservations up to the day prior to arrival, so there is no reason to delay. Other recommended close by hotels include Marriot Fairfield Vernon, Best Western Vernon and Hotel Prestige Vernon (this is a sister hotel to the convention hotel and Queen rates can be obtained for \$170/night plus tax). The other hotels may have similar rates. This is a busy time in the Okanagan due to the various wine festival activities.

Exhibits – Exhibit entries and changes on the website are closed. Individual certificates and medals will NOT be given out at the banquet but will be handed out at the checkout of your exhibit. The names and medal levels will be read out at the banquet. This is being done to reduce the length of the banquet.

Mini-Exhibits – If you have not submitted your mini-exhibits that are 1 to 2 pages (single or double) on smaller British Columbia topics of your choice, I have to have your jpg or pdf for inclusion by 7 September. Contact bnapexexhibits@bnaps.org for more information.

Registration - Thank you to those who have registered. If you are planning on attending, please register even if you are not planning on going to the banquet or night out – anyone entering the bourse needs to register in advance or wait at the registration table. As we need to provide catering numbers weeks in advance, please action this as soon as possible:

Bourse – For those NOT registering for either the night out or the banquet the admission fee is \$5 a day for Friday and Saturday, and free on Sunday (Under 18 are free all days). To save time at the registration table, we would appreciate it if you register for this admission so that a badge can be prepared for you in advance.

Here is some information for you to help with your planning:

Getting there – Driving - You can drive from Vancouver in about 5 hours, Calgary in 6 hours, Edmonton in about 8 hours. You might also think of flying into Calgary, rent a car, and take a drive through the Rockies to see all the wonders that are on the way as you head to the convention or as you go home.

Flying – If you are flying you should complete your air booking as soon as possible as fares rise the closer you get to the convention. The closest airport is Kelowna (YLW). There are direct flights from Vancouver, Victoria, Calgary, Edmonton, Toronto – other cities connect through any of these direct cities. WestJet, Air Canada,

Porter and Flair all fly to Kelowna with 2 to 8 flights a day depending on the airline. Watch for sales which may still occur.

Shuttle - Kelowna to Vernon – while you can rent a car in Kelowna, we will run a shuttle for attendees coming in during the main times on Wednesday and Thursday and leaving on Sunday and Monday. There will be a **nominal fee** (to help pay for gas) for this ride which is about 30 minutes. For those with air bookings already, please either fill in the online form on the website to request a shuttle to Vernon, or answer the email that Mark sent to registrants. The world convention will be held in Boston 23-30 May 2026. There will not be another in North America until maybe 2036, so visit this spectacle this time around. The main hotel is full, however there are surrounding hotels with availability with rates in the \$230 range (but research may find you cheaper accommodations). The convention site is close to the Boston Airport and local transportation to the city is readily available. BNAPS will have a table in the Society area jointly with other Canadian societies at the show. The U.S. suspends duty-free "de minimis" threshold of \$800 (US)

The following notice was sent to Canadian postal customers this past week. It is uncertain at this point how it will affect philatelic items shipped between the United States and Canada.



As you may be aware, the United States has suspended its duty-free "de minimis" threshold of US\$800 for all countries, including Canada. Starting August 29, 2025, all shipments entering the U.S. must have duties prepaid before crossing the border - regardless of their value.

This change, mandated under U.S. Executive Order 14324, applies to all business shipments from Canada, whether sent through the postal system, a Canadian courier, freight provider, or any commercial channel.

At Canada Post, we've been working to understand the order, assess options, and secure solutions that will ensure we can maintain continuity for your business. We are moving swiftly to make the necessary updates to ensure your shipments remain compliant and continue moving smoothly across the border.

What's changing

Hi,

Goods valued at US\$800 or less that are shipped to the United States through the postal network will be subject to an *ad valorem* duty. This duty will be equal to the effective tariff rate applicable to the product's country of origin under the *International Emergency Economic Powers Act* (IEEPA). For Canada, the current IEEPA rate is 35% for most goods.

Early Canadian and Newfoundland postal history




Special Announcement The Camellia PLC Collections

Recently, it was announced that another magnificent collection of early Canadian classical postal history, stamps, proofs and essays and will soon be re-introduced to the philatelic world. The Camellia Collection, for years housed in Great Britain, consisting of early Canadian and Newfoundland postal history will be auctioned by Eastern Auctions, which throughout its history, has handled some of the greatest of Canadian collections. The upcoming Camellia Collections sale is no different and may even outclass previous collections. Ron Majors, Pence-Cents Study Group (PCSG) Chairman had the opportunity to view some of the items in the Decimal- to the Large Queen-era. At the Pence-Cents Study Group meeting at BNAPEX 2025 in Vernon, he will report on some of the notable covers that will appear in the auctions, which commence on November 22, 2025, and continue through the next two years. Many of these covers were totally unknown to current classic Canadian collectors so the auctions should pose some interesting competitive bidding. The collection rivals (or perhaps exceeds) other classical

collections that have made it onto the philatelic marketplace in the past three decades such as the Nickle, Arfken, Carrington, Robertson, Cantor and most recently Brigham. Many items, especially foreign destination material, have never been seen in auctions or in dealer's boxes in the last six decades. So, if you collect Classical Canada and Newfoundland postal history and stamps prepare to see some outstanding philatelic rarities.


Has anyone seen this railway marking?




