REGARDING THIS ISSUE



Below we illustrate some additional First Day Covers of this issue, all bearing the 1927 Confederation Flag Cancel. We do not do this to call attention to an inexpensive source of Flag Cancels! We do it to call attention to Flag Cancel collectors who may own similar items, cancelled JUN 29, 1927 - that they may have some very valuable covers, and to forget the handbook prices in such




cases. For example the cover on 57 has a market value of \$110.00.





been in use for nearly ⊸100 years as cancelling devises, and are still in use, it is quite possible to put together a representative collection of Canadian Postal Stationery, all with FLAG CAN-CELS. Of course, before 1896 one would have to seek the "cork" types, and there are many flags which might not appear on any postal stationery, but from 1896 on, we feel that most of the Canadian post cards and envelopes, excepting rarities, could be found with

some FLAG CANCEL. Fig. 1 shows the scarce 1917 Jubilee Post Card with a very late use of the Hamilton Flag #36-1. Fig. 2 shows the 2¢ UPU card of 1897 used to England, and bearing the equally scarce Flag #9-1 of Dec. 14, 1397, from Ottawa. A beautiful combination! The lø Jubilee card of 1897 can be found with a wide selection of the early Flag cancels. Types #1, 4,




fig. 3 (Fred Langford Collection)

5 and 6 should all be possible, along of course with a wide range of the type 7s and 8s. Fig. 3 (next page) even shows that it is possible to obtain the rare VICTORIA Type 13-1 on this Jubilee card. (Continued Loom page 3:-

We feel that the cancel is what we are are after, and if we can get a sharp strike - or early or late use, and it is on card, we are just as happy as we would

have been with a full cover. Cards generally have better strikes - the exception being private post cards which are deeply embossed. Card too, - are easier to mount, stay in place better, and are less bulky.

One of the adventures in Flag Cancel collecting on Postal Stationery, is the chance that one will find a good cancel on a scarce bit of stationery. For example a number of 1917 Flag Cancels from Victoria, B.C. are known on government cards. I have a half dozen in my collection - and they are all Die I, - the rare die for the



HORE OF KAPEX-Peterborough FLAG (see pg.6)

Since writing the short squib on page 6, we have received additional imformation from Douglas Crawford #48. We also have received a copy of the flag, dated ??? Feb, but the strike is too poor to illustrate herewith. The flag consists of a staff at left, two large waves, two lines reading: -

> 1956 -KAPEX 1976 MARCH 13-14 MAR??

Doug tells me the Flag cancellation is being used regularly on commercial mail from February 16th thru March 15th. However the apparent official cachet dates with the cancel ate March 13-14.
