Popular Stamps, volume 1: Help Wanted by Ralph Mitchener

The first volume of Popular Stamps – it included seven four-page mimeographed numbers in 1938 – is quite elusive.

For some years I have had these issues in a "reissue" form. Printed on green paper, they are really nothing more than price lists of E.C. Werner of Alton, Ontario. The last number announced the formation of the Rural Canadian Stamp Club, organized by Werner.

I recently acquired another set of the Volume 1 numbers, also printed on green paper, but without the "reissue" inscription.

My problem, which I hope a reader can solve, is what color was the original first printing? The accompanying photocopy shows the difference between the two sets (see the upper left corners). Both are on almost similar green paper and the reissue has identical type face and spacing as the other. The reissue seems to have been printed a bit more clearly - seemingly from the same mimeograph or stencil master. I can find no record of the reprinting in later numbers of Popular Stamps. Has anyone seen — or does anyone have - the seven Volume 1 numbers on any other colored paper? By the way, some years ago, I made photocopies of the seven numbers of the "reissue" on white paper so they are not proper reissues!

PHILATELIC PERIODICALS IN CALGARY

Organized philately began in Calgary in late 1921, when Dr. E. G. Mason circulated a proposal to form a stamp club. A meeting was held in April 1922, the result of which was an agreement to form the Calgary Philatelic Society. The C.P.S. began with five members and now has about 200 as of 1992, its 70th year of continuous operation. For the first forty years of its life, the club was small enough that no bulletin was needed or practical. Communications were by postcards and stencilled letters.

In September 1961, the first issue of the "Newsletter" appeared, printed by mimeograph on 8 1/2 x 14 paper, one side only. Postcards were still mailed, alternating with the "Newsletter" every other month. The editor was Bob Traquair, and the "Newsletter" continued until May 1963, when it died. For the next decade, meeting notices were sent by postcard.

At the beginning of 1975, a new bulletin was started up, called "STAMPede". This was a simple folded sheet with four pages in the 5 1/2 x 8 1/2 format, photocopied. The contents were cut-and-paste items mixed in with CPS news and articles by members. "STAMPede" was edited by Ken Ford from January 1975 to April 1975, and by Phil Wolf thereafter until October 1978.

By 1978, it was agreed that "STAMPede" needed upgrading. An offer was made by Don Bowen to print the bulletin at no cost to the club in exchange for having the advertising revenues. The bulletin was offset-printed and illustrated with B&W photographs. It was renamed "Calgary STAMPede" and the first issue published in November 1978. The agreement with Bowen lasted until the 11th issue in November 1979. He resigned, and "Calgary STAMPede" regressed to a single-sheet photocopy in the 8 1/2 x 11 format, unnumbered and often undated. Ed Harris edited "Calgary STAMPede" from December 1979 to June 1981. Keith Brown took it over in July 1981 and published it until May 1983. In the middle of 1982, "Calgary STAMPede" returned to its previous 5 1/2 x 8 1/2 size. Brown was in the

process of becoming a full time stamp dealer while he was editor, and eventually handed over the bulletin to Dale Speirs. In June 1983, Speirs took over and has been editor to present date. The bulletin has been variously printed by photocopy or offset. An ISSN was obtained and copies of "Calgary STAMPede" are deposited with the National Library of Canada (ISSN 0828-8755).

CPS Exhibition chairman, reports that plans are well underway to insure the show's success.Mr.






EIGHTH AVENUE, WEST — CALGARY, ALBERTA CIRCA 1928
